

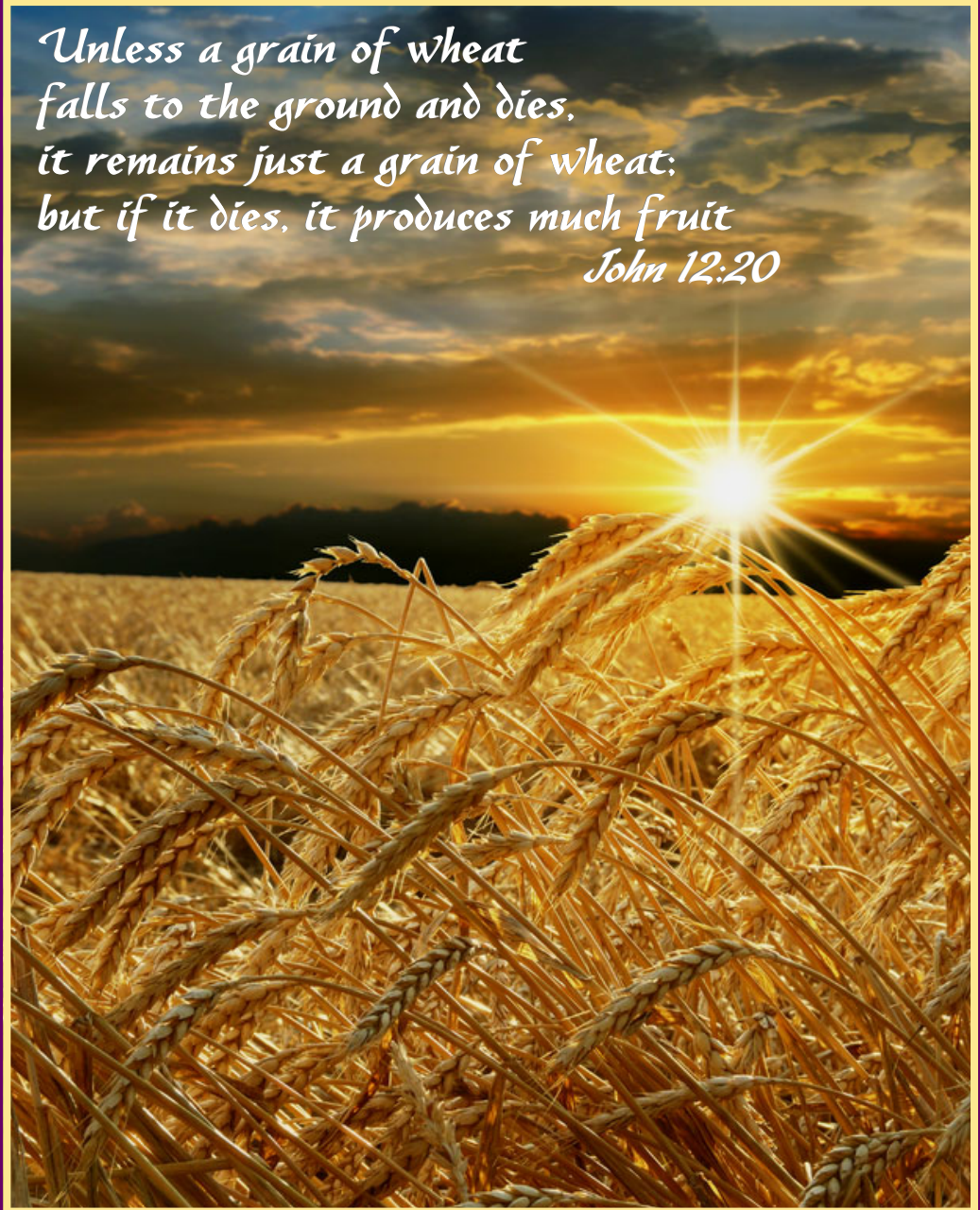

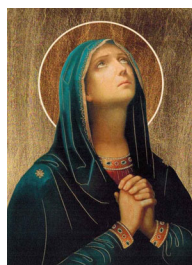

The Devotion of the Seven Sorrows of the Blessed Virgin Mary

*Recitation of the Seven Sorrows Rosary
 Friday, March 26 - 4:30pm in the Church*



Devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows became a standard devotion in the Church around the 14th century. It was revealed to St. Bridget of Sweden (1303-1373) that devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary's Seven Sorrows would bring great signal graces.

The devotion consists in praying seven Hail Mary's while meditating on the Seven Sorrows of Mary.

Mary, in a unique way, willingly suffered alongside her Divine Son as he gave his life to save the world, and she felt the bitterness of his passion as only a mother can. Our Lady's Sorrows are commemorated on the liturgical calendar twice a year - the Friday before Palm Sunday and September 15.

From the Pastor's Pen

Time seems to be flying by! Ten days ago on March 11, we passed the mid-point of the Lenten season. And Easter Sunday is just two weeks away. Next weekend we begin the most important week of the Church year when we commemorate the last days of Jesus' life. We will recall the entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem with crowds welcoming him with palms. Then as we begin the Sacred Triduum, the last three days of Jesus' life, we re-enact the Paschal Mystery, the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Christ.

We are most grateful we can gather together during Holy Week and Easter, since last year we were under lockdown. Our celebrations will look different, because of the COVID restrictions, but we will be celebrating these sacred days of our faith as a community.

Our Holy Week and Easter Sunday schedules are featured on page 5 of this Bulletin. You are welcome to join us on Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday at 7pm each evening.

On Easter Sunday, we are celebrating Masses at 7:30, 9:30 and 11:30am. We want to offer a third Mass on Easter morning, so that hopefully we can safely accommodate everyone, since we will NOT be celebrating the 5pm Mass on Easter evening.

Next Saturday evening we will welcome into our community four individuals who have already been baptized. They will profess their Faith in the Catholic Church as they are confirmed and receive the Eucharist. Then, at the Easter Vigil on April 3, we will be welcoming six adults into our faith as they receive the Sacraments of Initiation - Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. These newly baptized and confirmed are New Life for our community.

Following Easter, we will be celebrating First Communion with our young children and their families at special Masses.

So, it's very exciting to be celebrating all these sacraments in the Easter season.

We congratulate the Liberty Blue Jays Basketball Team who are playing in the State Tournament this weekend. We are so proud of them and wish them the best!

May you and your families continue to know God's amazing grace as we continue our journey to Holy Week and Easter.

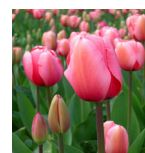

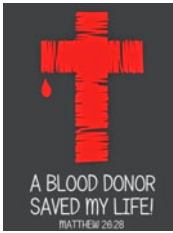

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY IS APRIL 11



Divine Mercy Sunday is the Sunday after Easter. Our Lord asked Saint Faustina to pray and work towards establishing a Feast of Divine Mercy on that day.

When Pope John Paul II canonized Sister Faustina (making her Saint Faustina), he also, on the same day, surprised the entire world by establishing Divine Mercy Sunday as a feast day for the entire Church.

He set aside this day as a day of forgiveness of sin and punishment due to sin (with sacramental confession 20 days before or after and receiving Holy Communion).

He even prayed the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, the prayer that Jesus gave her, at the saint's tomb. Given all these connections between St. Faustina and Divine Mercy, is it any wonder that Pope John Paul II died on the Vigil of Divine Mercy Sunday (the evening before the feast day), which fell that year on April 3, 2005 and was canonized St. John Paul II on the Feast of Divine Mercy 2014.

Our Divine Mercy celebration will be April 11, with Eucharistic Adoration from 2:00-3:30pm, including opportunities for Confession, private devotion, and praying and singing of the Divine Mercy Chaplet and Benediction.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



This week's Lenten Retreat/Reflection, “**A Journey for Seekers**” is focused on **repentance and reconciliation**. This is not a reflection on the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and not intended to minimize its importance. Today's focus is instead on the need for repentance and reconciliation in our day to day living as

we prepare to receive Christ anew this Easter.

Jesus teaches “if you bring your gift to the altar, and there recall that your brother has anything against you, leave your gift. . . go first and be reconciled with your brother, and then come and offer your gift” (Matthew 5:23-24). In fidelity to this teaching I think we must consider two things: 1. what change is needed in me and my life, and 2. who is my brother/sister?

The word reconcile in this passage is a translation of the Greek *metanoiete*. This word is based on two words, *meta* (beyond) and *nous* (mind or spirit). In other words Jesus is telling us to go beyond our current understanding, to change our hearts and minds not simply our sinful actions. Jesus is suggesting a change in behavior at the fundamental level of our being. Jesus wants us to change our perceptions, our sense of reality, and the way we interpret actions and interactions with others. For Jesus *metanoia* is essential; a transformation of ourselves, a complete change of heart before we can receive Him.

So who are our brothers and sisters? In truth, every other human, all God's sons and daughters. We are called to know and embrace God's universal love. We realize that God does not take sides or carry a nation's flag. We as Catholics have no priority on God alone. We understand that the God we seek is the God of our world. In seeking God, therefore, we must develop hearts and minds as big as the universe itself. Differences such as race, gender, religion, culture, and economic state are inconsequential. God's truths are found throughout creation. As reconciling people we are commanded to stand against all that denies God's truth, love, and mercy. We are called beyond the boundaries we have created that separate us into my people and theirs. We are called to a profound transformation of body, mind, and heart. We are called to trust, to “put on Christ” each and every day. Our liturgy and worship is not meant to be a spiritual spa designed to make us feel good; it is not intended to assure us of our own value or enfold us in self-righteousness; it is not meant to be focused on us. Our worship is always directed to the universal God of all creation. I, therefore, suggest that our brothers and sisters includes all our actions and interactions with humanity in all its diversity. Our need for reconciliation is not narrowly defined. Rather the reconciliation of which Jesus speaks is universal. **How can you seek universal repentance and reconciliation?**

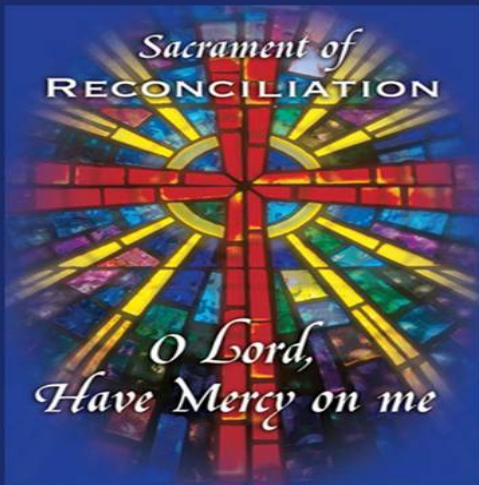

Make An Act Of Perfect Contrition

If unable to get to Confession: make an act of Perfect Contrition, which requires:

- The love of God
- The sincere desire for forgiveness
- The ardent commitment to receive the sacrament of reconciliation when available.

There is no set formula for making an act of contrition, but a common one reads as follows: *"My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against You, whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with Your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin."*

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church (1452): *When it arises from a love by which God is loved above all else, contrition is called "perfect" (contrition of charity). Such contrition remits venial sins; it also obtains forgiveness of mortal sins if it includes the firm resolution to have recourse to sacramental confession as soon as possible.*

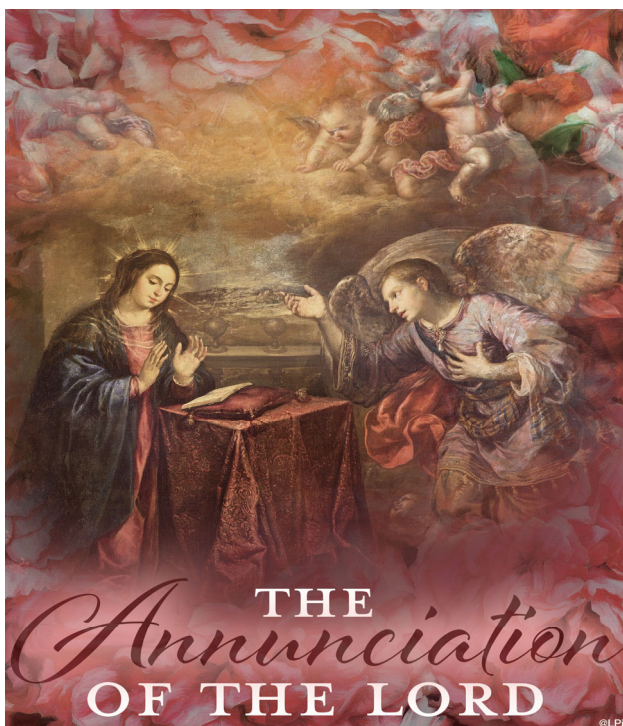

The Annunciation of the Lord ~ March 25



God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him . . . might have eternal life.

At the Annunciation, God revealed this good news to Mary. She was the first to hear and to believe that God would do what he promised. Her faith told her that nothing is impossible for God. Mary also heard God's invitation calling her to be the Virgin Mother of his Son.

This call meant that Jesus would be formed in her womb, and she, as his mother, would nourish and care for him. This call meant that she had a special place in God's plan for salvation. Mary agreed to God's plan because she wanted what God wanted. She was willing to accept all the joy and pain, all the unexpected events. She was willing to bring Christ to a waiting world.

O Holy Virgin Mary, we ask your intercession to make us as generous as you in accepting the will of God in our lives, especially when that will is expressed in mysterious ways.

Chrism Mass At The Cathedral March 25 ~ 2:00pm



Every year at the Chrism Mass, the Bishop blesses the three oils that will be used in the parishes for the next year. The oils from the previous Chrism Mass are used in the Easter Fire at the Easter Vigil.

The three oils are the Oil of Catechumens, Oil of the Sick and the Sacred Chrism.

- **Oil of Catechumens** is used to anoint those preparing for the Rite of Baptism. Children are anointed on the breast bone.

- **Oil of the Sick** is used in the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, to anoint anyone that needs to be strengthened for an upcoming surgery, beginning of an illness or becoming more frail due to age.

- **Sacred Chrism** the only one that has an aroma, is used in Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Orders as an anointing with the Holy Spirit. At the Chrism Mass the Bishop breathes the Holy Spirit into the oil.

This year only priests may attend the Chrism Mass in person this year due to the pandemic.

The celebration at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception on Thursday, March 25, begins at 2 pm. It will live-streamed from the cathedral's Facebook page, <https://www.facebook.com/golddomekc>.
