From the Pastor's Pen

This year St. Valentine's Day falls on a Sunday. It is a good reminder of the fundamental call of the disciple of Jesus: to love God with all of our heart and to love our neighbor as ourselves. It is also a good way to enter into the week of Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the season of Lent.

You will remember that last year as we entered into the season of Lent we were beginning to experience the effect of COVID. It was a very difficult time for us. We had to suspend the public attendance at Mass, as well as our Lenten devotions. Perhaps COVID helped us to re-think our routines and our priorities. We could no longer take for granted Mass and our usual spiritual practices. We hope that with the beginning of the distribution of the COVID vaccines we will soon have confidence that we can return to "normal."

I don't think we need to be reminded of the purpose and meaning of Lent. It is a time of conversion, a time of spiritual growth, a time when we look at the words and actions of our lives and determine what needs to be changed, ways that may be hurting our practice of the great law of love.

The Church is wise in giving us helps or guidelines for the season of Lent, practices that go back to the earliest days of the Church.

The first is prayer. We pray both personally, which we call devotional prayer, and with the Church, which we call liturgical prayer. In both of these ways we strive to make our prayer sincere, genuine, and more frequent.

The second traditional practice is fasting. Fasting may include many ways of self-denial. When we choose to deprive ourselves of something we enjoy and take for granted, perhaps it strengthens us to say "no" to practices which hurt us spiritually.

The third traditional practice is almsgiving. This practice helps us to grow in a spirit of generosity. We notice people who are hurting. We reach out in a spirit of sharing.

Fr. Mike and I invite you to enter into the spirit of Lent and to take advantage of all the ways the parish offers for your spiritual growth. Know that our prayers are with you.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



I am relatively sure it has not escaped your attention that this Wednesday (February 17th) is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of another Lenten Season. Each year I struggle with developing new catechetical lessons for those journey-

ing toward full initiation in the Catholic faith tradition through the RCIA ministry. I struggle, because most people understand Lent by the simple statements: "What am I giving up for Lent this year" and "I must remember not to eat meat on Fridays." Too often, I believe the real message of Lent, conversion, is lost. For this reason, over the next few weeks I hope to address Lent as "**A Journey for Seekers.**"

There are many passages throughout the Bible which call upon believers to seek the Lord. To mention just three, in 1 Chronicles 16, verse 11 we read "Look to the Lord. . . seek to serve him constantly;" Psalm 25, verse 6, "Such are the people that love the Lord, that seek the face of the God of Jacob;" and in chapter 4 of James (verse 7) we are called to "submit [ourselves] to [seek] God." For me, seeking God is a daily, sometimes hourly call; to freely give myself, and embrace His will even when doing so seems difficult and uncomfortable. Like our catechumens and candidates, I am on a journey, seeking God, trusting that He will guide me even when I feel overwhelmed, and loving humanity enough that I can act in ways that embrace and share the teachings and love of Christ.

In *The Monastery of the Heart*, Joan Chittister shares her poem, "A Seekers Path." She begins "The search for God is a very intimate enterprise. . . the core of every longing in the human-heart. . . the search for ultimate love. . . total belonging. . . [living a] meaningful life." She continues explaining that this search is an attempt to live a worthwhile, fully human life, as we come to see the presence of God even in the shadows and darkness, beyond and in spite of any and all illusions that are so prevalent in our American culture and society today. Seeking God, however, is different for each individual. There are those who feel God's presence in music, literature, and works of art. Others find God's solace in nature, in its diversity, and the infinite cycle of rebirth. Some seek God in the silence of contemplation, reading scripture, adoration, and participation in liturgy within a community. Still others find God in service to the poor, the sick, the imprisoned, the lonely, the aged, those without a voice. Yes, there are even those who seek God in working for justice, instituting governments, laws, and change that serve the common good, rather than selfish interests. This Lent I invite you to join me – refresh your journey as **A God Seeker**.

**Way of the Cross: A Visual Meditation
An on-line Video Presentation
Ash Wednesday (2/17) to Good Friday (4/2)**

Join the Renewal Center staff for a scripture-based meditation on the final hours of Jesus' life as he walks through Jerusalem to Golgotha and his crucifixion.

Traditionally, Christians pray the Way of the Cross as a meditation on the suffering, or passion of Jesus, as an act of reparation or reconciliation in a broken world. Many Christians use the meditation to connect the sufferings of Christ with the suffering of our brothers and sisters at the hands of violence, greed, poverty, sickness and war.

The 14 Stations of the Cross begin with Pontius Pilate condemning Jesus to death and trace events recounted in the scriptures until Jesus is laid in his tomb. The 15th station recalls Jesus' resurrection.

The Renewal Center staff will use scripture, music and images to guide you through a meditative Stations of the Cross.

The video will be on the Renewal Center website beginning Feb. 17, Ash Wednesday, and will be available until Good Friday, April 2.



Ash Wednesday

Hard to believe, but the season of Lent begins this coming Wednesday with Ash Wednesday. This day is so important to the start of Lent and our preparation for the coming Passion of Holy Week and Resurrection of Christ.

The ceremony of Ash Wednesday dates back to at least the 8th century. The ashes that are used each year are made by burning the palms used on Palm Sunday of the previous year and are sprinkled with holy water and fumigated with incense.

In the Old Testament times, ashes were used to express sorrow for sin. This visible sign represented an interior conversion. Lent is a special time when we are to realize that life is passing quickly and we need to focus on turning away from sin and towards God. The ashes remind us that we are mortal beings and it is to dirt that our bodies will return. The ashes not only signify death but victory over death as the ashes that our bodies will become after we die will be re-formed into a resurrected body when Christ comes again in glory. Receiving ashes on Ash Wednesday is a beautiful symbol that when we participate in the glorious resurrection of Christ.

National Salute To Veteran Patients Week

The National Salute To Veteran Patients happens the week of February 14th and pays tribute to just under 100,000 patients a day that receive medical treatment in VA medical facilities as well as the nine million U.S. veterans who get care every year.

According to the Department of Veterans Affairs, this week-long tribute to veteran patients has always been observed the week of Valentine's Day and is intended to: Pay tribute to veterans; Increase community awareness "of the role of the VA medical center"; Encourage visits to hospitalized veterans; To encourage volunteerism with the VA.

The Year of St. Joseph An Obedient Father

As he had done with Mary, God revealed his saving plan to Joseph. He did so by using dreams, which in the Bible and among all ancient peoples, were considered a way for him to make His will known.

Joseph was deeply troubled by Mary’s mysterious pregnancy. He did not want to “expose her to public disgrace”, so he decided to “dismiss her quietly”



In the first dream, an angel helps him resolve his dilemma: “Do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins”. Joseph’s response was immediate: “When he awoke, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him”. Obedience made it possible for him to surmount his difficulties and spare Mary.

In the second dream, the angel tells Joseph: “Get up, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you; for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him”. Joseph did not hesitate to obey. “He got up, took the child and his mother by night, went to Egypt, and remained there until the death of Herod”. In Egypt, Joseph awaited with patient trust the angel’s notice that he could safely return home.

In a third dream, the angel told him that those who sought to kill the child were dead and ordered him to rise, take the child and his mother, and return to the land of Israel. Once again, Joseph obeyed. “He got up, took the child and his mother, and went to the land of Israel”. During the return journey, when Joseph heard that Archelaus was ruling over Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there. After being warned in a dream” – now for the fourth time – “he went away to the district of Galilee. There he made his home in a town called Nazareth”.

In his role as the head of a family, Joseph taught Jesus to be obedient to his parents, in accordance with God’s command. During the hidden years in Nazareth, Jesus learned at the school of Joseph to do the will of the Father. That will was to be his daily food. Even at the most difficult moment of his life, in Gethsemane, Jesus chose to do the Father’s will rather than his own, becoming “obedient unto death, even death on a cross”. The author of the Letter to the Hebrews thus concludes that Jesus “learned obedience through what he suffered”.

All this makes it clear that “Saint Joseph was called by God to serve the person and mission of Jesus directly through the exercise of his fatherhood” and that in this way, “he cooperated in the great mystery of salvation and is truly a minister of salvation.”
