



In 2018, Pope Francis decreed that the Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church be inserted into the Roman Calendar on the Monday after Pentecost (also known as Whit Monday) and to be celebrated every year.

In Roman Catholic Mariology, Mother of the Church (in Latin *Mater Ecclesiae*) is a title, officially given to Mary during the Second Vatican Council by Pope Paul VI. The title was first used in the 4th century by Saint Ambrose of Milan.

The title "Mother of the Church" was used by Pope Benedict XIV in 1748 and by Pope Leo XIII in 1885. The title was also used by Pope John Paul II and is also found in the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*.

Pope John Paul II stated that overall the title indicates the Blessed Virgin Mary's maternity of Christ's faithful, as deriving from her maternity of Christ in that "Mary is present in the Church as the Mother of Christ, and at the same time as that Mother whom Christ, in the mystery of the Redemption, gave to humanity in the person of the Apostle John. Thus, in her new motherhood in the Spirit, Mary embraces each and every one in the Church, and embraces each and every one through the Church."

Mary accomplishes her role as Mother by being first of all a true disciple of her Son. She who was flaw-lessly faithful, joining Jesus all the way to the tomb, is the perfect model for all who are called to follow him along the way of the Cross and to remain at the foot of the Cross.

As members of the Church, we learn from Mary how to live in obedience to the will of God. She forms her children in her way of docility to the Holy Spirit and her attentiveness to the needs of others. Mary helps us live in fidelity to the commandment of love, with willingness to carry in our own bodies the death of Christ, so that the life of Christ may also be made manifest in us

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Those of you who know me, have worked with me, or regularly read this column know that I am not a patient person, especially with myself. I cannot sleep, concentrate, or simply sit quietly when I feel there is some task that needs completed.

I cannot have multiple projects started at the same time. I am a person who likes order and for me order involves completing one task before moving on to something else. In my life there is always something else. I hyper-focus and lose patience with myself when I am distracted. Needless to say, all too often I also lose patience with others who do not share this obsession; prioritize, work, and complete one task at a time.

Now, I must confess I also lose patience with God. There are times when I wonder, "How long will this go on?" The this may be an illness, a social problem, hatred, harm to our environment, and so on (I am certain there are things which could be added from your list). At times I ask God for change and of course the change I am asking for is change that I think will make the world a better place. I know I am speaking with great hubris, but I am trying to be completely honest. Sometimes I am so lost in my own experiences, actions, and thoughts that I forget to let go and let God's will prevail, not on my schedule but in His time." I know the truth in my heart yet I still rationalize that what I seek in prayer is what should be.

During this Easter season we have read passages from the first letter of Peter. As I re-read this letter I found the following: "all of you, clothe yourselves with humility in your dealings with one another, for 'God opposes the proud but bestows favor on the humble.' So humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that he may exalt you in due time. Cast all your worries upon him because he cares for you" (I Peter 5:5-7). As I read these words I felt as though God was speaking directly to me; "Sandra, my beloved daughter, be patient. I love you and will always provide and care for you, even when you feel I have taken a sabbatical leave. I will teach you the way if you will open both your heart and mind. I have sent my Spirit to strengthen you and lead you. I will prepare the way but it takes time. All I ask is that you love others; be patient with them also. You are all my beloved children. If you follow me, I will show the way. All this takes time." We have all been waiting. On this Pentecost Sunday, listen to God, welcome His Spirit, and do not be discouraged. He is with you and He has been waiting for each of us to let go of selfish desires and demands. Jesus gave us the words: "Father . . . not my will but yours be done." (Luke 22:420)

In 1930, the Church declared worthy of belief, the visions of the shepherd children in Fatima, Portugal from the May 13 to Oct. 13, 1917. Pope John Paul II exhibited his approval of Fatima many times. He visited Fatima 3 times – in 1982, 1991 and 2000. During his 2000 visit made the Feast day of Our Lady of Fatima universal by ordering it to be included in the Roman Missal.
