We strive to grow in our faith by being good stewards of the gifts God has given us; sharing God's truth with all.

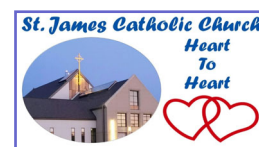
As the Body of Christ, we are called to love and serve everyone, especially the marginalized, with joy and hospitality.

Coping With Covid

When we gathered together on October 19 last year for the dedication of our new church we were excited, anticipating the beautiful liturgies at Christmas and Easter in our new worship space and gatherings in the new Parish Hall.

Then in March, Covid arrived! Our world was turned upside down. Churches, schools and businesses closed, "home offices" became the norm, we learned the term "social distancing" and masks became the order of the day.

Yet, through it all, there was one constant we could count on – the staff and our priests keep in contact, through phone calls, cards, letters, our bulletin, Facebook page and website. We all knew "our church" was there for us.



As things "lightened-up", our ministries are going above and beyond to reach out and bring things back as close as possible to a "new normal." Although they cannot have in-person gatherings, they have learned to adjust and continue their mission. Zoom calls, drive-bys, drive-ups, and curb-side meals substitute for in-person gatherings.

Just as our church could not have been built without tremendous team effort, that tremendous team effort continues to prevail at St. James during these unprecedented times. For example, the Knights of Columbus provide curb-side meals and, with the Do-Dads, and That Man Is You groups, have formed lawn mowing and snow removal teams. The Altar society provides newsletters and drive-bys for its members; the Shut-In and Sick ministry sends cards and delivers flowers to nursing homes and assisted care facilities. Our Landscape Care Team maintain the gardens and grounds, and our custodial team ensures that appropriate Covid-safe cleaning takes place. Jan and Jane facilitate our HOPE card program. Danny Baker and Quinn Knabe livestream our Sunday Mass and make it available for those at home, and members of the Pastoral Council lend a helping hand when needed.

We have much to be thankful for - Thanks Be To God.

Whenever a church is dedicated, we celebrate that WE are the church, the People of God, and this worship space has guided us this past year in wonderful celebrations of Baptisms, Weddings, First Communions, Confirmations, and the seasons of Advent and Christmas, and Lent.

Then we moved into COVID-mode and went on-line for two months. but our Church continued to be there for us and this community has lived out the message of what it means to be Church for one another. As we journey through this pandemic, we pray that we can live out the message of the Scriptures we hear proclaimed this weekend that come from the celebration of the Dedication of a Church. Someone is Watching and Wondering



As I continue to reread this document, *Lumen Gentium* – The Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, I have drawn a few conclusions regarding our role as Church, the Body of Christ.

First we understand that God created the universe and chose humans to share His divine life. We also understand that creation was an act of love and that God, who is love, never abandons humanity. Second the Reign of God on earth was initiated through the incarnation and through Christ's love and surrender to the will of the Father, he restored humanities relationship with God which had been broken as sin entered the world. Third we believe that the Holy Spirit guides the Church in truth and working through our ordinary lives the Spirit provides leadership and service to all of God's people and the Church. The question then is who or what is the Church?

Lumen Gentium is very clear; we the people, united to Christ in baptism, nourished by the Eucharist, and bound by the Holy Spirit are the Church. We are a family, the Body of Christ, called to love one another, who together endure sorrow, share happiness, and lead to freely forgive. Christ leads the Church as its head, and the Holy Spirit sustains us as its soul. As members of His body we must be conformed to His image, loving and serving one another. We also must recognize that there are many elements of truth and holiness to be found outside the Church. We must recognize the needs of the poor, defend those without power, avoid seeking our own glory, and act with humility and self-sacrifice for the good of all, even those outside the Church. *Lumen gentium* explains that although not all people belong to the Church, all people are included in its embrace and all people are beloved by God.

The Church is always in need of renewal, forgiveness, and greater understanding of the Kingdom. God's Reign, however, is not an earthly kingdom because it encompasses citizens of every race, with their unique and diverse cultures. As Church, our failure to put love into practice, even if we are faithful to the Church in other ways, is a rejection of Christ Jesus and the salvation He brings. The many people who do not identify with Christianity are uniquely connected to the Church, even those who do not seek God, if they are good and true. We all are related, through our common humanity, as God's beloved.

Jim Newell
The Man Behind The Scenes



Jim Newell is Operations Manager of St. James. His responsibilities include handling business activities, procurement, facilities, maintenance and custodial efforts, and security. He has also been responsible for coordinating several capital campaigns, in conjunction with the Master Plan for St. James, and all construction activities.

In 2000, after a career in the corporate world spanning several decades, Jim retired to spend more time with his family and on the golf course. Seven years later, in 2007, Fr. Tom Albers interrupted Jim's quest to join the Senior golf tour by requesting he give the neighbors' windows a brief break and come join him in helping in helping to finish the school expansion. Eight classrooms were added and Jim got some insight into building in the "world of churches." Jim recalls Fr. Tom enjoying scribbling notes on his wish list for a new church until he left St. James in 2011.

Shortly thereafter, Fr. Mike came home to Liberty and St. James. In 2012, after some serious researching of our existing plant and listening to parishioners' comments on the facilities, Father suggested expansion would only "band aid" our requirement for space. It might best be accomplished by building a new church that would satisfy our needs for the next 50 years. They met the first group of campaign chairs in the conference room of the old B&B Theatre: Jim commented "now the race is on."

The first step was to pick partners for a long journey. Four of the top church builders from the Diocese's list of approved contractors were interviewed and the firm who had just completed our school expansion was added. The team of A.L. Huber, General Contractor, supported by SFS Architects as their architectural arm, was selected by our building committee. They felt that the process of raising money and planning for the building would require two to three campaigns. They pushed for a design Build Contract to maintain the same team through the process and the Diocese supported us.

A "stake in the sand," a way to measure and quantify progress and to stay on the right path, was necessary. SFS Architects was commissioned to interview our parishioners, gather input from our key players and structure their requirements and their dreams. With the assistance of our Parish leadership they would craft a Master Plan under Huber's guidance for Fr. Mike and finally the Bishop's approval.

Raising money and planning to build would require two to three campaigns.

Journey To Our New Church - Lest We Forget

Today we are blessed with our beautiful new church. Sometimes it's easy to take what we have for granted. Recalling our journey helps us to remember that with God and the hard work, determination, sacrifice, generosity, and prayers of our parishioners, anything is possible.



The Six Ambo Panels

The six ambo panels symbolically depict the dynamic Word of God, active and effective through salvation history. Concentric circles are a unifying compositional theme used to depict the dynamic energy of Divine Life expressed through the Word of God. They also symbolize perfection, harmony, and eternity. Colors are muted yet vibrant, depicting the richness of God's revelation and the heavenly glory into which the faithful are invited through the proclamation of the Word. *The panels are described as they appear from far left to far right. Ambo.*

In the first panel the tree remind us of the Garden of Eden and God's creation. In the theophany to Moses, the bush is burning but not consumed, showing Gods sovereignty over all. A definitive moment in God's revelation is the proclamation of His identity in the great name, I AM, which is further elaborated in His giving of the Law, the 10 Commandments. The tree theme is also a prefigure of the Cross on which Jesus died, but was not consumed, for he rose, conquering death.



In the second panel the harp is a traditional representation of King David, the known author of many of the musical poems known as the psalms. In the psalms the Holy Spirit inspired the Jewish author to compose words expressive of the faith and longing of the Jewish people.

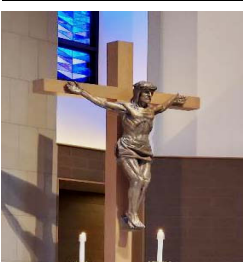


But the Holy Spirit and Christ being one, the psalms are words of Christ Himself, his own cry along with his whole Mystical Body, the Church. Water flows from the proclamation of the Psalms because God's Word nourishes and heals. Parallels are seen in water flowing from the center of the Garden and from Christ's side, giving birth to the Church and to baptism, in which we are incorporated into the Word Himself, Jesus Christ.

The fourth panel depicts an oil lamp, a representation of the light of Creation and the Light that came into the world, Jesus Christ. Drawn from Psalm 119: "Your word, O Lord, is a lamp unto my feet, a light to my path," this image poetically expresses a defining dynamic of the Judeo



-Christian tradition: God is not distant, but speaks to humanity in history, enlightening us and creating us onward. The presence of thuribles of incense evoke the ritual sacrifices of Jewish worship, a prefigure of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. In the Mass there is an



This 6 foot bronze sculpture of the Crucified Christ rises 15 foot in height in our sanctuary next to our glorious mural. Designed by Brian Hanlon (Hanlon Sculpture Studios) it is a most breathtaking sight!

analogous relationship between the Sacrament of the Eucharist and the sacrament of the Word proclaimed.

In the fourth panel, the Tree of Life is depicted. Bathed in Divine Light emanating from the center of the panel, the moment of creation is portrayed when through God's Word, everything came into being: "God said: 'Let there be light!'" From the center of the garden flowed four living streams, rushing out to nourish the whole creation. The four streams are a pre-figure of the four gospels which flowed out to nourish the world with the Good News.

The fifth panel is the book of the Gospels and a representation of the culmination of God's revelation in history. "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God . . . And in the fullness of time, the Word became flesh and dwelt among us." The great I AM of the Old Testament now takes flesh in Jesus who says: "I AM the Way the Truth and the Life, no one comes to the Father except through me." In the scriptures proclaimed in the liturgy, the Word of God, Jesus Christ is really present, speaking to us and inviting us to a share of His Divine life with the Father, through the power of the Holy Spirit.

The far right panel depicts the loaves and fishes reminding us of the miracle where Jesus fed the 5,000.

But this miracle took place during the Sermon on the Mount in which Jesus taught the crowds: "blessed are the poor in spirit," "blessed are the meek," "love your enemies, and pray for those who persecute you." The Word of God, who is the person of Jesus Christ, nourishes us with true food and drink in the Eucharist, and through the ministry of his holy teachings.

Our fountain, by Atlas Landscape, graces the circular drive in front of the church. Made from Old Quarry River wall block and crowned by ledgestone caps, it is 7.6 feet high and 8.25 feet wide.

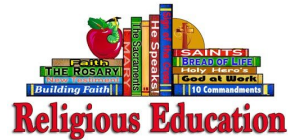
Since the dedication of our new church, we will have hosted thirteen weddings, with three more to come before the end of this calendar year. To put that in perspective, in the past, it was a banner year if we hosted anywhere close to ten weddings. For the calendar year 2021, we have fifteen weddings already scheduled, with more being booked each week.



The number for this year would have been much higher had Covid not hit, causing quite a few couples to decide to postpone their weddings until next year. Covid has dealt us some challenges and has caused many sleepless nights for brides and grooms!

However, for the brave couples who married during the very heart of the Covid shutdown, when we could not host more than 10 people in the church, God was clearly still here. Those weddings were incredibly moving – just the bride and groom, maybe a few of their immediate family members. When you strip away all the fuss and excitement, when they aren't self consciously thinking about everyone watching them, then the focus becomes just the couple, standing on the altar before God, promising to love, honor, and be true each other for the rest of their lives. For those of us watching, it was incredibly intimate and incredibly moving – I'm not usually one to cry at weddings, but I have to confess that these small, starkly simple weddings really got to me. Now that things have eased up a little, weddings are no longer limited to just 10 people and couples have been able to add back some of the things that were cut during the shutdown. However, it was eye-opening to be given the gift to see in stark relief what the heart of a wedding should be.

Religious Education

What's New In Religious Education?

A year ago we moved into our “new” church, and we breathed in new smells, saw new beauty, we heard new sounds, and we felt the newly-created roominess in our expanded space. A year later, you may be recognizing that there is still a lot of “new” going on around us – especially in our Religious Education program.

Lori Tajchman was welcomed in June as the Director of Religious Education. She has been around St. James long enough that we don't consider her new, but the position was definitely a change. Within months, even her new responsibilities changed as she accepted the challenge to also oversee the middle school, high school and Confirmation programs.

As your parish staff worked to accommodate health and safety measures and guidelines within our parish, the structure of our programs began to change out of necessity. Weekly classroom-style catechesis morphed into family-style faith-sharing gatherings meeting once a month with parents and their children from preschool through high school. High School Confirmation prep classes moved out of the setting of small peer groups meeting in classrooms to larger gatherings in the church where parents and sponsors actively participate with the students.

While PB&J classes are on hold, the recent addition of Family Adoration Hours, offered specifically for families with toddlers, preschoolers and children learning virtually, has been well-received and more dates are on the upcoming calendar for Family Adoration.

The state of the world has dictated we change things up – a lot! In every aspect of our Religious Education program, and in our efforts to continue to serve the families of our parish, we are creating change that brings families and children of all ages together to pray and to pass on the faith to their children. Look around the Church, notice what is new, and embrace the change – because often change is good!
