Someone is Watching and Wondering



In my mind Advent is a new beginning, a renewal of all that is possible when I trust God, when my faith is centered in Christ and following his teachings, when I can see God's handiwork and feel His presence wherever I find myself and within every task I undertake. Lighting the Advent candles is a symbol of the light I can bring into the world when I reflect the love of Jesus, a task for all Christians.

This first Sunday of Advent the scriptures direct our thoughts to **Hope**. After so many months of enduring a pandemic which has taken over 750,000 lives in the United States and over 5,000,000 world wide, I think everyone needs hope; our world needs hope. Science and politics aside, how do we come together and find hope in a world which has witnessed so much suffering, tragedy, and hate?

As the first candle is lit on Advent wreaths in churches and homes may all Christians not only embrace our hope in Christ, but may we share **His Hope** with others regardless of race, religion, language, cultural or political difference. I think that is what Christ is asking.

Part of my prayer each day is to read the scriptures found in our lectionary. Recently as I prayed Psalm 139 I was struck with a sense of hope and I thought it appropriate to revisit this Psalm on this First Sunday of Advent. Perhaps you might meditate on these verses as you light the first candle on your wreath.

O Lord, you have probed me and you know me;
 You know when I sit and when I stand;
 You understand my thoughts from afar.
 My journeys and my rest you scrutinize,
 With all my ways you are familiar.
 Even before a word is on my tongue,
 Behold, O Lord, you know the whole of it.
 Behind me and before,
 You hem me in and rest your hand upon me.
 Such knowledge is too wonderful for me;
 To lofty for me to attain.
 Where can I go from your spirit?
 From your presence where can I flee?
 If I go up to the heavens, you are there;
 If I sink to the nether world, you are present there.
 If I take the wings of the dawn,
 If I settle at the farthest limits of the sea,
 Even there your hand shall guide me,
 And your right hand hold me fast.

Guide me, Lord, along the everlasting way.

I feel such hope when I read these words. No matter how lost and alone I feel, how angry or frustrated I become, even when I try to hide from God, God does not abandon me. God's grace, God's love is at the core of my existence, it is the essence, the center of all creation. God calls me not only to live in hope but to share hope with the world; to be still and know God; God fill me with hope and guide me.

A Reflection

Today we begin the season of Advent, a time of preparation and remembrance and with this we begin the new liturgical year. The word "Advent" stems from the Latin word *adventus*, which literally means "coming" or "arrival." In context, this commonly refers to the coming of Jesus on Christmas day.

Advent is a time of joyful waiting. We wait hoping and expecting that He will come into our hearts and homes on Christmas day with all the peace and joy that only a loving God and Savior could bring. It is a time when we remember that Jesus came to earth over 2000 years ago to begin the Christian era with the divine gift of salvation which He holds out to all who are willing to commit themselves to His way of living.

Advent is a time of new beginnings. We have an opportunity to grow, or develop, a spirituality of waiting – a time of hope – as we pray constantly for ourselves, our world and our Church in the ancient prayer of Advent – "Maranatha, Come Lord Jesus, Come!"

Parish Religious Education

First Reconciliation: This week, the students who have prepared for to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation will experience God's loving mercy and grace which ultimately brings healing.

No matter how long it has been since your last confession, take an opportunity during the Advent season to prepare your hearts, to clean out the cobwebs left from sins tucked away but not resolved, to shower away all sin that holds you back, and to run into the arms of our forgiving and healing Lord. Experience for yourself God's loving mercy and grace this Advent season!

Confirmation: Our 68 confirmation students are nearly halfway through the program preparing them to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation where they will be received fully into the Catholic Church. Their journey to date has included lessons from the Never Alone program offered by YDisciple where they engage in conversation about life with the Holy Spirit.

The journey has also included experiences with speaker Mike Patin who taught about the teen journey of faith, and a retreat-style opportunity on the grounds of Benedictine College in Atchison, KS. Our newly reimagined program is bringing these students to relationship with Jesus and His Church through experiences with His people. Your prayers and support of these students, their sponsors and their parents are much appreciated!

Middle and High School RE: Our middle and high school students do not meet this week, but that doesn't mean there isn't something offered for them. Advent is the beginning of a new year. What better way to celebrate the new year than to start off in a State of Grace through the Sacrament of Reconciliation? Has it been a while since your last confession? Are you uneasy about returning? Is your experience with confession possibly negative? NOW is the time to accept God's loving mercy and grace and be freed from sin and guilt that holds you back from a full relationship with the Savior.

Elementary RE: It's time to pull out the Christmas decorations and the Elf on the Shelf. Up go the lights and the Christmas Stockings. But wait – we missed a season! Happy Advent! Let's also set up our Advent calendars (I've seen chocolate, cheese and even adult beverage options this year!), the Advent wreath, and the Nativity! It's not just a countdown to the commercial holiday. It's a time of preparation for the coming of Jesus! A personal tradition from Miss Lori's family. When you set up the Nativity and put away the baby Jesus, put the wise men somewhere else in your house and Joseph and Mary in a different location. Every day, move both a little closer to the stable. In our family, Mary and Joseph are moved to the stable on Christmas Eve, but the wise men do not arrive until Epiphany. There is some great Bible story opportunities in this Advent season!

The Advent Wreath



We all decorate our homes in preparation for Christmas, but do you include in those decorations an Advent Wreath? What a wonderful tradition to start with your family!

There is such rich meaning and symbolism in the Advent Wreath.

The circular shape of the wreath symbolizes God's complete and unending love for each of us and eternal life which is ours through our faith in Jesus.

The four candles, which the wreath traditionally holds, serve a purpose to dispel the darkness of the sins of the world and to help us to contemplate the birth of Jesus, who comes to redeem mankind and make all things new (Revelation 21:5).

The candles also remind us that we are meant to shine the light of Christ throughout the world (see Matthew 5:14-16).
