As we prepare to celebrate the Feast of All Saints on Monday, November 1, we recall our loved ones who have gone before us and are with God in heaven. This feast day is usually a holy day of obligation, but since it falls on a Monday, we don't have an 'obligation' to attend Mass, but we still remember and pray for our loved ones! Our school students will be attending the 8:15am Mass, so I just want to let folks know that in case they wish to come and celebrate with us.

We will also have a prayer service on Sunday, November 21, to remember all those who have died. This service is open to all, and will be celebrated at 12 Noon (following the 10:30am Mass). We know so many families have lost loved ones over the past couple years and have not been able to adequately celebrated their lives, so we offer this opportunity on Sunday, November 21.

Thanks to all who have contributed to the Diocesan Annual Catholic Appeal. St. James has always been very responsive to supporting our Diocese and all the good work that they do in supporting as a parish community, and through Catholic Charities and other services to support those in need. Pledge cards are available in the Gathering Space if you still need one.

Our Advent Giving Tree begins this weekend. Your donations will benefit needy families and agencies in our community. Our parishioners have always been very generous and supportive of the Advent Giving Tree - thanks in advance!

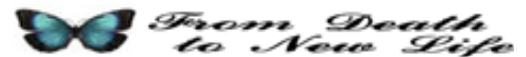
Thanks so much and in the words of St. Paul, "May God who has begun this good work in us, bring it to completion".

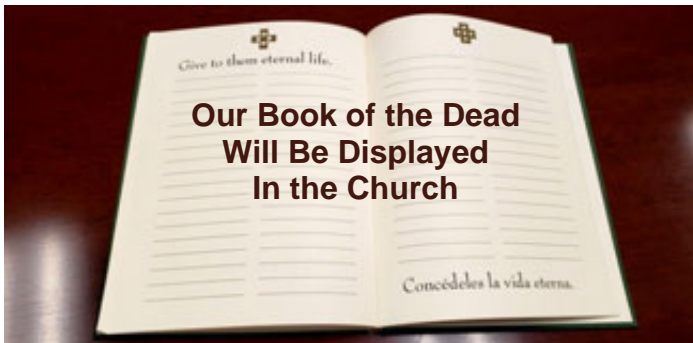

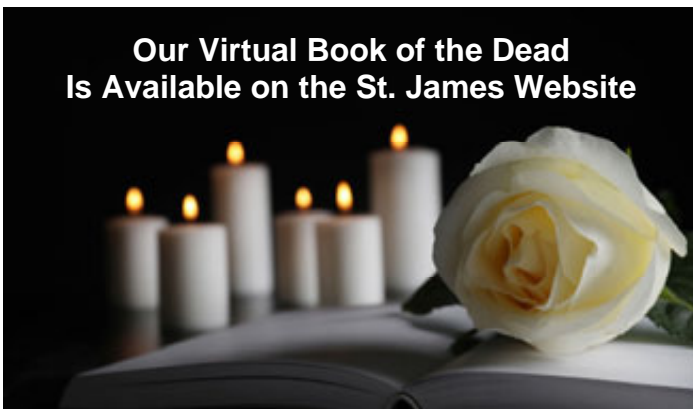
During the Month of November, We Remember and Pray for our Beloved Dead

Our 'Book of the Dead' will be displayed near the Baptismal Font at the back of the church with the names of loved ones who died and have been buried from St. James this past year.

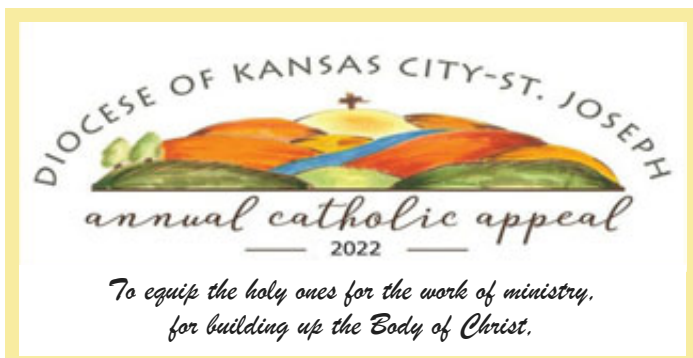
You are welcome, throughout this month to write the names of your loved ones and others who have died whom you would like us to pray for and remember this month during our Masses.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Today is the eve of All Saints/All Hallows Eve, better known to many as Halloween. When we pray the Our Father we use the word *Hallow* to replace holy and *e'en* is simply the contraction for evening; hence Halloween. Along with All Saints (Nov. 1) and All Souls (Nov. 2) these three days offer an opportunity to reflect on what it means to be holy. (Check out *Catholic Customs and Traditions* by Greg Dues.) Today I present my understanding of the communion of saints, which is multi-faceted, involves both the living and the dead, and is part of the sacred circle of life.

I first discovered Sacred Circles while studying Native American cultures, and exploring ancient petroglyphs in the Southwestern United States. For Native Americans the circle represents harmony, the sun and the moon; the circle also provides a powerful symbol for the earth, cycles of seasons, life to death to rebirth, transition from one world to the next, and cycles of growth and maturity. Sacred circles depict the four cardinal directions (north, south, east, and west), the elements (air, water, fire, and earth), as well as connecting points for Mother Earth and Father Sky. The center of the circle represents humanity and how we connect with all creation. A new museum in Oklahoma City, honoring Native Americans, is circular not square or rectangular. Such construction represents the belief that corners trap evil spirits and block harmony. Perhaps you have seen labyrinth mandalas used for reconciliation and restoration of harmony or dream catchers believed to protect children from nightmares. Maybe you are reminded of *The Lion King* and the song "Circle of Life." The "Medicine Wheel" is another ancient and powerful symbol for Native Americans representing the never ending circle of life. The wheel is significant in their spirituality and rituals. As long as the circle is unbroken, harmony and peace prevail and the people will flourish.

I cannot think of a better way to describe the communion of saints than a sacred circle where all things are interconnected and interdependent. As we trace our biological ancestors, looking for meaning in our lives, so too we should trace our spiritual ancestors, fellow seekers, journeying toward truth. We learn much from our biological ancestors but I feel we learn so much more from our spiritual ancestors. My recognition that all of God's creation is interconnected and interdependent enhances my understanding and gratitude of all things seen and experienced as well as those things I cannot yet see and understand. God graced humanity with wisdom and hopefully we continue to build on that wisdom, passed down to us from all generations, including the ancient ones. Fr. Richard Rohr views the Trinity as a mutual "circle dance" of love and communion. This seems like a perfect way to understand and embrace the Communion of Saints.

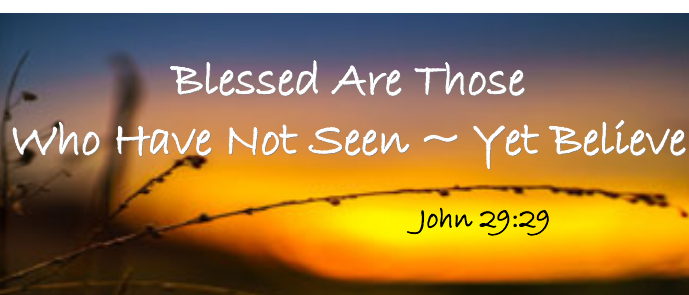


Tickets go on sale next weekend November 6 and 7 before and after Saturday evening and Sunday morning Masses.

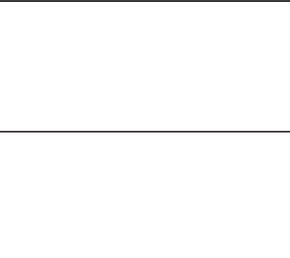
