to honor those who served and died for our country in all wars.

It reminds Americans of the sacrifices made by our veterans while protecting our freedoms.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



The past few weeks I have shared my personal prayer life and need for guidance from the Holy Spirit to journey through the ordinary events of my daily life.

By now you may think I am unorthodox or even out of touch with the traditions of our church regarding prayer. I ask you to bear with me as I share another aspect of myself. I often begin the day reading scripture, then pray with my arms wide open and my eyes raised like Jesus in the above picture. Although there are many verses in the Bible which elicit various feelings and understanding, there are three passages which I combine in daily prayer: Luke 1:38b and Matthew 26:39b, and Mark 14:36. The essence of these passages is also found in the Lord's prayer: "thy will be done."

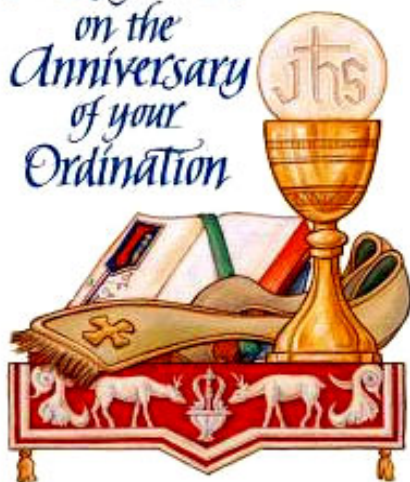
Some of you may know I have issues with trust and control. Put another way, I have difficulty letting go and accepting help. I generally feel I know what needs to be done and how to go about doing it, alone. This is the path I have followed or been forced to follow through much of my life. Unfortunately, my dependency of others was short lived at least in part because I felt the need to follow my own path. Also, like many of you, I have felt disappointment and even betrayal when I let my guard down and trusted others. I think God, however, tried to tell me over an extended period of time, that I needed to change. My change finally began when I reached a point where the only place to turn was to God. In my loneliest moments, I began to find God within, helping me to trust and let go. The more I experienced God's love, the greater my awareness that it is possible to surrender to God's will and accept others.

In the above gospel passages from Matthew and Mark, I feel Jesus' fear, anxiety, and desire for a different path; still Jesus words to *abba*, "your will be done" echo what I too must also embrace. In Luke's words I sense Mary's apprehension and perhaps fear, yet she too answered: "Let it be done to me according to your word." Each day brings unique challenges and there are times when it is difficult to open my heart to God. Still, I pray: "Lord not my will but yours. Lead me, give me the strength to let go. Show me how to love others as the unique persons you created, to trust them, and to accept their help." There are days I wake feeling God's love and presence, making it easier to let go and follow the words God places in my heart. Other days, however, I feel confused and I question "What's next?" In those days of confusion and uncertainty I seek God's presence most profoundly. Throughout the day I find myself repeating: "What's next?" Always the answer comes: "be patient, trust in my love," and I respond, "show me your will." May you also feel God's presence and trust in His love.

Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary May 31

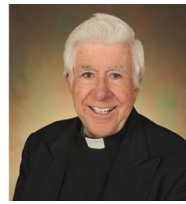

The visit took place when Elizabeth was herself six months' pregnant with the forerunner of Christ, Saint John the Baptist.

Fr. Richard Anthony Colbert, C.P.P.S.

May 1, 1942 – May 20, 2021



Fr. Richard Colbert, C.P.P.S. of the Kansas City Province of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood, died on May 20, 2021 in an automobile accident in Hardin County, OH. He was a resident at St. Charles Center in Carthagena, OH. He was 79 years old.

Fr. Richard was born in Cleveland, Ohio on May 1, 1942. He entered formation with the Society of the Precious Blood at Brunnerdale Seminary in Canton, Ohio in 1956, made his Temporary Profession in 1962, and his Final Profession on August 15, 1965. He was ordained to the priesthood at St. Charles Seminary on May 10, 1969.

His first assignment was as associate pastor of St. Anthony's Church in Linton, ND from 1969-1971. He then became director of vocations for the Kansas City Province, where he served for five years. From 1976-77, he was acting theologate director for Precious Blood Seminarians at St. John's Seminary in Collegeville, MN. Fr. Richard then served as associate pastor at Sacred Heart Church in Sedalia, MO for two years.

In 1979, Fr. Richard began three years of graduate studies at St. Paul University in Ottawa, Ontario, earning an M.P.S. degree in family counseling, and an M.A. in marital counseling.

He was then appointed associate pastor at St. Mary's Church, Nebraska City, NE, where he also served as chaplain of St. Mary's hospital. In 1984, he was interim pastor at St. Catherine Church in Tulsa, OK before beginning a year of training to be a hospital chaplain supervisor at St. Joseph Hospital in Omaha, NE. From 1985 to 1988, Fr. Richard served as chaplain at Fr. Flanagan's Boy's Home, Boys Town, NE.

Fr. Richard then served as pastor in a number of parishes in Missouri, including St. Joseph Parish in Pilot Grove from 1988-1992, St. Patrick's Parish in Sedalia from 1992-1995, St. Joseph Parish in Fayette from 1995-1999, and St. Ann's Parish in Warsaw from 1999-2005. Fr. Richard then entered semi-retirement, serving as sacramental minister at St. James Parish and chaplain at Our Lady of Mercy Country Home, both in Liberty, Missouri. Fr. Richard fully retired from active ministry in 2018 and moved to St. Charles Center in Carthagena, Ohio, where he continued to serve the community by providing transportation to members who were not able to drive.

In addition to his dedicated service to the community, Fr. Richard will probably best be remembered for his gregarious personality and his convivial nature. He probably never met a person with whom he couldn't strike up a conversation.
