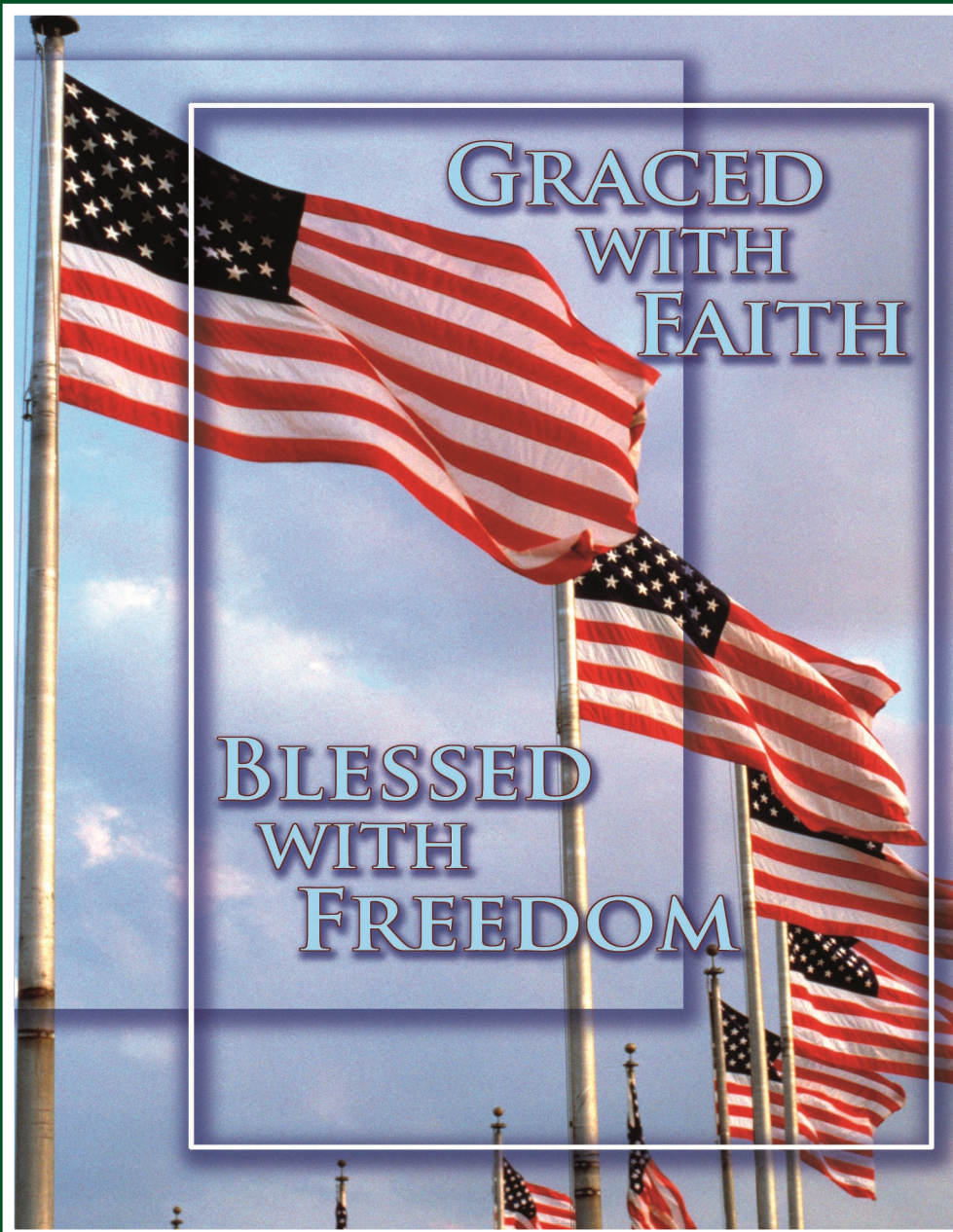

## From the Pastor's Pen

Last year on the 4th of July we were in the midst of the Covid pandemic. Celebrations of the holiday were toned down with many Americans staying in the safety of their homes. This year with more and more folks vaccinated and incidents of Covid declining, many people are anxious to get out and celebrate the holiday in the usual style, with parades, fireworks, cookouts and family visits. We praise the Lord that we can be more hopeful of relief from Covid.

Our country's history began with discoveries of the continent, early settlers, issues with Native Americans, and problems with England. The English leaders wanted this new land to be part of the British Empire. However, the colonists saw the new land as their own, engaged in a costly Revolutionary War and gained independence. Yes, it was cause for celebration, so that July 4th was officially recognized as Independence Day.

In many ways, freedom is a wonderful gift. We need only to read history. So many people down through the centuries have lived in captivity, often under the domination of unscrupulous leaders. Freedom is founded on the basis of the human dignity of every person. In 1948 the United Nations issued a landmark document, "A Basic Declaration of Human Rights." This document included statements about human dignity, equality, the right to life, to be free of torture, justice before the law, the right to practice religion, peaceful assembly, and an adequate standard of living. This Declaration reflects much of our own American Constitution and Bill of Rights.

As people of Christian faith, our concern is not only freedom in a physical sense, but especially freedom in a spiritual sense. We are not free to do whatever we want. There are guidelines to our behaviors: from our Jewish heritage, the 10 Commandments; from the teachings of Christ, the Beatitudes, rooted in the great law of love. Our "rights," and the way we treat others must always be seen in the context of our faith. We are most free when we treat others in the manner that we would like to be treated.

So our Independence Day celebration can be not only thanksgiving for the freedoms we enjoy as Americans but also a commitment to the spiritual freedoms we have as disciples of the Lord Jesus. Enjoy the holiday and know that my prayers are with you each day.

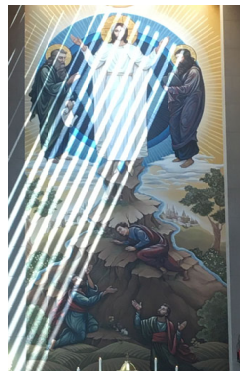

## Someone is Watching and Wondering



For almost two years I have looked at this painting every time I enter our worship space. While I continue to appreciate both its beauty and the story it tells, I have never seen the images as I did Sunday, June 20th during the funeral mass for Fr. Mike's brother. As I looked toward the altar, I witnessed an amazing, moving pattern of light streaming through the skylights. I was struck how nature revealed a new image

for "the Light of Christ." The streams of natural light seemed to reveal Christ's light as more than illumination breaking through sin and darkness. I realized that the Light of Christ is meant to be the one true light to guide my life.

On Mount Tabor, Jesus was transfigured before the disciples, revealing His transcendence and true identity as one with God. In the illumination above, however, I felt a transfiguration directed at His followers. Look at the light on Peter, the disciple who denied his relationship to Jesus; Peter who became the great preacher at Pentecost; Peter the acknowledged leader of the apostles and our Church; Peter, bathed in Christ's light, seems to be receiving the traditions passed from Elijah and Moses. Peter, like all disciples of Jesus, appears transfigured and transformed into the body of Christ; called to love and serve.

Like Peter there are times when I am confused and do not understand Jesus or His teaching. I seem to get everything wrong, trying to go through life on my own, stumbling and sinning until in desperation I reach out and seek His guidance and help. Although I gain strength from the beauty and quiet sounds of nature, where in His presence I feel inner peace and joy, letting go of my fears, participating in Mass I feel renewed and rejuvenated. Like many of my Christian sisters and brothers, believing in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. I know that when I receive His body and blood I am called to become what I receive. Quoting Fr. Michael Himes, "we [are called to] become little christs." We are called to reveal Him to the world by continuing His work of forgiveness and work of loving service. Consequently, true transformation through Christ opens my eyes to see His face in other humans. I am called to not only recognize that I am a beloved child of God, and God is pleased with my being, but I am also called to recognize others as God's beloved children, with whom He is pleased, regardless of race, religion, culture, or state of being. Gazing upon the above image of Jesus' transfiguration, I am forced to ask: "How am I being transfigured by the Light of Christ to become a living symbol of His love.

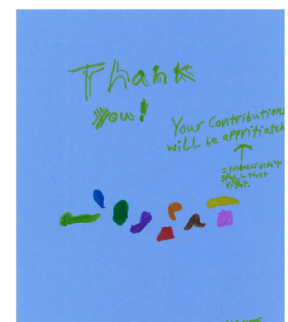
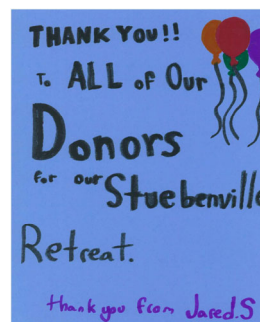
The excitement is building for our Steubenville weekend in Springfield. The teens continue to offer their gratitude for their upcoming trip.

# Why We Celebrate The 4th of July

Variously known as the Fourth of July and Independence Day, July 4th has been a federal holiday in the United States since 1870, but the tradition of Independence Day celebrations goes back to the 18th century and the American Revolution (1775-83).

In June 1776, representatives of the 13 colonies then, fighting in the revolutionary struggle, weighed a resolution that would declare their independence from Great Britain. On July 2nd, the Continental Congress voted in favor of independence. Two days later, on July 4th, the Congress formally adopted the Declaration of Independence, which had been written largely by Thomas Jefferson. Though the vote for actual independence took place on July 2nd, from then on the 4th became the day that was celebrated as the birth of American independence.

During the summer of 1776 colonists celebrated the birth of independence with festivities including concerts, bonfires, parades and the firing of cannons and muskets usually accompanied by the first public readings of the Declaration of Independence, beginning immediately after its adoption. Philadelphia held the first annual commemoration of independence on July

4, 1777. After the Revolutionary War, Americans continued to commemorate Independence Day every year in celebrations that allowed the new nation's leaders to address citizens and create a feeling of unity.

From 1776 until the present day, July 4th has been celebrated as the birth of American independence, with typical festivities ranging from fireworks, parades and concerts to more casual family gatherings and barbecues. The most common symbol of the holiday is the American flag, and a common musical accompaniment is "The Star-Spangled Banner," the national anthem of the United States.
