Liturgical Ministry Training October 9th and 10th


Liturgical Ministry Training

Someone is Watching and Wondering



I am sure it comes as no surprise that there is brokenness and division within our world today. Such brokenness and division may be found in our families, in strained relationships among friends, in our government, in relationships with other countries, between races, cultures, and religious groups, and even within our own church. We label differences with familiar words: conservatives vs. liberals, vs. progressives, prolife vs. pro-death, even Pope John Paul II church vs. Pope Francis Church., etc. I think you get the idea and can add your own designators. Frankly, it all seems somewhat absurd to me, especially since I claim to be a Christian and person of faith.

Let me try to explain. As a Christian, it is understood that I follow the teachings of Christ Jesus. Specifically Jesus called his followers to love God and to love one another as he loves us. On the surface this appears straight forward. Looking deeper, however, and listening to his words, we are called to love our "enemies." Who are our enemies? Famously, Jesus uses the story of the "Good Samaritan" to explain, at least in my understanding, that perhaps our greatest enemy is actually found within ourselves. That is to say, whenever I fail to recognize another person as a beloved child of God, I have labeled that individual as my enemy; someone not worthy or deserving of the same opportunities, dignity, respect, and love which I believe belong to me as a human being. Are these not basic human rights? Yet in my refusal to recognize any individual of also having these rights, perhaps unconsciously, I consider them less than human, an object to serve my wants and desires, or to be tossed aside as somehow unworthy. Again, in my way of thinking such an attitude and failure to embrace "the other" as God's beloved son or daughter is the greatest sin. Because in this failure, I am disavowing God's words, "God looked at all creation (human beings included) and pronounced everything good." If I truly believe God's pronouncement, then how can I declare that some people are not good, unworthy, and undeserving?

At this time of year many of our children are being prepared to receive, for the first time, the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Those journeying toward full communion in the Catholic Church (reception of the Sacraments of Initiation) are also looking at the Sacrament of Reconciliation and through examination of their lives, asking important questions: "Why do I act the way I do? Why do I fail to act when I see those in need? What holds me from recognizing the face of God when I view myself and others? Why do I fail to believe in the goodness of humankind? Why do I fail to trust God, placing myself in God's love and accepting Jesus' teachings to truly love "my enemy?" I cannot truthfully say I have the answers. What I can state without hesitation, however, is that with patience and over time, I am learning to trust God. Through prayer, seeking wisdom, and allowing myself to be in God's presence each day, each hour, every minute, I have begun the journey toward inner peace and have developed a new sense of wonder at what is possible when I place myself in God's care. I hope you will pray with me: **Lord, teach me to be an instrument of your peace and a bridge toward love and understanding.**

As Catholic Christians, respect for ALL LIFE is a great part of our faith. Each October, Catholics nationwide celebrate Respect Life Month.

Respect for life is all encompassing. One of the misconceptions people have about respecting life is that it only applies to the unborn. Certainly, much of the work of Respect Life groups is devoted to protecting the most innocent lives from abortion, but respect for life doesn't stop with them.

As Pope Francis reminds us, "the innocent victim of abortion, children who die of hunger or from bombings, immigrants who drown in the search for a better tomorrow, the elderly or the sick who are considered a burden, the victims of terrorism, wars, violence and drug trafficking, the environment devastated by man's predatory relationship with nature are all issues. At stake in all of this is the gift of God, of which we are noble stewards but not masters."

The Respect Life Ministry shares this conviction voiced by Saint John Paul II, "A great prayer for life is urgently needed, a prayer which will rise up throughout the world" and knows that leading and promoting prayer for life is our most important task. An anti-life culture can only be defeated by the God of Life.

What can we do in our daily life to respect life?

- Become informed about the issues and share your knowledge with relatives, friends, classmates, teammates and neighbors. Visit www.usccb.org/ or www.humanlifeaction.org for federal and state voting records of your elected representatives.
- Fast one day a month in reparation for sins against human life.
- Commit to one hour a week in prayer for the sanctity of human life at Eucharistic Adoration. The Blessed Sacrament is exposed in the Chapel every Thursday from 9:00am – 9:00pm.
- Join the St. James Respect Life Ministry that meets the second Monday of each month at 6:30pm in the AV Conference Room (lower level of the church)




