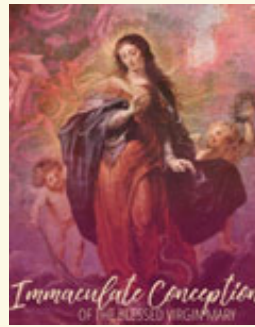

From the Pastor's Pen

On this second weekend of Advent, the prophet Isaiah speaks to us: "Prepare the way of the Lord." Preparation for future activities and needs is a very common experience for us. Students spend time in preparing for tests. Engaged couples spend time preparing for their wedding. Families spend time preparing for an upcoming vacation trip. Preparations are needed for Thanksgiving and Christmas family meals. Sacramental preparations are needed for sacraments such as baptism and First Eucharist. We give time and attention to all the details of planning.

During the season of Advent our attention turns to preparing for the celebration of the Nativity of the Lord. For many people, those preparations are only physical: preparing for travel by securing airline tickets or tuning up the car for a trip; putting up a Christmas tree and decorating the home, inside and outside; sending cards and purchasing gifts; grocery shopping and planning for meals. These are all good ways of preparing. However, as disciples of Jesus, we want our preparations to focus on the spiritual as well.

What might those preparations include? How long has it been since you have celebrated the Sacrament of Reconciliation? Maybe you are not guilty of serious sin, but a spiritual renewal can bring re-dedication and spiritual strength. If you have been absent from Mass on occasion, Advent would be a perfect time to re-commit yourself to a regular presence, not just for yourself, but because the faith community needs your witness. If you are not in a habit of daily morning and evening prayer, let your Advent preparation include this practice. If you have not paid attention to the needs of people around you – the sick, the lonely, those living in poverty, those in need of encouragement and words of hope – Advent is an excellent time for this charitable work; if you have been lukewarm in your faith life, Advent calls upon you to fire up your dedication.

Prepare the way of the Lord. As the prophet Isaiah says: Let the path to the Lord be made easier by lowering the mountains and filling in the valleys and making the winding ways straight.

The call of Advent is to open our lives more generously to receive the presence of the Lord. May your Advent journey bear much fruit.

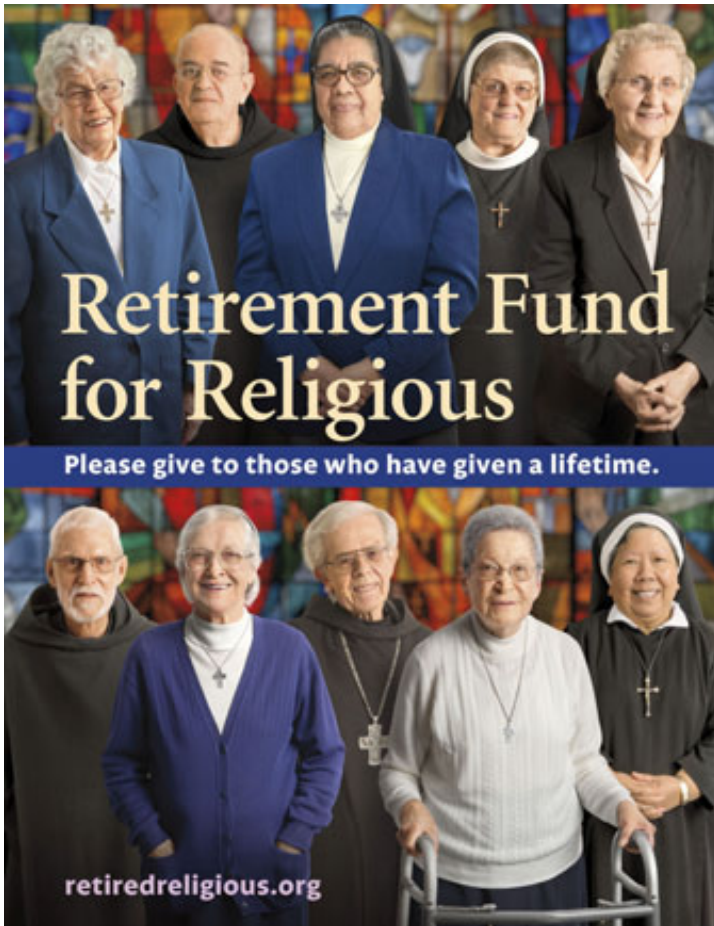

Someone is Watching and Wondering



The *Orfeó Català* is a choral society based in Barcelona, Catalonia, Spain. Though their live performances were canceled during the COVID pandemic, they found creative ways to

share their music with the world. I discovered this group on YouTube. Members of the choral group were standing on a beautiful, hillside in rural Catalonia for the performance of *Tot amirà bé* a piece performed as a gift to all people suffering during the pandemic. Although I do not speak their language, the English commentary stated the title means "Everything will be alright" or "You will be fine." I felt peaceful simply listening. I continue to listened to the *Orfeó Català* and each time I experience a deep sense of **PEACE**, which is the focus for this Second Sunday of Advent. I ask your patience as I share my understanding of God's **PEACE**.

Reflecting on my experience of God's **PEACE** I realize it is a deep inner sense of quiet, calm, grace which only God provides. In God's presence, I feel loved and significant; I sense a meaning for my life. This peace cannot be described in simple words yet it seems to embrace me, where I am, and surpasses all other feelings. Fear, anxiety, anger, frustration, and sadness seem less important. Simply being in the moment of peace, resting in God's presence, and feeling somehow less burdened makes my emptiness, loneliness, and despair fade in significance. I feel purposeful, directed and accompanied by God. The peace which God gives surpasses my limited understanding; it is more than removal of barriers and constraints which separate my life from others. God's peace opens doors that hold me in darkness; shows me light which leads to greater understanding of my connectedness and dependence on others; assures my place in creation, my need for community, and my desire to be filled with love, God's *agape*.

I am a seeker of beauty in art, music, nature, human discovery and creation. I am blessed with the comfort of a safe home, food to eat, and good health. I had a successful career in scientific research and teaching. I live in a country where I am free to worship, make choices, form and express ideas I understand personal freedom, and I know that my freedom must never compromise or impinge on the freedom of others. I believe in human interdependence and the common good. Perhaps these things contribute to my peace and your peace, but nothing surpasses the peace I experience when I recognize God's presence within me and my life. There simply is no comparison to experiencing God's presence in the unconditional love of family and friends. There is nothing so peaceful as serving God through serving others. This has been rather limited understanding of the **PEACE** which God offers to each of us. Embracing God's **PEACE**, I know "Everything will be alright!"

Daryl's Life Before St. James

The oldest of eight children, Daryl's life began in the small town of Glasgow, MO. A few years later, her family moved to Kansas City where she attended



grade school at Immaculate Heart of Mary and high school at both Bishop Hogan and O'Hara.

Her first job was as a customer service represen-

tative at the Safeway Grocery Store at 46th and Troost in Kansas City. It was here that she met Dan, the love of her life. After dating a couple of years,

they married in 1978 at St. Regis Church.



In 1980, Daryl and Dan moved to Liberty and purchased their "dream" home on three acres off H Highway - which they quickly named "Sweetland of Liberty". At that time they also joined St. James.

Life was sweet those first years. Daryl obtained a transfer to the Liberty Safeway, they had three beautiful daughters - Krystle, Kari, and Keli. Then, the unthinkable, Dan was diagnosed with cancer. Sadly, after battling that disease for sixteen months; he passed away in June 1988.

Following Dan's death, Daryl stopped working at Safeway, and became a full-time single mom to the three daughters.



The girls attended St. James School. In 1991 when the youngest was in kindergarten, she began her 30 year career at St. James as secretary/bookkeeper for the parish while Fr. Paul Sattler was pastor.

"The tree was beautiful in its greatness, in the length of its branches." —Ezekiel 31:7

What kind of Christmas tree should you buy: artificial or natural?

If you plan to keep the same artificial tree for at least 15 years, then having a reusable one can be a good idea.

Otherwise, a cultivated natural tree offers the benefit of having absorbed CO2 during its lifetime and has not been removed from a forest, disturbing its ecological niche. Many cities will pick up these trees in early January and turn them into mulch.

An even more environmentally-friendly solution is to buy a small potted evergreen, dig up a volunteer tree in your yard that's in the "wrong" space, or trim a branch from a tree on your property instead. All can provide some greenery inside during the winter and potted evergreens can be transplanted outside in the spring for reforestation.


