

We will be livestreaming the Celebration of the Mass on Sundays at 8:00am via Facebook Live. (This does require a Facebook account.)



As we walk with Jesus this week, may we offer up our own sufferings, struggles and uncertainty, and place it at the foot of the Cross, where Jesus' last words were 'Father, into your hands, I commend my spirit'.

We will be livestreaming each of our Holy Week services, as well as our celebration of the Feast of the Resurrection next Easter Sunday.

We will be waiting to welcome our welcome our Elect in the Sacraments of Initiation, Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist, and our Candidates, who have already been baptized. We will be baptizing and welcoming these folks, hopefully at Pentecost, which is the fullness of the Easter season, the Power of God's Spirit coming upon us. WOW! What a celebration that will be, back in the Church, proclaiming God's Faithfulness and Love!

Remember to practice social distancing, washing your hands, keeping safe and staying healthy so that we can all come together in the Easter season to proclaim the message of the Risen Lord Jesus!

On behalf of Fr. Michael, and all of our Parish Staff, we lift one another up in prayer, and even though we are urged not to shake hands, or give hugs, we can hold one another in each of our hearts! May we meet each other in prayer and faithfulness to God's Presence this Holy Week!

## Someone is Watching and Wondering



Today's readings are filled with mixed messages: should we rejoice and feel hopeful in His presence or be saddened over what is to come? As I write these words to you I must confess that not only am I torn between these two messages but I find myself moving, from one instant to another, from hope to sadness. Also as I write to you I do not know whether today we will once again gather in our new church for Mass or whether we take solace in watching a live-stream provided by Fr. Mike, Pope Francis, or other priests and bishops throughout the world. Just like Jesus' followers in the first century we are living in uncertain times, not knowing want is to come.


Although I feel so blessed by God's grace, I wonder at this moment of so much uncertainty, how I am being called to follow Him. I keep thinking there must be something I should be doing and yet like so many of you I am maintaining "social distancing." I watch as business are closed and schools are canceling face to face classes. I listen to the growing number of people effected by the spread of this virus, I hear mixed messages from social media, and I feel discouraged. As one who is over the age of 60 there is yet the question in my mind, "Am I really at risk?" I think of all the frontline workers (paramedics, police, nurses, doctors) and those keeping our grocery stores and pharmacies open for others' welfare. I think about the people working in food pantries, with the homeless, in restaurants preparing take-out meals and at times offering them at no cost. I think of truck drivers and others in transportation who are responsible for delivering food, medical supplies and daily necessities, I think of ordinary people reaching out in extraordinary ways to help neighbors, strangers, and isolated people in our society, and I ask God, where are you calling me?

Unfortunately I don't have answers but I can honestly tell you that no matter how I celebrate this Holiest of weeks, I strongly feel God's presence; I know He loves us, He is willing to give Himself totally to each of us, and that gives me Hope. For me, a part of my daily prayer is "Please help me give myself totally to you, Lord. Help me love and serve you, and follow you to the cross. Amen"


## The Paschal Triduum 2020



April 9 - 5pm Mass of the Lord's Supper



April 10 - 3pm Passion of the Lord



April 12 - 8am Resurrection of the Lord

The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Triduum – from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery. Note: There is no Easter Vigil this year.

The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season, and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord.

Due to the Covid-19 social distancing and gathering restrictions, there will be no public services at St. James.

Private services, celebrated by our priests, on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday will be livestreamed on Facebook on each of these days. Please join us at the following times as we worship together at home as a St. James family.

#### Make An Act Of Perfect Contrition

## **Confession By Appointment**

of Perfect Contrition, which requires:

- The love of God
- The sincere desire for forgiveness
- The ardent commitment to receive the sacrament of reconciliation when available.

When it arises from a love by which God is loved above all else, contrition is called "perfect" (contrition of charity). Such contrition remits venial sins: it also obtains forgiveness of mortal sins if it includes the firm resolution to have recourse to sacramental confession as soon as possible. (Catechism, 1452)

If one is unable to get to Confession: make an act The priests at St. James are more than willing to hear your confession during this time.

> They do ask that it be arranged by appointment so that the appropriate arrangements can be made.

### Make An Act of Spiritual Communion



For the next couple of weeks we will not be able to receive the Eucharist at Mass. In cases like this the Church encourages us to make an act of "spiritual communion," where we unite ourselves to God through

prayer. It is a beautiful way to express to God our desire to be united with him when we are unable to complete that union in the reception of Holy Communion.

Here's a traditional prayer of spiritual communion that can be prayed daily in atonement for all the profanations and sacrileges He suffers because He wants to be with us."

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You.

Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.
