

#### From the Pastor's Pen

In our country, during the course of the year, days are set aside to honor categories of people: Presidents Day, Veterans Day, First Responders Day, Memorial Day, Grandparents Day, Father's Day.

But the day that seems to be more special than others is Mother's Day, a day we are celebrating this weekend. Almost all people have a special affection for their mothers. The bond began when our mother carried us in her womb, suffered the discomfort of childbirth, and got up in the night to hold us and feed us. As we were growing up, our mothers taught us our first words, sent us off to school, provided our clothing, corrected us, taught us values, and, above all, passed on the heritage of faith. So it is right that we honor our mother today, thank her, give her a gift, and tell her of our love.

In my case, I can only say that my mother was a treasure. She was a stay-at-home mom, taking care of seven children. We lived a simple life. She cooked, cleaned, washed clothes, sent us off to school, helped us with homework, corrected us in a loving way. She taught by good example, always finding time to be there when we needed her. She was a loving spouse, always there for my dad, a helpmate and friend. Above all, she was a woman of very strong faith, loving her Catholic Church, teaching catechism, volunteering as a parish organist and choir director, leading the family in prayer, and passing on the value of faith to her children. For some reason that we cannot understand, at the young age of 53 she contracted a brain tumor, which was diagnosed as malignant. She left us grieving and missing her so much. I guess God couldn't wait to give her a great reward.

When Jesus taught his disciples to pray, he addressed God as "Father". We might wonder of we could not just as well address and pray to God as "Mother." There are images of God in the Scripture which are feminine. For example, God is pictured as a mother hen, gathering her chicks under her wings. I don't think we are unfaithful to the Word of God if we pray to God as a loving and caring Mother, especially as we embrace the image of God in our other mother.

Today, honor your mother, whether deceased or living, with thanksgiving for the great gift that she is or has been to you.

#### Someone is Watching and Wondering



I recently read a daily meditation by Pope Francis in which he addressed our relationship with Jesus as personal and unique. He stated "How beautiful and consoling it is to know that Jesus knows us one by one,

that we are not unknown to Him, that our name is known to Him. . . We are unique individuals, each with his or her own story. He knows us with our own story, each with his or her own value, both because they have been created and have been redeemed by Christ. Each of us can say: Jesus knows me. . .only He knows what is in our hearts, our intentions, our most hidden feelings. Jesus knows our strengths and our defects, and is always ready to care for us, to heal the wounds of our errors with the abundance of His mercy." In a previous meditation the Pope suggested that our relationship with Jesus is not about doctrine, following rules, or setting ourselves apart from others. Rather he stated that faith originates in our falling in love with God, surrendering our entire being into His loving care and trusting that His grace and mercy are always present and freely given; God is love.

I apologize to each of you if my recent writing has seemed dark, leaving the impression that something was wrong in my life. Although I have experienced feelings of loneliness and loss during the past year (as I am sure many of you have felt), I have also felt a great sense of belonging and love. As I spent more time in my home with my grandson Michael as sole companion, and less time rushing through errands and being with others, I rediscovered God's constant presence, love, and care. Going through my own feelings of darkness and gloom, His light was my constant guide. I found more time to read scripture, a great variety of books, and to simply sit quietly surrounded by His love and grace. Throughout this past year I admit I have struggled with the pain of aging. While I do not think of myself as old, a quick look in the mirror or the effects of arthritis tell me a different story. Aging has forced me to slow down and take breaks. which tends to go against my nature of always being active. I also find myself wondering "What's next? What is God calling me to do?" I realize I cannot maintain the same pace at I did in my 20's and 30's. In prayer, I continue to seek direction and guidance. Like every other human who has ever lived, quoting Fr. Mike, "I do not what the future holds but I know who holds my future." I know I am loved by God. I am unique and through my uniqueness He will enlighten the road on which to continue my journey. I can truthfully embrace the Pope's beautiful words: "How beautiful and consoling it is to know that Jesus knows" me, better than I know myself. I pray that each of you also find comfort in these words.


## Stewardship of Treasure



Looking forward, we hope to replace several of our old HVAC systems this summer. The majority of the units on our campus, are 20+ years old and we have been "band-aiding" them to keep them going. This should also improve our utility bills as newer units tend to be more energy efficient.

### Our Lady of Fatima May 13

104th Anniversary of Blessed Mother's 1st Apparition at Fatima

# We can manifest our love and devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary in her month of May by saying the Rosary daily.

On May 13, 1917 in the small village of Fatima in Portugal, Our Lady appeared to threes shepherd children – Lucia, Jacinta and Francisco. She appeared six times between May 13, 1917 and October 13, 1917. In each and every apparition Our Lady insisted upon the praying of the most Holy Rosary.

On July 13, she said "Pray the Rosary every day in honor of Our Lady of the Rosary to obtain peace in the world . . . for she alone can save it."

By virtue of its meditative character, with the tranquil succession of Hail Marys, the Rosary has a peaceful effect on those who pray it. The Rosary is also a prayer for peace because of the fruits of charity which it produces. When prayed well in a truly meditative way, the Rosary leads to an encounter with Christ in his mysteries and so cannot fail to draw attention to the face of Christ in others, especially in the most afflicted

In a word, by focusing our eyes on Christ, the Rosary also makes us peacemakers in the world. By its nature as an insistent choral petition in harmony with Christ's invitation to "pray ceaselessly" (Lk 18:1), the Rosary allows us to hope that, even today, the difficult "battle" for peace can be won. Far from offering an escape from the problems of the world, the Rosary obliges us to see them with responsible and generous eyes, and obtains for us the strength to face them with the certainty of God's help and the firm intention of bearing witness in every situation to "love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony" (Col 3:14).

During her apparition on June 13, 1917, she said, "When you pray the Rosary, say this prayer after each mystery. We refer to this as the Fatima Prayer.

O Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell, lead all souls to Heaven, especially those who have most need of your mercy.

#### St. Damien of Molokai Feast Day May 10



St. Damien of Molokai, also called Father Damien, was a Belgian priest who devoted his life to missionary work among the Hawaiian lepers.

Born in Belgium in 1840, he joined the Society of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary in 1858 and went as a mis-

sionary to the Sandwich (Hawaiian) Islands in 1863. He reached Honolulu in 1864 and was ordained a priest the same year.

Moved by the miserable condition of the lepers whom the Hawaiian government had deported to Kalaupapa on the island of Molokai, he volunteered to take charge of the settlement. He served as both pastor and physician to the colony and undertook many projects to better the conditions there. He improved water and food supplies and housing and founded two orphanages, receiving help from other priests for only 6 of his 16 years on Molokai.

In 1884 he contracted leprosy, refused to leave for treatment and died in 1889.

He was beautified by Pope John Paul II in 1995 and canonized by Pope Benedict XVI in 2009.


If you see someone in need here on our St. James campus on the weekend, encourage them to come to the Parish Office on Monday.

#### **How Mother's Day Became A National Holiday**

Mother's Day was first celebrated in 1908, when Anna Jarvis held a memorial for her mother at St Andrew's Methodist Church in Grafton, West Virginia. Her campaign to make Mother's Day a recognized holiday in the United States began in 1905, the year her mother. Ann Reeves Jarvis, died. Anna Jarvis wanted to honor her mother by continuing the work she started and to set aside a day to honor all mothers because she believed a mother is "the person who has done more for you than anyone in the world."

In 1908, Congress rejected a proposal to make Mother's Day an official holiday, joking that they would also have to proclaim a "Mother-in-law's Day". In 1914, Woodrow Wilson signed a proclamation designating Mother's Day, held on the second Sunday in May, as a national holiday to honor mothers.
