

From the Pastor's Pen

Now that the local, state, and national elections have been held, it is time for us to put aside all rancor, divisiveness, and polarization and to work together in a spirit of harmony and peace. As I write this reflection a couple weeks before the election, I do not know the results or the state of the nation. But I do know that there is much work to be done in healing the wounds and scars of a bitter campaign. As people of faith, we must pray for our country, one nation, under God, and do our part in bringing about reconciliation and good will.

As Catholics, we know that the work of reconciliation extends also to our beloved Church. Pope Francis has a very heavy burden as he strives to foster a spirit of unity and good will. There were headlines in the news recently about financial scandals in the Vatican Bank. Money, as the old saying goes, is the source of all evil. Given the weakness of human nature and the power of temptations, it is not surprising that sometimes people in positions of trust try to find ways to enrich themselves. That such greed would happen with an official within the Vatican Bank is very distressing, but we must not let that person's dishonesty make us lose trust in the safeguard of monies to be used for Church charities.

Recently there was a story in news about a priest from the Diocese of Sacramento, Fr. Jeremy Leatherby, who was excommunicated because of his refusal to acknowledge the authority of Pope Francis. It is only one example of groups in our country and world who find fault with the Church and with the teachings of the Second Vatican Council. Rather that engage in charitable dialogue, they make public statements of criticism and they sometimes practice pre-Vatican II liturgical ways. All Catholics do not agree in all ways with Church practices and leadership. But to publicly criticize and rebel is not the way of Christ, not the way of fraternal charity, not the way of healing in the Church.

So it must be in our own parish family and in our own family homes. We will not always agree on policies, practices, and decisions. The parish gathers us together for a common purpose: to worship our God and to foster our faith. In times of conflict or disagreement, we always are guided by dialogue, by loving conversation. May God bless all of us as we work together in harmony and peace.

My prayers are with you each day.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



I think St. Francis of Assisi is probably one of the best known saints. Walking through many neighborhoods will reveal one or more statues, usually in a flower garden, of this venerated saint. I will also hazard to guess there are many, many people who are familiar with his Peace Prayer and probably have a copy in their possession. Actually this prayer is absent from all St. Francis' writings and appeared in its

present form in 1912. The first publication was in French, in a small spiritual magazine, *La Clochette*, and the author was never mentioned. It was highly publicized during World War I and II, is frequently set to music, and often quoted by prominent leaders. For me, however, the most significant feature of this prayer is the challenge to move from self-centeredness to putting others first and living in servanthood.

A quick search on the internet for "peace prayers," quickly revealed 30 other peace prayers. Although they were all beautiful prayers, most asked God to bring peace into "my life, my heart, my family, my home, the world, etc. Not one of these prayers challenged me to move out of my self-absorption, to abandon my overinflated ego, and to become an "instrument of peace." During these difficult times, I find it refreshing to look to the Prayer of St. Francis for consolation and guidance.

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace.
Where there is hatred, let me bring love.
Where there is offence, let me bring pardon.
Where there is discord, let me bring union.
Where there is error, let me bring truth.
Where there is doubt, let me bring faith.
Where there is despair, let me bring hope.
Where there is darkness, let me bring your light.
Where there is sadness, let me bring joy.
O Master, let me not seek as much to be consoled as to console, to be understood as to understand, to be loved as to love, for it is in giving that one receives, it is in self-forgetting that one finds, it is in pardoning that one is pardoned,

it is in dying that one is raised to eternal life.

This translation may be different from what you know but for me it has become a guide and daily meditation.

Instead of gift tags on trees, individual shopping efforts, wrapping, and gift sorting, we will heavily rely on our Hope gift card program for our giving efforts.

What does that mean? Well, we just made your Advent Giving Tree gifting easier. No need to debate what tags to take from the tree, and no need to shop or wrap gifts!

Simply make a donation – payable to St. James Church (with "AGT" on the notation line) and you're done! The Advent Giving Tree Committee will do the rest – using your donations to purchase Hope gift cards, which will then be donated to the various charitable agencies in need of our help.

This week we are highlighting Liberty Women's Clinic, Love INC, and Ashton Court. The other agencies are: the Bishop Sullivan Center, our own St. James Liberty, Hillcrest Hope, Cedars of Liberty, Journey to New Life, and Kansas City Indian Center.

- * Liberty Women's Clinic (LWC) provides free resources in a safe, accepting environment to help women make informed, life-affirming choices about their pregnancies. LWC does not refer for or provide abortions. This year, Advent Giving Tree will provide gift cards to help mothers purchase a big-ticket item (e.g. stroller, car seat, Pack 'n Play) for their newborn babies.
- * Love, INC is a partnership of local churches that work together to help the poor. Last year, Love INC served 1,872 Clay County families, helping 29 families avoid evictions, 77 families with utility bills, and nearly \$70,000 in in-kind assistance with diapers, personal hygiene products, and cleaning supplies. This year, Advent Giving Tree will donate gift cards to assist Love INC in helping families purchase necessities.
- * Ashton Court is a senior living provider and rehabilitation center in Liberty. Last year, through Advent Giving Tree, parishioners provided 117 residents with Christmas gifts of requested items. This year we will take a different approach – purchasing quantities of "most requested" items (e.g. lap blankets, bath supplies, puzzle books, coloring books) for residents to choose from as their Christmas gift from St. James.

Thank you so much for helping our Advent Giving Tree continue to be a bright spot for those in need!!



Archbasilica of St John Lateran

Most Catholics think of St. Peter's as the pope's main church, but they are wrong. St. John Lateran is the pope's church, the cathedral of the Diocese of Rome where the Bishop of Rome presides.

The first basilica on the site was built in the fourth century when the land was donated from the wealthy Lateran family. That structure and its successors suffered fire, earthquake, and the ravages of war, but the Lateran remained the church where popes were consecrated. The present structure was commissioned in 1646.

One of Rome's most imposing churches, it towering facade is crowned with 15 colossal statues of Christ, John the Baptist, John the Evangelist, and 12 doctors of the Church. Beneath its high altar rest the remains of the small wooden table on which tradition holds Saint Peter himself celebrated Mass.

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be part of our weekend Pew Wiping Team. Volunteers experienced their first weekend of cleaning and sanitizing the pews after the

Masses this past weekend and did a fantastic job! Ideally if we had at least enough people sign up to help after each weekend Mass, each team of 4 - 6 people would serve only one weekend a month.

But, we are not there yet. We still need more volunteers for all of the Masses, especially for after the 10:30am Sunday Mass.

Please consider volunteering for this vital ministry. If you have a student who needs to earn service hours, this is the perfect way for him/her to earn them.

Please read below for more information about the purpose of this ministry.

In order to not only safely sanitize our church spaces but to also preserve and protect the finish on the pews, we have had to change our cleaning methods. Unfortunately, that change in methods comes with a longer time frame and a need for more physical labor - we can't simply fog the pews with the mister; they need to be physically wiped down and dried.

So here's where you come in! We just don't have enough custodians on our payroll to do this, but if we all pitched in, we could make it happen. Just like with our lawn mowing teams and our snow shoveling teams, we need some pew-wiping teams! If you would be willing to help out on a regular or semi-regular basis, please respond to the link below. We'd like to be able to have enough volunteers that everyone could pitch in just one weekend a month.

Once you sign up we will start contacting folks right away to get volunteers assigned to the weekend Masses. You could volunteer to help on Saturdays at 6pm, or on Sunday mornings at 9am or 11:30am – we don't expect anyone to give up their entire weekend, but maybe plan to stay after the Mass you usually attend and help us get it ready for the next group. The work is quite physical though, so if you volunteer, expect to work up a bit of a sweat! Kids are welcome to help as well, but they'd need to be middle school or older and be supervised by a parent or other responsible adult.

We appreciate our parishioners' willingness to help - it will save us a great deal of money if we can staff these roles with volunteers rather than having to hire and pay cleaners. If you have questions, please let us know and we'll get answers for you!

Feast Day of St. Frances Xavier Cabrini November13



Born in Italy in 1850, Frances Xavier Cabrini was the first United States citizen to be canonized. Her deep trust in the loving care of her God gave her the strength to be a valiant woman doing the work of Christ.

In 1880 she came with six sisters to New York City to work with the thousands of Italian immigrants living there.

In 35 years, she founded 67 institutions dedicated to caring for the poor, the abandoned, the uneducated and the sick. Seeing great need among Italian immigrants who were losing their faith, she organized schools and adult education classes. Despite being frightened of water, she traveled across the Atlantic Ocean more than 30 times.

She was canonized on July 7, 1946 and is the Patron Saint of: Hospital Administrators, Immigrants and Impossible Causes.

The purpose of Armistice day was to honor the fallen soldiers of The Great War for their sacrifice and bravery. 7 years later in 1926, Congress adopted a resolution requesting President Coolidge issue annual proclamations on November 11, making Armistice Day a legal holiday.




