



#### From the Pastor's Pen

March has traditionally been known as the "Month of St. Joseph," probably because we celebrate his feast day on March 19, just two days after the feast of the very popular St. Patrick. In December Pope Francis issued an apostolic letter in which he declared that 2021 would be celebrated as the "Year of St. Joseph," extending from December 8, 2020 to December 8, 2021. This year was chosen because it is the 150th anniversary of the naming of St. Joseph as the Patron of the Universal Church. In his declaration, Pope Francis said of St. Joseph: "He was a beloved father, a tender and loving father, an obedient father, an accepting father, a father who is creatively courageous, a working father, a father in the shadows." The declaration is especially meaningful to us because our diocese has the name: Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph. We have the city of St. Joseph with its cathedral named after St. Joseph. Many Catholic churches in our world are named for St. Joseph. Pope John Paul added his name in the Eucharistic Prayer of the Mass. He is well-known and well-beloved.

We could hardly enter into this week without some recognition of Saint Patrick. We all know about his life. He was born in either Scotland or England (there is some debate). When he was 16, some Irish marauders captured him and took him to Ireland. During his captivity, he had much time to think about his life and his future. He was determined that one day he would be a priest and a missionary to Ireland. After escaping, he went to France, studied for the priesthood, was ordained and, true to his dreams, return to Ireland. He was a zealous missionary, winning many to the faith, organizing the Church, and persevering in spite of opposition and set-backs. He used the shamrock to teach about the Trinity, which became a symbol of the Irish people. Over the centuries, the Catholic faith of the Irish has had a strong influence on the Church, especially here in our country. We salute good St. Patrick.

But our main work now is the work of Lent, persevering in our Lenten efforts to grow stronger and more committed to our faith. In only four weeks we will be celebrating Easter. We ask the Lord to purify the Church through our prayers and good example.

May God bless you. My prayers are with you.

## Someone is Watching and Wondering



This week our Lenten Retreat / Reflection, "A Journey for Seekers" focuses on the third pillar of lent, Almsgiving. I think for most of us giving alms is rather straight forward; we give money, we donate goods, we serve at a food kitchen or shelter, and perhaps

we work to change systems and fight for social justice which reaches all humankind. Each of these actions is worthy and necessary in our culture and world today, however, are we truly giving of ourselves in service as Jesus commanded; do we know or form relationships with the poor?

The above representation is a painting by Alpini Gionatan and was featured in an article George Moore – Alms Giving written by George Moore and found in "Inkrocki Magazine of Culture and Cinema." I found both the article and painting challenging to my perception and participation in alms giving. In the article and painting, the giver and receiver form a mutual relationship, a coming together to listen, share, and develop a new understanding of the other. In retrospect, I do not feel that when I have given alms I formed a relationship with the recipient, or even developed an understanding of his/her existence, except perhaps a sense of pity. My understanding has been one way; what I do for them, not what they do for me. True my motive seemed pure, "Jesus tells me to care for the poor," and my giving seemed to exempt me from any further contact. I felt no empathy or similarity with the recipient(s); I took no time to understand, share their feelings, or recognize our similarities.

Many years ago I accompanied a group of high school students on a mission trip to Mexico. The purpose of the trip was to build a house for a family living in a colonia a short distance from the border with El Paseo, Texas. I was eager and excited to "help those poor people." To put it mildly, my experience was shocking. I had never witnessed such poverty and squalid living conditions, nor observed so many children with distended, swollen abdomens resulting from poor nutrition and parasitic infection. I believed I needed to convince these people that this was no way to live. I was blind to their needs. The families I meet provided generous hospitality to, and welcomed us to share meals and stories. Their expressed needs were simple, clean water and safety. We attended church with them (along with chickens and dogs) standing shoulder to shoulder praying and worshiping Jesus. They fed me physically, emotionally and spiritually. I left with a sense of shared humanity, and knowledge that serving required listening and supporting their needs, not mine. For me. almsgiving is first about relationships and shared humanity. How do you develop relationships with those in need?

# The Devotion of the Seven Sorrows of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Recitation of the Seven Sorrows Rosary Friday, March 26 - 4:30pm in the Church



Devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows became a standard devotion in the Church around the 14th century. It was revealed to St. Bridget of Sweden (1303-1373) that devo-

tion to the Blessed Virgin Mary's Seven Sorrows would bring great signal graces. The devotion consists in praying seven Hail Mary's while meditating on the Seven Sorrows of Mary.

Mary, in a unique way, willingly suffered alongside her Divine Son as he gave his life to save the world, and she felt the bitterness of his passion as only a mother can. Our Lady's Sorrows are commemorated on the liturgical calendar twice a year - the Friday before Palm Sunday and September 15.

All are invited to participate on Friday, March 26.

#### St. Patrick Feast Day - March 17

There are many legends and stories about St. Patrick. Perhaps the most well known is the legend that he drove all of the snakes out of Ireland. However, all evidence suggests that post-glacial Ireland never had snakes.

In his early teens he was captured by Irish raiders in his birth-country of Scotland and taken to Ireland as a slave to tend sheep. During his captivity, he turned to God in prayer. Patrick's captivity



lasted until he was twenty, when he escaped after having a dream from God in which he was told to leave Ireland by going to the coast. There he found sailors who took him back to Britain. He had another dream in which the people of Ireland were calling out to him "We beg you, holy youth, to come and walk among us once more."

He studied for the priesthood and was ordained. Later, he was ordained a bishop, and returned back to Ireland to establish the church. Though the task was difficult and dangerous, he persisted and was able to build a strong foundation for Christianity. The Irish people were very receptive to his teachings especially since that he was able to take several of their Celtic symbols and Christianize them. The most prominent of these is the green shamrock. He used this plant, which was held sacred by the Druids, as a symbol of the Trinity.

Patrick preached and converted all of Ireland for 40 years, working many miracles and writing of his love for God in Confessions. After years of living in poverty, traveling and enduring much suffering he died March 17, 461. Patrick was a humble, pious, gentle man, who had total devotion to and trust in God. He feared nothing, not even death, so complete was his trust in God, and of the importance of his mission.

#### St. Joseph Feast Day - March 19

#### The Year of St. Joseph A Working Father

Saint Joseph was a carpenter who earned an honest living to provide for his family. From him, Jesus learned the value, the dignity and the joy of what it means to eat bread that is the fruit of one's own labor. In our own day, when employment has once more become a burning social issue, and un-employment at times reaches record levels even in nations that for decades



have enjoyed a certain degree of prosperity, there is a renewed need to appreciate the importance of dignified work, of which Saint Joseph is an exemplary patron.

Work is a means of participating in the work of salvation, an opportunity to hasten the coming of the Kingdom, to develop our talents and abilities, and to put them at the service of society and fraternal communion. It becomes an opportunity for the fulfillment not only of oneself, but also of that primary cell of society which is the family.

A family without work is particularly vulnerable to difficulties, tensions, es-trangement and even breakup. How can we speak of human dignity without working to ensure that everyone is able to earn a decent living?

Working persons, whatever their job may be, are cooperating with God himself, and in some way become creators of the world around us.

The crisis of our time, which is economic, social, cultural and spiritual, can serve as a summons for all of us to rediscover the value, the importance and necessity of work for bringing about a new "normal" from which no one is excluded.

Saint Joseph's work reminds us that God himself, in becoming man, did not disdain work. The loss of employment that affects so many of our brothers and sisters, and has increased as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic, should serve as a summons to review our priorities.

Let us implore Saint Joseph the Worker to help us find ways to express our firm conviction that no young person, no person at all, no family should be without work!





It never fails. On the fourth Sunday of Lent someone always asks "why are the vestments pink, not purple today?

The answer is that the Fourth Sunday of Lent is known as "Laetare Sunday." The day's theme comes from the entrance antiphon reflecting on Isaiah 66:10-11: "Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exalt and be satisfied at her consoling breast."

Laetare is the first word – meaning "rejoice" – in the Latin text. On Laetare Sunday (as similarly with the Third Sunday of Advent's Gaudete Sunday) the Church expresses hope and joy in the midst of our Lenten fasts and penances. Call it pink – or, more fittingly, rose – this change in color indicates a glimpse of the joy that awaits us at Easter, just before we enter into the somber days of Passiontide.

Laetare Sunday is the Church's way of giving us a "shot in the arm" as we approach the darkness and horror of the days through Good Friday and Holy Saturday. It's an opportunity to savor and keep in the back of our minds what awaits us on Easter Sunday – the reality that Jesus Christ is risen from the dead, and that our hearts will always be filled with joy!

Being aware of traditions and customs assists us in celebrating the beauty of our faith. As you can see, there is much associated with even a nondescript day like the Fourth Sunday of Lent – not to mention the rest of the season, or the 50 days of Easter and beyond. Take advantage of the richness of our Catholic traditions.


