



#### Someone is Watching and Wondering



Several weeks ago I asked you to think about your image of God. Any new ideas? There are different names and images of God found in Holy Scripture and certainly artists have provided many beautiful

and powerful images. Stories, movies, and music have furthered our imagination with portrayals of God. Stay with me a few minutes as I offer two more:

"I preferred her to scepter and throne. And deemed riches nothing in comparison with her, nor did I liken any priceless gem to her; because all gold, in view of her, is a little sand, and before her, silver is to be accounted mire. . . I chose to have her rather than the light, because the splendor of her never yields to sleep, yet all good things came to me in her company."

"All day long She has been arranging our welcome: Scouring down the house, sweeping under beds, pulling out the old crocheted counterpane, shining glasses and tableware, dusting sideboards and picture frames. Now she sits in a deep chair till we come crunching under the beeches to the door." The first we heard proclaimed last Sunday from the Book of Wisdom, the second I found in one of the novels from my library. The words are credited to an Irish priest ,Father Paddy Daly. Both stretch our imagination with images of God and may seem quite distinct from the image Michelangelo painted in the Sistine Chapel. Yet they also evoke strength and comfort, God whose desire is always to lovingly provide for His/Her creatures. Let me remind you of one more quote: "God created man [and woman] in his image; in the divine image he created. . . Male and female" (Genesis 1:17). We are all, every human created in the "divine image" of God. Reflecting on the above quotes and images, I am reminded the many ways God graces my life and challenges me to lovingly and wisely care for creation so full of beauty, majesty, and gifts to be cherished. God is always present, overwhelming our senses with light, sound, scent, taste, and touch. God fills our minds with new ideas, challenging each of us to be-

Tills our minds with new ideas, challenging each of us to become co-creators in the continuing evolution of our universe. God gives us wisdom to help us make decisions and moral choices, whether we are at home, work, or at worship. God provides opportunities for establishing relationships and building bridges between people. God refreshes the earth with rain, sends forth plants for beauty and sustenance, welcomes us each day with the rising of the sun, and sends us to sleep with the moon and the stars to guide our prayer and assure us of the eternal presence.

The image above of God as a mother or father, preparing for my visit reminds me of my maternal grandmother. Before each of our visits she prepared: placing fresh linens on the beds, preparing special meals (I especially remember the turkey and pies she baked), dusting, scrubbing, and sweeping, and always having fresh flowers, which she had carefully selected from her gardens and arranged in special vases throughout the house. I believe, with my entire being, that God prepared for me, like my grandmother and desires that I welcome and receive his/her love. I think all God asks in return is that I use my gifts to lovingly and unselfishly care for others and for creation. What is your personal image of God?


# *Glory Be Tea is* **Back** Save the date - Sunday December 12th

Pope St. John Paul II wrote that the Gospel of life is at the heart of Jesus' saving message to the world. In taking on human flesh, dwelling among us, and sacrificing his very life for our redemption. Christ reveals the profound dignity of every human person. This God-given dignity does not change with our stage of life, abilities, level of independence, or any other varying circumstance.

Rather, it is rooted in the permanent fact that each of us is made in the image and likeness of God, created to share in the very life of God himself. The human person is a "manifestation of God in the world. a sign of his presence, a trace of his glory". And we must reflect this truth in how we act and how we treat one another.

The truth of the Gospel of life is at the foundation of who we are as followers of Christ. In his earthly life, Jesus provided the perfect model for how we are to love our neighbor and live out the Gospel call:

"Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me". Jesus calls each of us to "care for the other as a person for whom God has made us responsible".

In his encyclical on the Gospel of life, Pope St. John Paul II recognizes the full range of threats against human life, from poverty and malnutrition to murder and war. He places particular emphasis, however, on threats to life at its beginning and end - precisely when it is most in need of protection. In modern times, children in their mothers' wombs and those approaching the end of their lives are certainly among the "least of these" in our world's estimation. Practices such as abortion and assisted suicide tragically reject the truth that human life is always to be cherished and defended with loving concern.

Let us reflect on how we personally live out the Gospel:

Do I talk about and act towards others as I would talk about and treat Jesus himself?


Do I inform myself of the Church's teachings and engage in the civic arena as first a follower of Christ?

#### St. Luke Feast Day October 18



Luke, the writer of the Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles, has been identified with St. Paul's "Luke, the beloved physician". We know few other facts about Luke's life from Scripture and from early Church historians.

It is believed that Luke was born a

Greek and a Gentile. According to the early Church historian Eusebius Luke was born at Antioch in Syria.

The Acts of the Apostles follows the trail of Luke's Christian ministry. We know nothing about his conversion but looking at the language of Acts we can see where he joined Saint Paul.

Luke is the loyal comrade who stays with Paul when he is imprisoned in Rome about the year 61: After everyone else deserts Paul in his final imprisonment and sufferings, it is Luke who remains with Paul to the end: "Only Luke is with me"

Luke's inspiration and information for his Gospel and Acts came from his close association with Paul and his companions. His unique perspective on Jesus can be seen in the six miracles and eighteen parables not found in the other gospels. Throughout Luke's gospel, Jesus takes the side of the sinner who wants to return to God's mercy.

Reading Luke's gospel gives a good idea of his character as one who loved the poor, who wanted the door to God's kingdom opened to all, who respected women, and who saw hope in God's mercy for everyone.

The reports of Luke's life after Paul's death are conflicting. Some early writers claim he was martyred, others say he lived a long life. Some say that he preached in Greece, others in Gaul. The earliest tradition we have says that he died at 84 Boeotia after settling in Greece to write his Gospel.




