Seating Changes When Attending Weekend Masses



In an effort to accommodate our growing numbers at Mass, while also keeping everyone feeling safe and comfortable, we have opened every pew in the sections on the right hand

side of the center aisle (the side with the St Joseph statue at the front).

We will maintain an every-other-pew-open on the sections on the left side of the center aisle (the Mary side) for now. This arrangement will allow for more seating and yet still leave more space for those who would feel more comfortable with this option.

Masks are still required throughout the facility at all times, and we ask that – even on the fully open side – you do your best to maintain a six foot distance between your family and other families. Try to make sure that where you are sitting is staggered, and that you are not sitting directly behind another family, if at all possible.

We will continue to live-stream our 8 AM Mass and other feast days and important events at St. James

From the Pastor's Pen

Situations may come up on our lives when we don't know how to act or respond. We consider all the possibilities. We think about the consequences of our decisions. We may reach out to others for advice. Maybe what we need most is divine inspiration. As people of faith, we believe that the Holy Spirit comes to our aid with that inspiration and guidance. Today, as we celebrate the feast of Pentecost, we are reminded that the Spirit of God is the gift that we need in our daily decisions.

On this Pentecost Sunday, we recall the event in the earliest days of the Church which gave the disciples assurance in their ministry. Remember that the apostles were gathered somewhere in Jerusalem, bewildered by the appearance of the risen Lord and unsure of the instruction of Jesus to go and proclaim the good news to all the nations. In some mysterious way, the Holy Spirit came upon them in the symbols of wind and fire. As the wind blows and has power but cannot be seen, so the Spirit of God gives the apostles power and strength for ministry. As the fire illumines and shines, so the apostles are guided and shown the way. They go forth from that room of hiding to the ministry of proclaiming boldly the Risen Lord and call to holiness.

Recently, our parish family of St. James celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation with our high school students. Bishop Johnston, representing the universal Church family, laid hands on the head of these candidates and anointed them with the oil of Sacred Chrism. It was very inspiring to see these young people making the decision to be Confirmed and accepting the call to be strong and faithful witnesses to their Catholic faith. Most of us who are older also celebrated Confirmation, maybe many years ago. But the Holy Spirit comes not just for the moment of anointing but for a lifetime. No matter what age or state of life, we continue to answer the call to be witnesses to the presence of Christ among us.

Perhaps this annual celebration of Pentecost is a golden opportunity to remember that the power of the Spirit is with us always and everywhere, giving us knowledge, courage, and conviction in living our faith. Each morning we might take just a minute to invite the Spirit of God to come to us during the day so that everything we do might give witness to the values of our faith and asking the Risen Lord to use us as His instruments in proclaiming the good news. Ask the Spirit of God for guidance, especially in making difficult decisions.

Know that my prayers are with you each day. Fr. Michael

Someone is Watching and Wondering



There are many symbols and descriptive phrases Christians use to describe our faith and especially to describe the trinity. For most of us it is easy to picture in our mind images for the father and son. When it comes to the Holy Spirit, however, the most common image is a dove, tongues

of flames and gusting wind. In thinking about encountering the Holy Spirit, perhaps you remember the words spoken at your confirmation: "Be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit." Today I suggest another, perhaps a little known symbol of our faith, the Phoenix. To my somewhat unusual way of thinking about my faith, the Phoenix is not simply a symbol for our faith but rather a reminder of the coming of the Holy Spirit into my life, not just as a one time Pentecostal or confirmation event but rather as a reawakening / reopening to the Spirit each and every day.

In ancient Chinese (the *Fenghuang*), Greek, Roman, and Egyptian literature there can be found stories of a mythological bird, the Phoenix. This creature is described as large, like an eagle or swan, with plumage of red and gold and penetrating, sharply focused eyes. A very beautiful, if somewhat frightening bird, yet its uniqueness is not found in its physical appearance. Rather, the most outstanding characteristic of the Phoenix comes from the fact that not only does the bird die by bursting into flames leaving only a pile of ashes, but it rises from the ashes into new life. (Sounds like our journey from the ashes we receive at the beginning of Lent to our celebration of resurrection and new life during the Easter season.) The many stories from different traditions of the Phoenix have this commonality of resurrection from the ashes. More recently, J. K. Rowling used the Phoenix in her book *Harry Potter and the Chamber of Secrets* to teach young Harry a valuable lesson: death, suffering, sorrow, and tears can give rise to new life, healing, and joy.

As Christians, new life means recognizing and embracing our full humanity as daughters and sons of God; dying to our old ways and awakening to new life in Christ. Every day as part of my on-going prayer, I ask God to help me discover a new, richer awareness of the Holy Spirit. I know the Spirit has been with me from the beginning of my existence, yet I continue to seek God's loving guidance to let go, to die from my old self and rise with Christ in a new life of shared *agape*. Personally I feel God's love in awareness to the gift of creation, from the beginning to the fullness of our humanity in Christ Jesus. For me, receiving the Spirit is a daily Pentecost, a resurrection from ashes to life, a letting go of pain and re-opening to God's love.

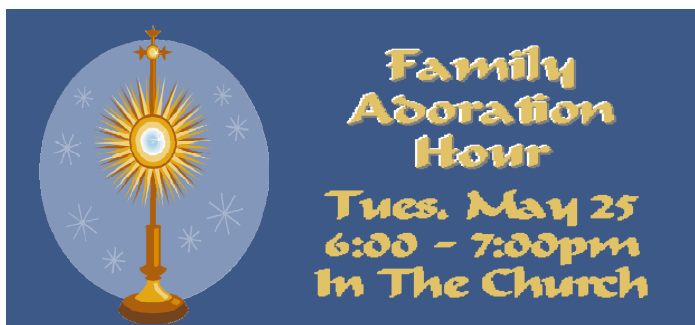


The "Meet Life" Campaign, sponsored by the Knights of Columbus and the Respect Life Ministry is raising funds

We are starting a Grief Support group here at St James for anyone who is facing loss and grief.

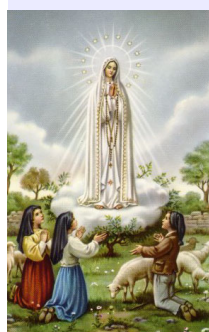


This weekend, May 22nd and 23rd, we have a special collection to support Little Sisters of the Poor

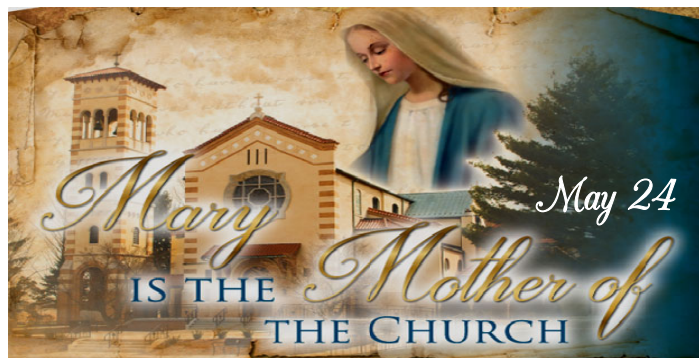

As the Church was fully established in the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, strengthening the Lord's followers to believe in and to proclaim the Gospel, the Blessed Mother was there as the foremost example of what it means to fully say yes to Jesus.
