

From the Pastor's Pen

Pope Francis has announced that this Tuesday. September 1. is to be designated as the "World Day of Prayer for the Care of the Earth." He has encouraged all Catholics around the world, and indeed all people of good will, to join in prayer that our earth may be respected as our common home. It is called the "Season of Creation," which begins on September 1 and runs until October 4, the feast of St. Francis of Assisi. Pope Francis urges us to reaffirm our personal vocation to be stewards of creation, to thank God for the gifts of creation, to join in efforts to sustain and protect the environment, and to seek God's pardon for all the ways that the beauty of creation has been exploited.

Most of you are aware of the 2015 encyclical letter of Pope Francis called "Laudato Si," a powerful statement about care for our environment. The encyclical begins with the words "Laudato si, mi signore." translated as "Praise to you, my Lord." These words are taken from the beginning of the "Canticle of Creation" by St. Francis of Assisi. "Praise to you, my Lord, through our Sister, Mother Earth, who sustains and governs us. We have inflicted on her great hurt by our irresponsible us and abuse of the goods with which God has endowed her."

Our care for the earth begins with our faith: that all creation is God's gift to us. Our duty is to care for the earth as our common home. The encyclical is fundamentally a reminder of our call to be good stewards of the earth, the air, the water, and all forms of life. These gifts are our shared inheritance. We use and respect the gifts of creation wisely, carefully, and reverently, so that that they may be passed on to future generations.

Pope Francis calls attention to the ways in which the environment is plundered and abused. Space in this article does not allow for details, but the Pope speaks of the many forms of pollution. He laments the "throw-away culture" which reduces things to rubbish, and speaks of the ways fresh water is wasted until sources are dried up. The climate, Pope Francis says, is a common good, belongs to all and meant for all.

There is so much in the encyclical to be pondered. I urge all of you to read it. It can be found online. Most importantly, I call upon you to consider your own stewardship, how you use or abuse the gifts of God's creation. Good stewardship must be part of the practice of our Catholic faith.

My prayers are with you each day. Fr. Michael

THE TENNIS BALL PROJECT We Need Used Tennis Balls

As reported in this bulletin in late July, over the summer 28,000 square feet of flooring in the school was completely stripped and rewaxed.



We would like to preserve the floor finish from being damaged by the movement of chair and desk legs across the surface.

Putting tennis balls on the chair and desk legs will decrease the likelihood of the floors being marred.

The plan is to begin in the middle school classrooms that have a total of 83 desks and 94 chairs that will need 4 tennis balls each. That means we will need 708 tennis balls for this area.

If you have used tennis balls that you want to get rid of, or know someone who might have some (it's okay that they not look like new), we would appreciate your donating them to the *Tennis Ball Project*.

One kind person, learning of this need, is donating (believe it or not) 200 used balls. While we don't expect another windfall like this, every tennis ball will help make a difference.

They can be dropped off in the Parish Office during regular business hours.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Have you ever thought about your imagination? Perhaps you think imagination is something for children; something adults must leave behind with maturity and wisdom, or something you have lost? After all as adults

we must deal with reality, real life trials, not an imaginary world. If these statement are true, I think our adult world is indeed a very sad, limited place in which to exist and, which furthermore, severely limits our concepts of God.

Psychologists define imagination as the ability to produce and simulate novel objects, people, and ideas in our mind without any immediate input of the senses. In other words, we use our imagination to form mental images of people. places, objects, ideas, and yes even God without direct knowledge or previous sensory experience. For example, I imagine God's omnipresence and omnipotence as peaceful and calming like my experiences of the natural world, both living and nonliving. Consequently I imagine heaven as a beautiful, tranquil, natural, open space. Are my imaginary. mental images of God's presence and power wrong, or are they a reflection of my previous sensory, calming experiences in the natural world which I find pleasant? Thus my imagined image of God is natural not supernatural. I suggest that without imagination we limit God to a remote spiritual, unnatural world, and fail to recognize Him in our present, every day, ordinary world. We fail to see God in secular art, literature, music, or dance. We fail to see God in history, biology, geology, astronomy, and the social sciences. We fail to recognize God in suffering and sorrow. Greatest of all, however, we fail to recognize God in others, especially those individuals who look different, think different, act different, and even worship different than we do. We limit God to our tradition, our learning, and our beliefs related to right and wrong. We fail to see God's love given to those individuals whom we do not know personally, have not experienced, or to whom we have never taken time to hear their voices, and listen to their needs, and their perspectives.

My challenge is to imagine God differently, perhaps as a loving mother rather than father; perhaps with the face of an Asian rather than a European; perhaps as young innocent child instead of "Old Father Time;" perhaps as smiling in a beautiful sunset, or perhaps simply an inner feeling or pleasant sensation. Let you imagination flow. Let God grow without bounds. Let God come into your heart unlimited, ever present in the ordinary. Let the words of Jesus echo in your heart: "love one another as I love you." Let your imagination reunite God's creation that you experience each day with the spiritual world that is not in some distant realm but is oh, so near.
