## Mission Statement

## Come Home To Communion



Last year in mid-March, Catholic churches in our diocese were closed due to the pandemic. Public Masses were not able to be held until the end of May, when our churches were allowed to open (with limited attendance) on the Feast of Pentecost.

On March 13, 2020, due to the pandemic and in the interest of public safety, Bishop Johnston dispensed all Catholics in this diocese from the obligation to participate in Masses and holy days of Obligation. Many churches, including St. James, began live-streaming Sunday Mass.

**With the decrease in Covid cases, fewer restrictions, and other considerations, effective June 1, Bishop Johnston has removed the general dispensation from the obligation to participate in Mass and holy days of obligation.**

Those with serious health concerns, pre-existing conditions, the homebound and their caregivers continue to be dispensed from the Mass obligation.

While many parishioners have returned to Mass, there are still many who are hesitant about taking the first step to returning.

Our diocese has initiated the Come Home To Communion Campaign, designed to provide tools to help encourage everyone to return to Mass and the sacraments. Family and friends are the greatest influencers when it comes to the decisions we make from day to day. If you have a family member, friend or neighbor who you have not seen return to Mass since the pandemic began – or maybe fell out of practice before then – the diocese has provided a few tools to help you encourage them to Come Home to Communion.

## From the Pastor's Pen

St. Thomas Aquinas, one of the most renowned theologians in the history of the Catholic Church, had a special devotion to the presence of Christ in the Eucharist. He urged the Pope of his day, Urban IV, to establish a distinct feast in the Church calendar to honor the Eucharistic presence of Christ, which Pope Urban did in 1264. The feast of Corpus Christi became very popular and the custom of a Corpus Christi Procession was celebrated in many parts of Europe. In Rome, the procession followed a route from St. John Lateran Basilica to the Basilica of St. Mary Major. People lined the streets and, as the monstrance containing the Blessed host passed by, they would bless themselves and sometimes join in the procession to the Basilica and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. The Corpus Christi procession also became quite popular in our country, though it is not often seen today. With the reform of the liturgical calendar after the Second Vatican Council, the feast of the Most Precious Blood of Jesus, celebrated on July 1, was combined with Corpus Christi and today is known as the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.

This feast helps to deepen our Catholic Church teaching that Christ is truly and really present in the Eucharist. After the Reformation, most Protestant churches denied the Real Presence and taught that the presence of Jesus was only symbolic. Our Catholic Church teaches that in the Mass the bread (host) becomes for us the very presence of Christ, although the appearance remains the same. The Mass and the presence of the Risen Lord in the Eucharist remain the very heart of our Catholic worship and devotion. For the members of the Society of the Most Precious Blood, the name change of the feast was very important and significant. To receive from the cup (chalice) helps us to remember the instruction of Jesus at the Last Supper: Take and eat. Take and drink. Do this in remembrance of me. Yes, it is true that the Church teaches that Christ is fully present in the consecrated host; still receiving from the cup is a powerful sign of heeding the words of Jesus.

This feast of the Body and Blood of Christ is a golden opportunity for each of us to reaffirm his or her devotion to the Eucharist and our commitment to be present at the weekend Mass.

My prayers are with you each day.

No need to make reservations. Just join us.



## Someone is Watching and Wondering



Two of my favorite places in Kansas City are Linda Hall Library and Loose Park. Although quite different, I feel peace and hope when I visit these places. As a person of science, Linda Hall Library connects me to the past and the future, to the great accomplishments of other human beings, dedicated to answering questions about life and the universe and to a future filled with new ideas, creativity, and the search for understanding. Similarly a visit to Loose Park immerses me in the richness and diversity of life, from the spring azalea garden and flowering trees, to the beautiful rose garden, wide open space, giant trees, and wildlife. Revisiting these places brings thoughts of the complexity and inter-relationships of both the biotic and abiotic worlds, and to St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians (Chapter 12).

Like myself, many of you enjoy gardening. My gardens have a variety of flowers and vegetables which connect me to the past. For example, my paternal grandmother grew beautiful peonies and my maternal grandmother, chrysanthemums; my mom grew roses, while my dad grew tomatoes, peppers, gladiolus and tuber roses. So how does visiting a library or park and my gardens relate to I Cor 12? Simply stated, complexity. Think for a moment of the requirements for a successful garden (soil, water, light, nutrients, temperature, interactions with other species of plant and animal life, and so on. Consider the complexity of one plant, a rose (roots, stem, buds, leaves, hips (you get the idea). Now consider humanity. Every individual, throughout all time, is unique, given different physical features, talents, abilities, and personalities. Each human lives in a specific place at a specific time, surrounded by other human beings different from themselves. Every human being must be cared for and nurtured, thought by their elders both to survive and interact with other humans and the natural environment. Yet, I think at times we forget our dependency on both the natural world and one another, past and present.



For example, we abuse the environment, demanding more and more for our personal consumption and comfort, without considering the cost in natural resources or the pollution we generate. We want other people to exist according to "my understandings and beliefs" without considering who they are, where they live, or how they have been taught and experienced life. We rate success on income, possessions, and life-style, easily becoming self engrossed and self centered. I hope we don't forget St. Paul's words: though many, we are one body, when one suffers, we all suffer. God's diversity is love.


Members of this ministry knit baptismal shawls presented to parents when their child(ren) is being baptized and sympathy shawls presented at funerals to the family members of the decedent.

## The Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus Friday, June 11



Although not a Holy Day of Obligation, the Feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus is an important liturgical day in the Catholic Church.

Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus goes back at least to the 11th century, but through the 16th century, it remained a private devotion, often tied to devotion to the Five Wounds of Christ.

The first feast of the Sacred Heart was celebrated on August 31, 1670, in Rennes, France, through the efforts of Fr. Jean Eudes (1602-1680). From Rennes, the devotion spread, but it took the visions of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647-1690) for the devotion to become universal.

In all of these visions, in which Jesus appeared to St. Margaret Mary, the Sacred Heart of Jesus played a central role. The "great apparition," which took place on June 16, 1675, during the octave of the Feast of Corpus Christi, is the source of the modern Feast of the Sacred Heart. In that vision, Christ asked St. Margaret Mary to request that the Feast of the Sacred Heart be celebrated on the Friday after the octave (or eighth day) of the Feast of Corpus Christi, in reparation for the ingratitude of men for the sacrifice that Christ had made for them.

The Sacred Heart of Jesus represents not simply His physical heart but His love for all mankind.

The devotion became quite popular after St. Margaret Mary's death in 1690, but, because the Church initially had doubts about the validity of St. Margaret Mary's visions, it wasn't until 1765 that the feast was celebrated officially in France. Almost 100 years later, in 1856, Pope Pius IX, at the request of the French bishops, extended the feast to the universal Church. It is celebrated on the day requested by our Lord —the Friday after the octave of Corpus Christi (The Body and Blood of Christ), or 19 days after Pentecost Sunday.
