From the Pastor's Pen

In 1976, the United States Catholic Bishops Conference established a "National Vocations Awareness Week" to be celebrated on the 28th Week in Ordinary Time. The date was changed in 2014 to the first full week of November. We as a parish family of St. James join Catholic churches across our country in praying for and dedicating ourselves to the work of promoting vocations to the priesthood, diaconate, and consecrated life.

The word "vocation" has its roots in the Latin verb, "voco," meaning "to call." The call comes from God and from the Church. In some mysterious way God plants the seed of this call into the hearts and minds of men and women as they seek to know God's plan for them. At this time in history, only men may be ordained as priests, though there are debates about women also being called to this way of life. Women, of course, answer the called by dedicating themselves to religious life as nuns. However, some women choose not to marry and to give their time and talent to the Lord's work, though not as members of religious orders. The call to the diaconate comes to married, as well as single, men.

Some men discern that they are called to serve the diocesan church and so are ordained to the diocesan priesthood. Others feel the call to membership in a religious order. They may be "strict religious," who take vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience, or they may join an order which is called "a society of apostolic life," not taking vows but living community life, following the rules of whatever religious community they join. Usually formation programs take about eight years before the time of ordination by a bishop.

Most men who answer the call to be deacons are married and wives share very much in the ministries. Deacons proclaim the gospel and preach, preside at the sacraments of baptism, matrimony, and Christian Burial, assist at the altar and are leaders in parish activities. There is some conversation in the Church about opening the office of deacon to women.

So how can we participate in this Week of Prayer for Vocations. The most obvious way in prayer. In this day and age of scandals within the priesthood and religious life, we need to maintain a positive spirit. Most priests, deacons, and religious are dedicated to ministry and need the support of the people they serve. The priesthood and religious life are not superior to the work and ministries of the laity, just a different call and way of serving. May God bless all of you as you support and care for your priests, deacons, and religious.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



As you know, November is the month in our Liturgical Year when we remember all those who have died. Remembrance is especially difficult when you have experienced a recent loss. A few weeks ago I found the poem below, which reminded me not only of my training as a caregiver but also of my own loss and feelings I experienced. The author of this poem is anonymous but it appeared in the *St. Louis Post-Dispatch*, on September 19, 1998. The poem is entitled "Listen":

When I ask you to listen to me, And you start giving me advice, You have not done what I asked. When I ask that you listen to me, And you begin to tell me why I shouldn't feel that way, You are trampling on my feelings. When I ask you to listen to me, And you feel you have to do something to solve my problems. You have failed me, strange as that may seem. Listen: All that I ask is that you listen, Not talk or do - just hear me. When you do something for me That I need to do for myself, You contribute to my fear and feelings of inadequacy. But when you accept as a simple fact That I do feel what I feel, no matter how irrational, Then I can quit trying to convince you And go about the business Of understanding what's behind my feelings. So, please listen and just hear me And, if you want to talk Wait a minute for your turn - and I'll listen to you." I was taught that presence and active listening are two of

I was taught that presence and active listening are two of the most important attributes of being a caregiver. From my personal experience I know the truth of this statement. When I experienced great loss, I did not want to be left alone to work through my grief; I did not want constant hovering; I did not want to hear "words of wisdom" or someone else's experiences; I did not want solutions. What I needed was someone to hear me, who allowed me to express my feelings of sadness, loss, anger, and disappointment. Recovering from great loss is a life-long journey, softened by time, and feeling the loving presence of God. What better way to walk that journey than with an empathic listener to walk with me. Healing requires patience and trust; it requires loving kindness guided by our Lord.





Parish Religious Education

Elementary RE: Upcoming Sessions: Wednesday 11/10 and Sunday 11/14

November's Elementary RE topic is Reconciliation and is quite timely as the students in the sacrament prep program are preparing to receive the sacrament at the end of this month. This is also a great opportunity for us, as adults, to examine how we perceive this sacrament and how our perception is passed on to our children. Elementary-age children are still of a mindset that what is important to their parents is important to them. When children see their parents make time for the sacrament of reconciliation, there is an immediate connection to it's importance in our lives. When that process is repeated in a child's life, it solidifies the importance and is more likely to become important in adulthood. Our prayer is that our monthly sessions on 11/10 and 11/14, paired with our weekly emails, will help change your perception of the sacrament and will bring you closer to the opportunity to return to a state of grace.


