From the Pastor's Pen

I think one of the greatest gifts that my parents passed on to me was a spirit of thanksgiving. They lived through the depression and took nothing for granted. No, they were not poverty-stricken and always had food and shelter. Starting with a loan, my dad slowly built up a grain elevator business. We always had food on the table and warmth in the home – but no air conditioning! We always prayed grace before meals, knelt for the family rosary after supper, and faithfully celebrated weekend Mass, very much aware of how much we were gifted.

Many of the settlers in the early days of our country had come here to seek a new homeland, especially because they wanted freedom to practice their religion. Life could be very difficult and dangerous. According to historical sources, still they found time to give thanks for their life in the new world. Out of that history came our national day of Thanksgiving, a holiday we often take for granted, and a day that simply means time off work and school, travel, rest, visiting, and a large family meal. Often what is lacking it giving thanks. So Thanksgiving Day is our task and our challenge.

As Christians and Catholics, we have added reasons for giving thanks. We have our Savior, Jesus Christ, who gives us a new purpose, new hope, a new goal in life: a place in the Kingdom of our heavenly Father. We have a new family, the Church, brothers and sisters who walk with us, support us, pray with us, and reach out to us in our needs. We have a new common table, the altar, a new meal, the Eucharist, and a new guide, the Holy Spirit. Though we sometimes stumble and fail, we have the gift of forgiveness and new beginnings. So how can we fail to be grateful? How can we not raise our voices in thanksgiving each day. As we celebrate the national holiday of Thanksgiving this week, let's make it a day of true gratitude, remembering that every day should include a prayer of thanksgiving for all of our blessings, especially the gift of our faith.

Thank you, my brothers and sisters, for all that you do for our parish family. May many blessings come to you. My prayers are with you each day.

Someone is Watching and Wondering




There are many losses which happen in our lives that cause physical, emotional, and spiritual pain that may lead to divisions within families, among friends, or even in the way we think of ourselves. A question we each must address is: "How do I heal?" There are many aspects to the healing process, regardless of the cause of the pain or loss. Letting go is one part of the process which must be addressed by both the person directly affected, family, friends, and at times an entire community. As caring people we must meet others where they are following a loss; this is part of the letting go process.

I recently read "A Letter to My Family and Friends," taken from *We Need Not Walk Alone: After the Death of a Child* edited by M. Cleckley, E. Estes, and P. Norton, 1992. When I found this passage, I was reminded of feelings I experienced following the death of my husband and what I needed to say to my family and friends. I think this letter is applicable to many different types of losses. (I have taken the liberty of changing the nouns/pronouns to fit my particular loss.)

"Thank you for not expecting too much from me this holiday season. It will be [my] first Christmas without my husband] and I have all I can do coping with the 'spirit' of the holiday on the radio, TV, in the newspapers and stores. [I] do not feel joyous, and trying to pretend this Christmas is going to be like the last one will be impossible because [I] am missing [him]. Please allow me to talk about [him]. Don't be uncomfortable with my tears. My heart is breaking and the tears are a way of letting out my sadness. I plan to do something special in memory of [him]. Please recognize my need to do this in order to keep [my] memories alive. My fear is not that I will forget, but that you will. Please don't criticize me if I do something that you don't think is normal. I'm a different person now and it may take a long time before this different person reaches an acceptance of [his] death. As I survive the stages of grief, I will need your patience and support especially during these holiday times and the 'special' days throughout the year. Thank you for not expecting too much from me this holiday season."

I know I hesitated to express these feelings seven years ago and twenty-five years ago when I lost my first husband. I think God wants each of us to feel able to express our thoughts and emotions following loss. God wants us to heal and I feel God holds us in loving embrace until we are able to begin our new life which follows suffering through losses and confronting the tasks of grieving. As we gather for Thanksgiving this week, enter the Advent season next week, and prepare for Christmas, please remember there are members of our family and community who are grieving. Please be patient with them.

This Sunday, the last Sunday of the liturgical year, we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. This solemnity, also sometimes referred to as the Feast of Christ the King, was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925. Though it was originally celebrated in October, this feast was moved to the last Sunday of the liturgical year in 1969.

It is more than a coincidence that we close out the year with this particular feast. On this day especially, we celebrate the supreme kingship of Jesus over the entire universe. His is a kingship not like the secular monarchies of the past and present, but one that is pastoral, absolute, and desirous of bring us to himself.

Jesus is not just a King of Hearts. He is more than a Universal Coach, Teacher, or Consoler of mankind. By "King of the Universe" the Church is communicating Jesus' metaphysical scale, that God encompasses all of reality, not just man's reality. We say in the Nicene Creed that God created all things visible and invisible. So Jesus is King over all the planets, stars, black holes, quasars, and exploding suns in the blackest corners of remote space. He is King over the earth and all its waterfalls, rainforests, mountain peaks, desert plains, and dark sea floors.

We await the coming of Christ in his eternal Kingdom, but we recognize that he is already King.

Donations will be distributed to St. James Midtown and homeless veterans before Christmas.






