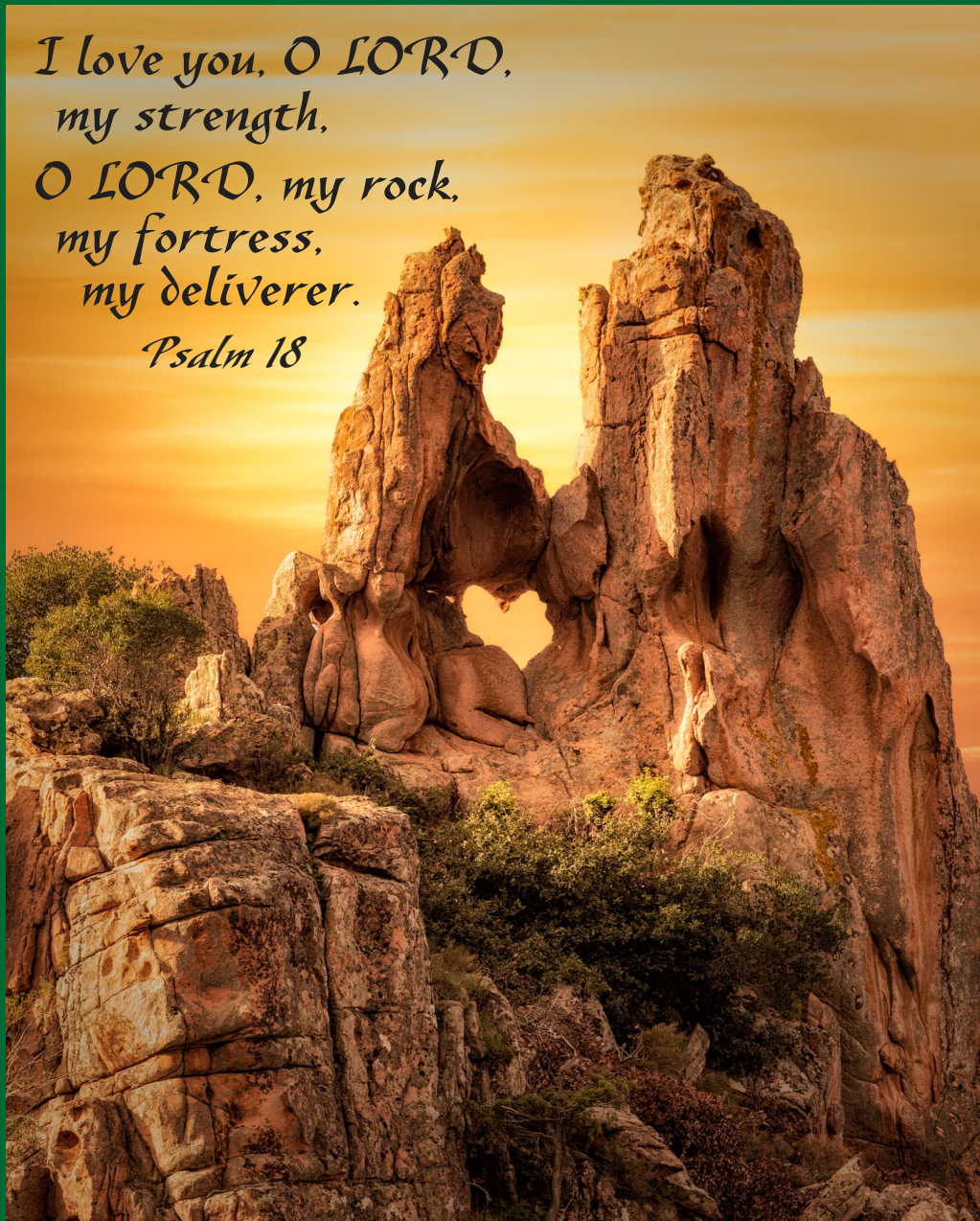

From the Pastor's Pen

Every four years, in conjunction with the U.S. Presidential elections, the Bishops of the United States issue a document called "Faithful Citizenship," which provides thoughtful and inspired guidance for voters. Our bishops reaffirm that it is a duty, and indeed a moral obligation, that all who are eligible voters exercise the privilege of voting. In the months before the election we are swamped with political advertising, often confusing and contradictory. So the United States Conferences of Catholic Bishops offers words for encouragement and reflection.

First, the bishops state that there must be no coercion in casting our vote. Each voter must follow his or her own conscience in making decisions. This assumes that all of us have a conscience that is attuned to making moral decisions. Conscience must be rightly formed. The way we form our conscience is by knowing the issues as best we can in the light of our faith values. Our Church and our faith do not tell us how to vote, but only how to prepare to vote by being attuned to our Christian values and assessing the candidates by those principles.

Second, the bishops affirm that Catholics are not single-issue voters. Yes, it is true that some issues take precedence over others, but we stand for a "consistent ethic of life." We need to reflect on how the positions of the candidates affect the dignity and value of humans in all of its ages and stages and conditions. Social justice issues to be considered would include: promoting religious freedom; defending the values of marriage; housing the homeless; welcoming the immigrant; protecting the environment; and above all, defense of the life of those most unable to defend themselves: the unborn, the handicapped, and the elderly.

We all love our country and want civil leaders who are honest, who seek the common good of all the people, and who put values above politics. So we join in prayer, both in common as the People of God, and as individuals, asking our God to be with us in this election year, to guide and direct us in our choices of leadership.

Please vote if at all possible. Your voice needs to be heard.

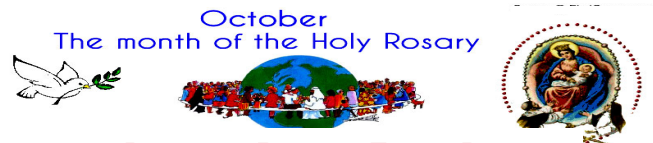

No Trunk or Treat This Year

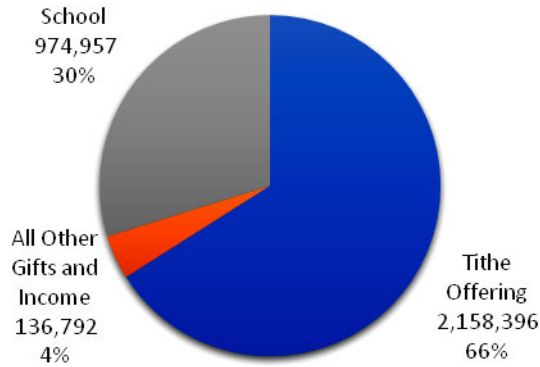

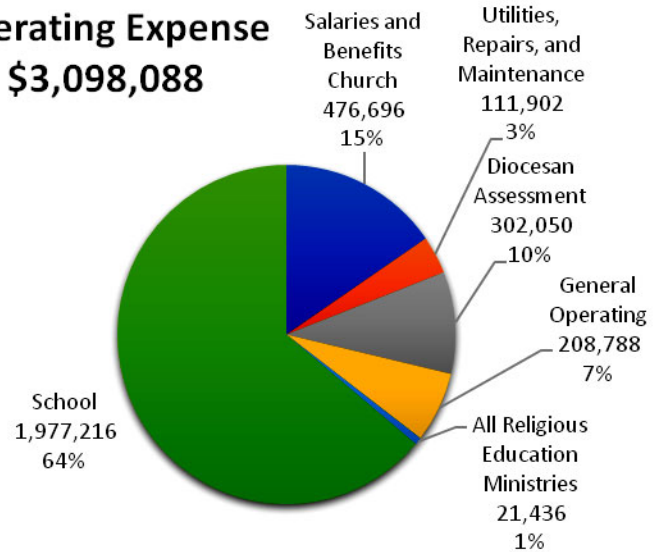
PRAY THE ROSARY EVERY DAY

Operating Income \$3,270,144

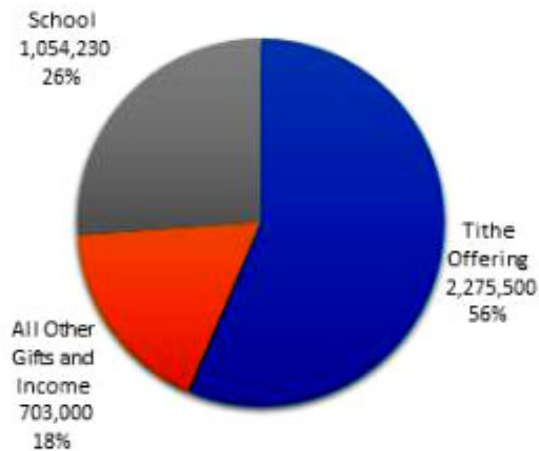


Operating Expense \$3,098,088

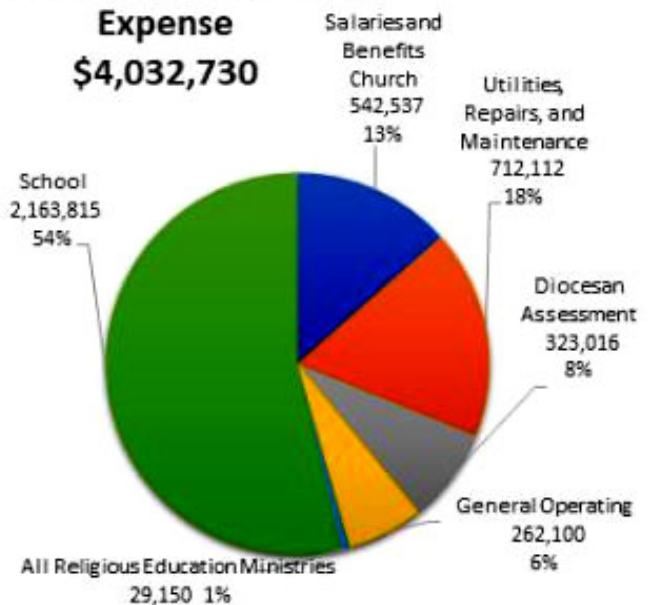


2020-21 Budget Operating Income and Expense For the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2021

The St. James Over 50s group's has not been able to meet since the start of the pandemic.

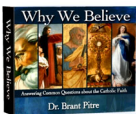

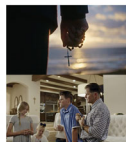
