

From the Pastor's Pen

When something good happens to us or to our families, it is our natural inclination to tell others about our good fortune. If that is true about the events of our daily lives, then it is all the more true about our faith. We have received a treasure: the invitation to be followers of the Lord Jesus Christ and our Church. In our generosity and concern, we want others to receive that same gift. Evangelization, proclaiming the good news, is the work of the Church, of all the People of God.

We are so fortunate to live in a county that protects religious freedom, a country where we have the financial means – for most people at least – to support the ministries of the Church in our parishes and to reach out in charity to places in need. Each year in September we celebrate World Mission Sunday. We are asked to give special attention to the work of the missions, giving support by our prayer and our financial assistance. It is a global collection: in every country where there is a diocese and Catholic parishes a collection is taken up for this cause. The monies collected are given especially to dioceses and parishes where there is poverty, violence, and oppression. Not only do catechetical programs receive assistance, but also the monies assist in building infrastructure: chapels, schools, orphanages, clinics, and dispensaries.


World Mission Sunday is a great testimony to our solidarity as the People or God. We are brothers and sisters in the faith. We stand together: praying together the same liturgies, passing on the same traditions, giving assistance and encouragement to each other. The theme for this year's celebration comes from the Book of Acts, 4,20: "We cannot but speak about what we have seen and heard." Christians of the early Church loved their faith so much that they wanted to share it with all who would listen. We hope that our faith is just as strong. We possess the good news, salvation in the Lord Jesus Christ. Not only do we shout out the good news ourselves, but we help others to proclaim the gospel. That's the work of the missions. With conviction, we speak the good news by our words and example, but we also enable our sisters and brothers in faith to join us in this work of evangelization. Would you like to join with others who are experiencing the same issues for support and companionship in the journey?


Studies have shown that being a part of a support group helps ease the pain and facilitates healing.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



For nearly two years now, most of you have read, heard about, or experienced microorganisms, specifically the Sars Covid 19 virus in a manner most of us had not previously imagined. Per-

haps I am the odd one, however, who comes to this problem with a different mindset.

As many of you know, I studied, taught, and researched microorganisms for more than thirty years and have been fascinated with all things related to science since I was in elementary school (I won't reveal how many years that has been except in private dialogue). In those years of study/research I discovered not only the immense diversity of microbes but also how beneficial these tiny life-forms are to our daily living. Without microbes nature's amazing recycling would not exist. Without microbes many foods/beverages we enjoy would not be available. Without beneficial microbes our health and physiological processes would be in danger. Without microorganisms the soil would be depleted of nitrogen necessary for plant growth and our oceans could not sustain life. In fact, microbes were present long before other organisms existed on earth. In fact, science teaches that many of these ancient microbes, that provided the environment necessary for the evolution of higher life forms, still exist today. My favorite examples are the microorganisms found in the thermal features of Yellowstone National Park. I do not minimize the threat pathogenic microorganisms are in this world, but I continue to marvel at our dependence on beneficial microbes. Yet most of us are left to understanding and dealing with those microbes which cause disease.

Recently I read an article about a newer vaccine, "Mosquirix." No this is not a new vaccine to protect against COVID-19, rather it is the first vaccine to prevent disease due to parasites, specifically to protect humans against malaria. Although malaria is not prevalent in the United States, it kills many people, especially children, in tropical countries such as found in sub-Saharan Africa. To date more than 800.000 children, in three African countries have received the vaccine. It has been shown safe and effective in preventing disease, for those people who receive 4 doses of the vaccine. FYI this vaccine is 40% effective in preventing severe disease and death. People are eager to receive Mosquirix, especially those living in rural areas, at the greatest risk of suffering from malaria. Yet in our country, many people (without medical reasons) refuse to be vaccinated against COVID-19 with vaccines that approach greater than 90 efficacy with extremely low risk to the recipient. I must admit, such resistance is confusing to me, while I try not to judge those making this decision.

As I continue to study microbes, I also continue to be amazed at God's creation. There is so much we do not understand; so much we take for granted; so much we fail to treasure; so much we cannot see; so much yet to be discovered. As the fields of science, technology, and medicine continue to grow, my prayer is that those not working in these fields, will lose the fear and distrust which blocks advances that can protect and preserve what God's has provided. We each are given different abilities. God asks us to use those abilities for the common good, and graces us with the strength to continue even when we are tired. Please share your gifts of love.

The Advent Giving Tree Kicks Off Next Sunday, October 31




Through the Advent Giving Tree ministry, St. James Parish has provided incredible support to various charitable organizations, including our own parish, to help families and individuals in need.


