
Mission Statement

From the Pastor's Pen

This week former pastor Fr. Timothy Armbruster, C.P.P.S. gives us an update of his life after St. James. He is currently pastor of St. Mary's Catholic Church in Centerville, IA.

Oh how great it is to get the chance to get away and how good it is to return home. The first of August, I had the opportunity to travel across the U.S. We were supposed to be touring Spain, but alas, COVID struck and our Spain trip got bumped to next summer. Since I had already made arrangements to be gone, I decided to keep those plans. A good friend of mine joined me and we loaded the car with camping gear and took off.

My friend Tiger and I drove across Nebraska, South Dakota, Wyoming, Montana and back, taking in the country side and the rich beauty of this land. We visited Pioneer Village in Minden, NE; the Black Hills, including Wind Cave and Jewel Cave Park, Mount Rushmore and Crazy Horse; Yellowstone National Park; Grand Teton; Devil's Tower and the Badlands; The Battle of Little BigHorn; and Homestead National Historical Park in Beatrice, NE. It was a bit of a whirlwind trip covering over 3,900 miles but it was well worth it. The weather was perfect and we enjoyed camping outdoors each night. I now have a stack of postcards, souvenirs, maps and over 2,000 pictures to sort through and put together into a scrapbook.

As we returned back home, I took advantage of Fr. Bill still being in Centerville and spent the weekend with Mom and Danielle. Sunday morning we headed to church and it was great "to be back home again." I had heard about the sprinkler fiasco and couldn't even imagine what kind of mess that left. I remembered the incident in the school over Christmas break when the classrooms flooded and the incident at the house when the washing machine dumped and the look on Fr. Mike's face, "Now what do I do???" Fr. Mike shared that he's ok dealing with spiritual and emotional crisis, but not so much when it comes to anything mechanical. Well, we each have our gifts.

I wish I could say everything in Iowa is perfect, but we have our share of challenges. The new boiler was installed, but still waiting on the new controls for heat and cooling. So for now, the A/C is either on or off – either freezing cold or roasting. Three of the five A/C units at the other church went out. Renovation of the

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Like most of you, my life has had its share of ups and downs. Unfortunately in my life as I navigated the challenges I became a person who tried to rely entirely on myself. My level of trust in other people was colored by adverse interactions, resulting in "never trusting anyone until they earned it." Becoming a member of the St. James family, however, has helped me change that way of thinking. As I began to change, and my thinking altered a friend told me, "You are becoming a Pollyanna, like a marshmallow; too willing to believe in the truth and goodness of others, pushed and molded by their words, removed from reality." I found those words an acknowledgement of my growth as a fellow human being and my openness to trust God.

In the third chapter of the book of Proverbs we read: "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, on your own intelligence rely not. . .he will make straight your path." The hurts and disappointments in my life lead me to trust myself more than God. If I worked hard, increased my knowledge, and put up protective barriers pretending to be confident and self-sufficient, everything would work out and my life would be rich and full. I was so wrong! I felt empty and alone rather than fulfilled. My stress levels rose, my health declined, and relationships were strained. I don't truly understand what happened, but somehow I began to listen to an inner voice: "I love you, you are not alone." I believe that voice was the Holy Spirit leading me back to Christ Jesus, teaching me to let go and allow Jesus into not only my life, but more importantly into my heart. I did not have a radical Pauline experience, but I began to heal, physically and emotionally. With the realization that God loves me with all my faults and failures, I also came to realize that likewise God loves all His children and constantly challenges me to love as Jesus commanded. Finally, I was able to move outside myself, my ego, and selfish desires. Writing these words I realize how I continue to daily learn what it means to trust and to love. I believe that is the heart of my faith and conversion. This does not mean accepting all thoughts and actions of others, however, it does mean being able to love like Jesus in spite of the actions of other people. We challenge one another's words, actions, and understandings, not one another's humanity and creation as God's beloved. I trust God and I believe all thing are possible through God.


