

Your second option is the QR code in the gathering space. Scan the code for the music and readings.




Look for the poster in the Gathering Space with the QR code. Scan the code with your smart phone.

From the Pastor's Pen

Do you think that Jesus was bilingual? Aramaic would have been his native tongue, though at the time, the Romans had conquered the land so that Jesus would have heard the Latin language as well as those who spoke Greek. I bring this up because this Wednesday, September 30, the Church celebrates the feast of St. Jerome, a great scholar who was born in the year 342, knew many languages, and was a devout Christian. At the time the Scripture was available only in Greek, so Jerome set about the task of translating the Bible into Latin because Latin was the predominant language. So this feast always reminds us that we are people of the Book, the Scriptures.

Focusing on the gospels, we must remember that these are not dictations from the mouth of Jesus. It is unlikely that people were writing down the words of Jesus as he spoke. After his death and resurrection, the disciples who knew Jesus recalled and taught His words. It was only a couple generations later that the words began to be written down and eventually gathered into the books that today we know as the four gospels. It is very fascinating to study the evolution of the gospels.

So we rightly use this feast of St. Jerome to affirm the importance of reading and studying the words of the Scripture, especially the gospels. It is a truth of our faith that the Scripture is the Word of God, divinely inspired, with the purpose of teaching religious truth. Though there are fundamentalists who insist that the Bible should be read literally, Scripture scholars today teach us that there is another way of reading and understanding the Word of God. Not every word needs to be understood literally. We read the Scripture according to the literary form in which they were are written. A good example would be the parables of Jesus, which are stories to illustrate and teach some truth.

In this short space, I cannot do justice to the Catholic view of reading the Bible. There are many excellent commentaries available for that purpose. I just wanted to use this feast of St. Jerome to say again how important it is for us to know and love the Scripture and recommend daily reading. It is a way nurturing our faith and inspiring us.

My prayers are with you each day.



Someone is Watching and Wondering



The third chapter of *Gaudium et Spes* (The Church in the Modern World) is titled "Human Activity Throughout the World" and begins with a simple statement that men and women, using their talents and work, ceaselessly labor to improve their lives. I find nothing in this chapter, however, which prioritizes or prizes one

talent or type of work over another. Rather, there is the idea that humans have the capability through their unique activities to control nearly every aspect of life. Significantly this statement leads to the assumption that the worldwide family is united by concerns for the common good. Yet many still struggle with the meaning and end goal of life.

As Christians we believe that our societal efforts and advances must be used to produce a better world and that we are to use the gift of creation for the common good. This is the central mission as human beings and followers of Christ Jesus. If this is true, then as we engage in human activities for the benefit of all, God is present and continuing to unfold the mystery of ongoing creation. We must never believe that human advances, which improve the life for all people (such as vaccines) are in opposition to God's desires, rather we should be convinced that they are a sign of God's grace. If we are living the good news of Jesus, we are not hindered from improving the world, on the contrary, we are bound to do our part. When we work, we not only alter our world, we alter ourselves; we grow in understanding of our interconnectedness. Such growth is more valuable than the wealth such work may produce. God does not judge by what we possess but how we live in love, peace, and unity; how we work to be inclusive rather than exclusive; how we strive for justice and solidarity; how we use science and technology to protect and preserve the environment; how we allow each person to pursue their created purpose.

Through science and technology we continue to unveil the mysteries of the universe. I believe we are lead by God in making these discoveries, however, how we use our knowledge may be a continuation of our mission as followers of Christ or may devolve into selfish, self-centered greed and struggles for power and control. When God is no longer part of the equation, human life loses meaning. When selfserving ways of behavior emerge, they threaten the peace and security of humanity. Unfortunately, our world has yet to become a place of true sisterhood and brotherhood, and we continue to fight the darkness. I believe, however, Jesus is the light. It is our choice to follow His light or to continue struggling in darkness. God is not a dictator. God gives as free will and allows us to choose the path we wish to follow. Are you willing to follow Jesus' path? The hope He gives to the world is based in love, not foolish hope.

Feast Day of Saints Michael, Gabriel and Raphael, Archangels - September 29



On September 29th we celebrate the Feast of Saints Michael, Gabriel, Raphael, and the Archangels. Based upon Scripture the Church determined there are Seven Archangels who played an important role in Jewish and Christian traditions. At the Council of Rome in 745, the names of the three Archangels mentioned in Scripture were officially recognized: Michael (one who is like God), Gabriel (God is my strength) and Raphael (God is my health). Although names of the other four Archangels (Ariel, Raquel, Zerachiel, and Remiel) appear in Jewish and Christian sources outside of the canon, they are not recognized by name in Catholic doctrine.

- St. Michael is known as the Defender of the Church as well as the Patron of soldiers, police officers, and fire-fighters. He is generally regarded as the first among the Archangels.
- St. Gabriel as God's holy messenger is revered as the Archangel of wisdom, revelation, prophecy and visions.
- St. Raphael was pivotal in the Book of Tobit, helping Tobias on his journey. He is revered as the Archangel of healing due to a verse usually omitted from many translations of John's gospel: "and an angel of the Lord descended at certain times into the pond; and the water was moved." (John 5:4)

At our Saturday 5:00pm Masses volunteers from our HELPING HANDS MINISTRY will provide assistance to those needing some extra help reaching the sanctuary on the upper level of the building to attend Mass.

To use this service, please make a reservation. This ensures that we have enough volunteers available. Please follow the steps below.

- 1 A few days before you plan to attend the 5:00pm Saturday Mass, make a reservation by calling Daryl Sweetland in the parish office, 781-4343, extension 200, by 4:00pm on Friday. Leave a message on her voice mail if you are unable to talk with her personally.
- 2 When arriving at the church, park in one of the spaces on the south side of the church or behind the church as close to the south side as possible.
- 3 Enter the lower level of the church through the south door (near the dumpster). There will be a HELPING HANDS ENTRANCE sign near the door.
- 4 Please take a seat in one of the chairs near the door and a volunteer will be available shortly to assist you to your seat in the church; wheelchairs are available if needed.

After Mass, a volunteer will assist you in returning to the lower level.

This service is available only for the 5:00pm Saturday Mass. We hope to be able to extend this service to other weekend Masses in the future.


