

# From the Pastor's Pen

Thank you to all who expressed sympathy on the death of my brother-in-law. I have passed on those kind words to my family. We are all most grateful.

The funeral Mass was at St. Ludwig's Church in Berlin, Germany. The church was very crowded with many dignitaries in attendance. My sister is doing well and wishes she could extend her thanks to all who have expressed sympathy and offered prayer.

The Church celebrates some feast days of very significant saints this week. On Monday we remember the sanctify of St. Vincent DePaul, born in 1580 in France. He founded a religious community called The Congregation of the Mission, and, together with St. Louise de Marillac, founded a religious order of nuns, the Daughters of Charity. We remember him especially because of his work with the sick and poor. You may be seen stores bearing the name of St. Vincent de Paul, which, like Salvation Army, makes available goods for the poor at very low prices.

On Wednesday we celebrate the feast the holy archangels, Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael.

As messengers of God, they deliver important announcements and help to God's People. Michael is portrayed as the great leader in the battle against Satan. Gabriel brings the word of God to the Blessed Virgin Mary that she is to be the mother of the Savior. Raphael is depicted in the Book of Tobit as the healer and the patron of travelers.

On Thursday the Church honors the memory of Saint Jerome. His great gift to the Church was the translation of the Bible from the original Greek into Latin, making the Bible much more available to the people. Then on Friday we remember St. Therese of the Child Jesus, sometimes called the "Little Flower." She was born in Lisieux, France, in 1873; in her teens took vows as a member of the Carmelite Sisters, and died at the young age of 24. Her very popular biography is called "The Story of a Soul." Her spirituality, the "little way," is immensely popular in the Catholic world. As we celebrate these great saints, we recall our own call to holiness. Though we may not attain their spiritual heights, still each of us is precious to God and to the Church



We are unable to host this drive at St. James but we do have another location lined up. Please join us at the **Pleasant Valley Community Building at 6805 Sobbie Rd in Pleasant Valley.** 

We're sorry a location change is needed again, but we appreciate your flexibility. We hope to be back at St. James for our next blood drive in November.

You've been hearing about blood shortages for months, and the CBC is currently down to less than a 3-day supply of blood products. This shortage represents a dire need for your help. If you're a regular donor, thank you for your continued support and please reach out to others to donate too. If you've never donated before, now is the time! Take a friend or family member with you for support, or to double your efforts.

Donating blood takes less than an hour and is relatively easy and painless. Drink plenty of water two days before the drive, eat a good supper the night before and don't skip breakfast the day of your appointment. ## Someone is Watching and Wondering



Inspiration is an interesting word. If taken literally the word means: "the process of being mentally stimulated to do or feel something, especially something creative; a sudden brilliant, creative, or timely idea." In writing this

column I often find myself mentally blocked; What should I write, how should I say things, how should I organize my thoughts so they make sense? At those moments, in particular I search for inspiration, usually in books, scripture, or music. As a rule I do not feel inspired scanning social media, however, today (as I was searching for inspiration) I found three quotes which spoke to and inspired me.

The first is by Bianca Sparacino: "The kindest people are not born that way, they are made. They are the souls that have experienced much at the hands of life. They are the ones who have dug themselves out of the dark, who have fought to turn every loss into a lesson. The kindest people do not just exist, they choose to soften where circumstance has tried to harden them. They choose to believe in goodness, because they have seen firsthand why compassion is in this world." **Jesus calls us to be kind!** 

The second is from Mahatma Gandhi: "One tree can start a forest; One hand can lift a soul; One word can frame the goal; One candle can wipe out darkness; One laugh can conquer gloom; One hope can raise your spirits; One touch can show you care; One life can make the difference; be that one today." **Are you that one?** 

The third is from Albert Camus: "He said, ' In the midst of hate, I found there was, within me, an invincible love. In the midst of tears, I found there was, within me, an invincible smile. In the midst of chaos, I found there was, within me, an invincible calm. I realized, through it all, that in the midst of winter, I found there was, within me, an invincible summer. And that makes me happy. For it says that no matter how hard the world pushes against me, within me, there's something stronger-something better, pushing right back." **Do you love?** 

For several months I have struggled, trying to understand people who appear unkind and selfish, thinking only of themselves, their "rights" and they own desires. I struggle because I believe Jesus' teachings are in complete opposition to these sentiments. While I know I am called to share his love and peace with others, I am unsure how to even begin a conversation with such individuals, without appearing judgmental, preachy, and defensive. Although I do not have the solution at this time, I have found inspiration from the above quotes and the shared words from members of our St. James Community. I do believe I am a work in progress (even at my age) and that if I trust Jesus, he will guide me through my confusion. So I ask, "What or who inspires you; are you kind and loving; are you the one?" Have faith, trust Jesus. Each of us are a work in progress. God never abandons us and will lead us in the right direction. The question is, "Will we follow or stubbornly continue to follow our egos and selfish desires. Open your hearts and minds to grace.

The Catholic church has set aside October as "Respect Life Month" for many years. Each year we are asked to raise our awareness to another level of what it means to respect the "incomparable and inviolable worth of every human life" (*Evangelium Vitae, Paragraph 96*)

On the Saturdays in October, Precious Blood Renewal Center will host a series of panel discussions looking at five distinct aspects of human life. Fr. Ron Will, CPPS, will lead the panels at 10-11:30 a.m. Central Time. You can join us in-person or via Zoom.

### Oct 2 — Elder Abuse Awareness

Gun violence is a growing concern in our country. We will meet two priests who addressed that situation in their parish ministry and learn what they did and why.

## Saint Lorenzo Ruiz Feast Day **Tuesday, September 28**



You may have walked by this statue many times and perhaps wondered why a statue of St. Lorenzo Ruiz of Manila is displayed in our church.

Here at St. James, we have several parishioners of Filipino descent and St. Lorenzo Ruiz is the patron saint of the Philippines and the Filipino people. For several years those in our Filipino community had discussed having his

statue displayed here. In March 2019, parishioners Noverson and Marissa Vitug visited the Philippines. searched for a beautiful hand carved statue, brought it home and donated it to St. James on behalf of our Filipino community.

In a special Mass on September 28, 2019, Fr. Mike blessed the statue and it was placed it in a place of honor in our former church until it could be moved to the new church.

Lorenzo Ruiz was born in Binondo, Manila, on November 28, 1594, to a Chinese father and a Filipino mother who were both Catholic.

He served as an altar boy at the Binondo Church. After being educated by the Dominican friars for a few vears, he became a professional calligrapher because of his skillful penmanship. He became a member of the Confraternity of the Most Holy Rosary. He married Rosario, a native, and they had two sons and a daughter. The Ruiz family led a generally peaceful, religious and content life.

In 1636, while working as a clerk for the Binondo Church, Lorenzo was falsely accused of killing a Spaniard. He sought asylum on board a ship with three Dominican priests, a Japanese priest, and a lay

leper. Lorenzo and his companions sailed for Okinawa, Japan on June 10,1636, with the aid of the Dominican fathers.

By the time Lorenzo had arrived in Japan the Tokugawa Shogunate was persecuting Christians. The missionaries were arrested and thrown into prison, and after two years, they were transferred to Nagasaki to face trial by torture. The group endured many and various cruel methods of torture.



San Lorenzo Ruiz de Manila On September 27, 1637, Lorenzo and his companions were taken to Nishizaka Hill, where they were tortured by being hung upside-down over a pit. He died two days later on

September 29, 1637, at age 42. This form of torture alleged to have been extremely painful, had the victim bound; one hand was always left free so that the individual may signal their desire to recant. leading to their release. Despite his suffering, Lorenzo refused to renounce Christianity and died from eventual blood loss and suffocation. His body was cremated, with the ashes thrown into the sea.

According to Latin missionary accounts sent back to Manila, Lorenzo declared these words upon his death: "I am a Catholic and wholeheartedly do accept death for God; had I a thousand lives, all these to Him shall I offer." Lorenzo was beatified during Pope John Paul II's papal visit to the Philippines in 1981. It was the first beatification ceremony to be held outside the Vatican in history. Lorenzo was canonized by Pope John Paul in the Vatican City on October 18, 1987, among the 16 Martyrs of Japan, making him the first Filipino saint.
