




HOPE Gift Cards are being sold in the Gathering Space after all weekend Masses through December 19.

# Someone is Watching and Wondering



When I was in high school, I was given a simple silver charm to add to my bracelet with the words of this prayer: "God, give me grace to accept with serenity the things that cannot be changed, courage

to change the things that should be changed, and the wisdom to distinguish the one from the other." Perhaps you know these words as, The Serenity Prayer. I lost count of how many times I have prayed these words since high school yet they still continue to provide comfort, guidance, and hope as I struggle with loss and the need to continue life; life that is forever changed yet still filled with the beauty of God's creation. Not surprisingly, if you know me well, I frequently find myself uttering these words either while working in my gardens, walking along a wooded path, or sitting quietly on the shores of a lake, or surrounded by mountains. I always seem to find hope, and the presence of God in nature. There is something about the natural world that overwhelms my senses and fills me with wonder and awe. When I found myself discouraged and grieving a loss, I couldn't pray or even stay for extended periods of time in enclosed spaces. I needed to feel the natural elements: the sun, wind, refreshing/cleansing rain. I needed to experience the seasons: falling leaves, spring scents and flowers, the gentle touch of snowflakes, the warmth of summer, the moon and stars at night, sunrises and sunsets. I wasn't able to vocalize prayer. Instead, I felt my prayers were experiences of God. I listened to the sounds of nature and knew God was speaking to me. I touched the soil and felt God's life force in my hands. I knew God was cleansing my life, slowly washing away my sadness, my sorrow, and my feelings of hopelessness. As I walked along wooded paths I felt that God was leading me, encouraging me to find my continuing life's journey, knowing the Holy Spirit would show me which turn to take, which new path to follow. I understood that somehow God was feeling my pain and would not leave me to suffer alone.

Each of us experiences grief in unique ways and finds God's presence at different times, through different experiences, and discover our own way to pray. All I can offer, to anyone who is hurting at this time, particularly during this month of November as we remember the dead, is that you allow yourself the freedom to open your heart to God's healing. I do not believe there is any greater comfort than the realization the God loves us, never leaves us to suffer alone, and always walks with us through life. God does not ask us to bury our feelings with the dead; God offers the freedom to be, to feel, to experience our pain knowing that we are not alone. God always provides the strength for us to accept the reality of our loss, experience the pain and emotions related to loss, adjust to life without the deceased, and find ways to remember and memorialized our loved one that are healthy and life-giving. God graces us with the serenity to accept the things we cannot change, the courage to change what we can, and the wisdom to know the difference. All we need to do is ask,

Also needed are socks, gloves, scarves and other warm clothing.


This coat drive begins this weekend and will run through Sunday, November 21.



Well known in our parish for helping others, our St. James Knights of Columbus council recently received a request from Fr. Timothy Coday, C.PP.S. that provided an opportunity to spread their generosity to people living over 8,000 miles away.

As a member of the Kansas City Province of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood, Fr. Coday's current assignment is in Malongwe, a remote village in Western Tanzania. One of his tasks is to repair, remodel and make viable a health facility there.

His desire was to purchase and install a rice hulling machine. Having one would

help improve the lives of the people in this village and subsidize the income of the health facility, making it self-sufficient. This in turn would provide excellent health care for the people in the area.

Kudos to our Knights - they donated funds sufficient enough to not only purchase the equipment, but also to transport and install it in Malongwe.

### First Reconciliation **A Simple Request** of Our Parish Family




St. James is blessed to be preparing 80 students for their First Reconciliation.

# Parish Religious Education

**First Reconciliation:** Why do I need to confess my sins to a priest? Why can't I just confess to God? This excerpt from "A Little Book About Confession for Children" explains it so simply:

Absolutely you can ask God to forgive your sins, and you should. Since Jesus is God, he had the power to forgive sins. He gave that power to his Apostles when after his Resurrection he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." Priests today still have this power given to them by Jesus. Jesus wanted us to confess our sins to God, through the church.

Confirmation: Confirmation students meet on Nov. 21 for student-only session. Mark your calendars now for Friday, December 3rd at 7pm. Together, we will experience an evening of praise and worship that will include Adoration. Saturday morning, December 4th, Confirmation students with their sponsors and/or parents, will gather to participate in local service projects. Through these service projects, we share with our teens the Corporal Works of Mercy – not through a lecture but through our actions.

Middle and High School RE Program: The updates to our middle school program are taking shape as our Pre-Confirmation program is put into action. The same is true of our high school program, which is serving some students who have not confirmed as well as those in the Post-Confirmation stage. Those attending our programs are strengthening their knowledge of the Catholic faith while at the same time developing relationships with Jesus and being made aware of the call that exists even at this young age. Experiences are being offered – not just lectures. Please continue to pray for the success of this program, for which we are most grateful!

**Elementary RE:** Upcoming Session: Sunday 11/14. A bedtime routine that is as important and as easy as brushing your teeth is a 3-2-1 daily routine. This process is as beneficial to the adult as it is to a child who has not yet reached the age to receive the sacrament of reconciliation. It's a process that leads us to personal growth in our daily faith lives and helps us to be prepared for confession. Here's how it works:

- Turn to the Father and thank Him for at least 3 things from your day
- Turn to the Son, and ask forgiveness for at least 2 failings
- Turn to the Spirit, and make 1 concrete, measurable resolution for the next day



# We Pray to our Lord Jesus for healing




