

From the Pastor's Pen

We need the solemnity of Easter more than ever this year. The COVID-19 pandemic has left all of us with a feeling that we are in a tomb, dark and foreboding. A death-like atmosphere surrounds us and indeed many have lost their lives to this horrific disease. More than ever we cling to our faith and the power of prayer. So this Easter celebration comes at just the right time. We need positive words of encouragement and hope. A great blessing has come out of this time of distress: people reaching out to one another with charity. That's supposed to be how we act as Easter People. Fr. Mike and I extend to all of you our best wishes for an Easter season felled with joy as we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Our belief in the Resurrection is rooted in the testimony of witnesses. If there were no witnesses, how could we know that Jesus was crucified, died, was buried, and then rose of the dead? And if those witnesses did not give testimony, how would we know what they saw and experienced? And if we did not believe that their testimony comes down to us through the Scripture, why would we believe? And if we did not have faith in their testimony, what sense would it make to adhere to and practice our faith? The resurrection of Jesus is the very motivation for our faith.

The testimony of witnesses is the focus of the Scripture readings for this Easter Sunday. You may notice that in the gospel there is no mention of resurrection. The testimony of Mary of Magdala, as well as Peter and John, is only about the empty tomb. Adversaries could claim that either disciples of Jesus or tomb-robbers stole the body of Jesus. So the evangelist includes what appears to be a minor detail: the burial clothes and cloth that covered the face of Jesus were there, neatly folded. That would not be the action of anyone stealing the body of Jesus. There are other accounts that we will hear in weeks to follow giving testimony about actual appearances of the Risen Lord.

The first reading from the Acts of the Apostles gives us testimony that occurred later: the Preaching of Peter about how the Risen Lord had appeared to him and others, and how they were commissioned to preach to the people. Obviously, people believed in the testimony and passed on the good news. Now we are the witnesses and continue testimony to the Risen Lord.

May all of us cling to this hope. My prayers are with you each day. Fr. Michael

A MESSAGE FROM DEACON CHUCK

Dear St. James Community,

Many are now experiencing the stay at home orders. I have been in my own stay at home situation for the past 12 weeks. Part of that stay at home was missing the Confirmation of the biggest class of Confirmandi in the diocese.

For those that are not aware 2019 was a difficult time for me physically. I have suffered for some time with bone on bone in both of my knees, which affected my mobility. On January 14th I had total joint replacement on my right knee. Then on February 25th, Fat Tuesday, I had total joint replacement on my left knee.
