

Golden Wedding Anniversary Mass Rescheduled



The annual Mass honoring all couples in the diocese celebrating 50 years of marriage, normally held in June, has been rescheduled for Sunday, September 27, due to the coronavirus and a concern for everyone's ongoing safety and health.

From the Pastor's Pen

I write this a couple weeks in advance of the bulletin date, so situations can change a great deal over those weeks. As of now, we are still under the "stay at home" mandate, still following the guidelines about precautions, and still missing our common worship. However, we are still bound together by the "chain of charity," and continue to hold each other in prayer.

This Fifth Sunday of Easter falls of the national celebration of Mother's Day. So it would be most appropriate that our first words are gratitude and recognition of our mothers, both living and deceased. The feast, of course, includes grandmothers, stepmothers, foster mothers, and God-mothers. I must sav that I was privileged to have a very saintly mother: kind, generous, thoughtful, prayerful, devoted to her husband and family. It brought great heartache and sorrow to her husband and seven children when we lost her to cancer at the young age of 53. We still recall her memory when we get together, still filled with awe and gratitude for being the kind of mother she was. So today I thank her and I thank and recognize all mothers who live their vocations with devotion and faith.

The gospel assigned for this 5th Sunday of Easter is one that we often hear at funeral liturgies. They are words of comfort: "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Have faith. In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. I am going to prepare a place for you." In the spirit of the Resurrection we hear those words spoken to each of us. The Lord Jesus has gone before us and has made a home for us in the Father's house. He is the way, the truth, and the life. There is another very significant passage in this gospel account: "Whoever has seen me has seen the Father." Our God is transcendent God. Our human language cannot express the reality that is our God. Doubters sometimes scoff and say: "Show me your God." Yes, we can point to our God when we recall the earthly life of Jesus. Jesus teaches: "I am in the Father and the Father is in me." We don't doubt the earthly life of Jesus, don't doubt his death and resurrection, don't doubt his promises to us. So the gospel today calls us to a strong and secure faith. We don't need proofs. We only need to look to the life and words of Jesus.

May God bless you. My prayers are with you each day.

May 13 is the anniversary of the first apparition of Our Lady to three shepherd children in the small village of Fatima in Portugal in 1917. She appeared six times between May 13, 1917 and October 13, 1917.

Perhaps the most well known utterance of the apparition of Our Lady at Fatima was her confident declaration that "My Immaculate Heart will triumph". Prior to his becoming Pope Benedict XVI, the then Cardinal Ratzinger interpreted this utterance as follows: "The Heart open to God, purified by contemplation of God, is stronger than guns and weapons of every kind.

The fiat of Mary, the word of her heart, has changed the history of the world, because it brought the Saviour into the world – because, thanks to her Yes, God could become man in our world and remains so for all time. The Evil One has power in this world, as we see and experience continually; he has power because our freedom continually lets itself be led away from God.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Last week I closed with this statement and the follow-up question: "God himself will see to it." Do we trust God to see to it, to provide; are we willing to follow Him; or do we think we know what's right for our own lives?


Later when I reread these words and spent some time reflecting on their meaning in my own life I was struck by how often I question God: "Where are you leading me; Why is there so much suffering; What can I do to help; I feel so small; How can I lead others when I have so many questions; I feel whatever light I have is rather dim; Are you still here, Lord; Do you understand my confusion?" Perhaps I am not so unusual. Perhaps your spirituality is also plagued with questions. Perhaps your life journey, like mine is paved with questions. There is so much I do not understand, but I know God always provides an answer, although not necessarily when I initially ask the question. Sometimes I loose patience. I feel alone, discouraged, and frustrated. I want a solution, the problem solved, to move on, now. I may even waste time with my own "pity party" before I honestly surrender the problem/question to God and await His answer.

Isaiah is one of my favorite prophetic books in the Bible. Whenever I seem stuck and unable to find my way, I find something in Isaiah that brings comfort. For example the words found in chapter 43, verses 1b-2: "Fear not, for I have redeemed you: I have called you by name: you are mine. When you pass through the water, I will be with you; in the rivers you shall not drown. When you walk through fire, you shall not be burned; the flames shall not consume you." Continuing in verse 4: "Because you are precious in my eyes and glorious, and because I love you." These words are so comforting and offer reassurance that no matter what I am facing: no matter how difficult the path seems at the moment; no matter the obstacles that appear ahead; regardless of my fears and trepidations; God loves me and is with me. Perhaps He is walking ahead to show the way. Perhaps He is holding my hand for reassurance. Perhaps He is carrying me. What I know, even as we continue to walk through these difficult times since the outbreak of Covid-19 throughout the world, is that God loves each of us. We are precious to Him and He never abandons us. God's spirit lives in each of us and if we open our hearts we will know His presence and see His face in one another. Even dim light shines through the darkness to lead the way. I pray that He will show me how to let His light shine through me. It is comforting to know He loves me, I am precious, and that is the gift I want to give back. I love you, you are precious to me.

















































DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE HARVEST AND FRUITS OF THE EARTH - MAY 15
