From the Pastor's Pen

If we read the letters of St. Paul in the New Testament, we find a very busy St. Paul and his fellow missionaries going from place to place, preaching the good news. However, it wasn't enough just to preach, to win believers, and then go to the next place. It was necessary to establish a structure so that the proclamation of the word and the celebration of the Eucharist would continue. That structure took place as Paul organized a body of leadership. Some of the letters mention bishops, presbyters (priests) and deacons who were entrusted to preach the gospel, provide worship, and take care of practical issues.

In the gospel reading this weekend Jesus calls himself a "good shepherd." The people of his time would know the value of a good shepherd: tending to the sheep, providing food and drink, seeking out the ones who strayed or were lost, binding up the wounds of those who were wounded. In the same manner, Jesus identifies himself with that shepherding work. Each sheep (person) was important and was deserving of his loving care. Jesus intended that his beloved apostles and their successors hear these words and make good shepherding their own desire and work.

So from the very beginning of the Christian era it was understood that leaders were needed for the Church who would act in the manner of a good shepherd. If you read the history of the Church you will see how that leadership developed over the centuries: the pope, the bishops, the priests, the deacons, men and women religious, and dedicated laity. Given the weakness of human nature, it is also true that sometimes these leaders did not act in the manner of a good shepherd. They hurt the Church by scandal and bad example.

Nevertheless, the Church continues to rely on strong and faithful shepherds who will continue the work of Christ. This 4th Sunday of Easter has traditionally been called "Good Shepherd Sunday" because the gospel reading is always about Christ and his role of shepherding. All the people of the Church have been asked to pray for good shepherds today. It is obvious that, at least in the Northern Hemisphere the number of vocations to the priesthood and religious life has been shrinking. So today I ask you to join the Church in prayer for the gift of an increase of vocations to the ministry of leadership.

Finally, I want to salute Fr. Mike Roach, our pastor, who is celebrating the 40th anniversary of his ordination to the priesthood. He truly is a good shepherd who acts with great love and care for his flock, the parish and this community. Hold him in your prayers today.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



During the Easter Season we hear gospel accounts of Jesus appearing to the disciples following His resurrection. One passage which always touches me is the

account of Jesus meeting two disciples on the road to Emmaus found in the 24th Chapter of Luke's gospel. I can personally relate to these two disciples, so caught up in their grief, preconceptions of the reality of the crucifixion, and lacking in understanding to Jesus' teachings. They are unable to see what is present because they are so focused on the recent events which did not fulfill their expectations of the Messiah. I can definitely understand these two disciples, knowing that there are times when I fail to see and comprehend what is presently before me. I too dwell in past events, trying to understand and frequently asking why such and such happened. Why have past events failed to confirm my plans and expectations? Where is God when tragic events unfold? I admit, I feel alone, frustrated and discouraged. The words of the disciples "but we had hoped that he was the one to redeem Israel," so often echo my thoughts – "but I thought it would be different, this isn't what I expected, I feel let down." Jesus' reply also strikes at my heart: "Oh, how foolish you are, and how slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have declared. Was it not necessary that the Messiah should suffer these things and then enter into His glory?" How easy to forget that God's grace doesn't prevent evil human actions and sin. How difficult to remember that God's grace and love enters our lives, through tragedy and darkness so that we too might see His glory. Even when Jesus spoke and taught, these disciples did not understand. Like the disciples, reading Jesus' words do not always provide me a clearer understanding. Only in the breaking of bread were their eyes opened. I confess, Jesus never fails to make His presence known to me in the sharing of His body and blood at communion. The Eucharistic sacrament is like a jolt of light or a shot in the arm. When I receive Him, my eyes are open, I feel His grace, and I am humbled. I know I am not alone and that all things are possible with Christ in my life. As I go from one life experience to another I may be unmindful of Jesus' presence, until I pay attention. At that moment of crystal clarity all my previous experiences make sense. The key is awareness. The key is recognizing when my heart is burning within, because He is there. The key is recognizing Jesus in my ordinary, blessed, daily life so that I may truly give thanks and praise at the Eucharistic celebration. The key is recognizing Jesus' care and compassion in friends, relatives, and even strangers when they minister to myself and others in need. The key is letting go of myself and letting God be God. True freedom is found through God.



Liberty man to be ordained

Michael Roach, son of Mr. and Mrs. William Roach of Liberty, will be ordained to the Roman Catholic Priesthood in the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, Kansas City, Saturday, April 25, by Bishop John Sullivan, D.D.

One of nine children, he was born and raised in Glenaire and attended St. James grade school in Liberty graduating from there in 1967. He graduated from St. Pius X High

School in 1971.

Roach attended Maple Woods Community College, Southwest Missouri State University, and received his bachelor of arts degree, from Conception Seminary College in 1977. The last four years he has attended Kenrick Theological Seminary in St. Louis

where he obtained a Master of Divinity degree.

On Sunday, April 26, he will celebrate his first Mass of Thanksgiving in the new St. James Catholic Church at 309 Stewart Rd.

and others in attendance at the cathedral, made his solemn promises before God and was ordained a priest in our diocese by Bishop John Sullivan.

Eight years later, that dream was fulfilled when our new church was dedicated by Bishop James Johnston on October 19, 1919.

The next day, Sunday, April 26, 1981, he said his first Mass at what was then the new St. James Church, just three weeks after its dedication. St. James is the parish where he grew up with his parents and eight siblings - a very loving and devout family, about whom he often speaks during his homilies.

His journey to the priesthood included a time of discernment and years of education. He attended St. James School (his parents were instrumental in the founding of the original school on Water St). He went to St. Pius X High School, graduating in 1971, Maple Woods Community College, SW Missouri State University, graduating from Conception Seminary Collage in 1977. Following that he attended Kenrick Theological Seminary in St. Louis where he received his Master of Divinity degree.


His first parish was at the Cathedral of St. Joseph, followed by assignments to St. Therese, Risen Christ Church (now St. Monica), St. Patrick, and again to St. Therese for 13 years.

When Fr. Mike came to St. James in 2011 he was pleased to see parishioners who attended his ordination 30 years previously, including Lorraine Hilts, Mary Weishaar, and Joe and Eileen Barry.

From his arrival here, he had a dream and vision of building a new church that would meet the growing needs of our parish for future generations.

In an article "New Priests Reflect on Discovering Their Vocations" published in the May 3, 1981 issue of the *Catholic Key*, our former diocesan newspaper, Fr. Mike said "Before I entered seminary I saw the Church as a building on a certain street - run by the priests, where the people went to for Mass or the sacraments".

"Now I see the Church as the "People of God" - a people who are bound together by a belief, trust and hope in God - all working together to build a better parish, and thus a better world. The Church is not the hierachy, the Church is the People!"

Fr. Mike makes his long ago vision of the Church come alive every day at St. James.



Saint Catherine of Siena Feast Day ~ May 29



St. Catherine ranks high among the mystics and spiritual writers of the Church. She established a monastery for women in 1377 outside of Siena, Italy. She is credited with composing over 400 letters, her Dialogue, which is her definitive work. These works are so influential that St. Catherine would later be declared a Doctor of the Church. She is one of the most influential and popular saints in the Church. Pope Pius II, canonized Catherine on 29 June 1461. On 4 October 1970, Pope Paul VI named her a Doctor of the Church


