

A Message From Fr. Mike

Thank You For Wearing Your Mask At All Times

Dear St James parishioners,

We are currently facing some challenges as a nation, but also as a parish community. One challenge is the mandate from county health officials, recently updated due to the rapid increase in the number of cases and hospitalizations, that we all

wear masks when we come in close contact with each other, especially indoors.

At St James, we have tried to follow the guidelines while being aware that there would naturally be resistance to any stricture that was not seen as absolutely necessary or explicitly required. As time has passed and scientists have learned more about how this virus is transmitted and how it affects our more vulnerable parishioners, removing face masks while seated is no longer something that in good conscience we can continue to support as "safe enough" to keep parishioners healthy. While we absolutely honor each person's ability to make decisions for themselves, we, as followers of Jesus Christ, must always hold in high regard the concerns of the weaker among us. The virus has proven to be highly contagious and quickly transmitted via airborne particles/droplets.

With this knowledge, we cannot in good conscience defend the removal of face masks inside our buildings. We would ask that while you are in the pews, you keep your mask on as a sign of your respect and care for those around you. This also applies to any time spent in prayer in our chapel for Adoration on Thursdays. We are challenged to offer up the momentary discomfort as a small penance and a way to show God's love to all whom we encounter.

From the Pastor's Pen

Each time we enter our St. James Church our eves focus on the large and beautiful mural of the Transfiguration behind the altar. It was chosen to be a special way to honor our parish patron, St. James. As reported in Mt. 17,1-9, Jesus took Peter, James, and John with him to a mountain, usually identified as Mount Tabor, where He was transfigured in their presence. Two others appear at the side of Jesus, Moses and Elijah, suggesting that Jesus is the fulfillment of the law and the prophets. I mention this account because the feast of the Transfiguration is celebrated in the Universal Catholic Church family this Thursday, August 6.

St. Thomas Aguinas considered the Transfiguration as the "greatest of miracles." The scene depicts the meeting place of the temporal and the eternal, Jesus as the bridge that unites heaven and earth. Jesus teaches that all disciples are called to share in that heavenly glory. The voice of the heavenly Father confirms our faith: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to Him." So our path to sharing in that glory is by our listening, which infers that we act on the good news that we hear. Each time we look at the mural we ask the Lord to help us to be faithful to that call.

St. James had the privilege of being present to the glorified Lord and received the call to go forth, proclaiming the Word of God to all who would open their hearts to receive the Word, Jesus. As members of St. James Parish, we can call upon our patron saint to help us, not only as individuals, but as members of this community of faith. Our task is not only to listen to the Word, as the heavenly Father commanded, but to give witness to that Word to all that we encounter.

I have been blessed to journey through the Holy Land, visiting the sites associated with the life and ministry of Jesus. One of the places that I visited was Mount Tabor, where the Franciscans have built and maintain a beautiful church where the Transfiguration is commemorated. For many centuries, pilgrims have come to this site to remember and honor the appearance of the glorified Lord and to pray for perseverance of faith so that they would one day share in that glory. As we enter into the spirit of the feast this Thursday, let us thank God for our church, our parish, and the patronage of St. James.

My prayers are with you each day.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Daily I receive emails, telephone calls, and texts asking "How are you doing?" Generally I say fine but that really is not true. I do not feel fine. I feel anxious, disappointed, at times discouraged, frustrated, exhausted, and yes, angry.

Perhaps you are experiencing some of these same feelings. So many I communicate with feel much the same, from the very old (my mom who is 101), to younger adults (my grandson is 24), and even children. I also know I am not alone experiencing feelings of helplessness. What can I do to alleviate these feelings and help others?

As you may know my 12 years of post-secondary education were spent studying and doing research in chemistry and microbiology. I was engaged in trying to understand and elucidate both the benefits and harmful effects of microorganisms. During my studies and for nearly 30 years after receiving my Ph.D. I taught these subjects to college students preparing to enter medical professions. During that time I always emphasized the importance of infection control and how what might appear to be a simple task, such as handwashing, was in reality one of the primary means of controlling the spread of infectious disease. You may be asking, "What is your point?"

One of the primary causes of the feelings I listed above is rooted in the fact that so many people are not following the simple advice given by health professionals, the steps to prevent or at least minimize the spread of Covid19: do not leave the safety of your home except when necessary, avoid large crowds, social distance as much as possible, wash your hands, and properly wear a mask. Not one of these recommendations is difficult to follow and they are directed at the common good. These are recommendations we can all follow (even though there might be a slight inconvenience), and will benefit many.

My feelings also stem from listening to voices espousing personal freedom and "all lives matter," yet who also refuse to follow these guidelines. I do not believe I can be pro-life, state that all live is sacred, and simultaneously refuse to follow guidelines for preventing needless infection of the vulnerable and there is of course the fact with Covid19 we simply do not know who is vulnerable. I may feel well and still be infected, carrying the possibility of spreading this disease to anyone. By refusing to follow infection control guidelines, such as wearing a mask when I am in public, I put other, sacred lives at risk.

My feelings are real and not exaggerated. I can not do much, but I can wear a mask when I am in the presence of other human beings. As a microbiologist I know I take no risk in wearing a mask, but I truly put others at risk when I fail to do so. As adults let's not ask more of our school-children than of ourselves.

Back to School Items - Tax Free Weekend: August 7 - 9

On August 4, Missouri Votes To Expand Medicade

The Missouri Catholic Conference, in an effort to uphold the dignity of the human person in accord with Catholic social teaching, is lending its support to Amendment 2 on Missouri's August 4 ballot.

Amendment 2 is a ballot initiative which would expand Missouri's Medicaid program to provide health insurance coverage to low-income Missouri citizens currently living without it.

Bishop James V. Johnston, Jr. of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph joins the other bishops of the Missouri Catholic Conference in support of Amendment 2.

Missouri Amendment 2, the Medicaid Expansion Initiative is on the ballot in Missouri as an initiated constitutional amendment on August 4, 2020.^[1]

A "yes" vote supports

- expanding Medicaid eligibility in Missouri to adults that are 19 years old or older and younger than 65 whose income is 133% of the federal poverty level or below, which would effectively expand Medicaid to those with incomes at or below 138% of the federal poverty level under the Affordable Care Act;
- prohibiting any additional restrictions or requirements for the expanded population to qualify for Medicaid coverage than for other populations that qualify for Medicaid coverage; and
- · requiring the state to seek maximum federal funding of Medicaid expansion.

A "no" vote opposes this constitutional amendment to expand Medicaid eligibility in Missouri under the Affordable Care Act.
