## Someone is Watchins and Wonderins

 As we journey in this third week of advent, with its theme of JOY, I ask myself what is true JOY; is it the same as happiness? As I reflected on the difference between happiness and joy, I found these words: "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing so that you may abound in hope by the power of the holy Spirit" (Romans 15:13). This passage from St. Paul clearly linked the past two Sundays of Advent with themes of hope and peace to this week Gaudete Sunday, yet I still struggled with the difference between happiness and joy. I understand that JOY is something much grander than happiness; it is a gift of the Spirit. I believe that finding true JOY brings a feeling of comport, wrapped in peace, an attitude of the heart which leads to hope, but how do I find/experience such JOY? In Greek the word chairo means to rejoice, be glad, be filled with JOY. The word chairo is related to charis which means grace. Putting these two words together, therefore, one may conclude that true JOY is grace which brings about a calm delight, an inner feeling of gladness, leading one to rejoice. I understand grace as pure gift from our loving God and in the past few weeks I experienced a desire, a need for rejoicing and giving thanks. When music and voices filled our cathedral during the mass celebrated in honor of St. Celia; as I helped transform our worship space in preparation for the season of Advent; gathering with family and friends to share memories and good food; completing tasks to prepare my gardens for spring; walking and feeling the sun's radiance; visiting relatives whom I had not seen for more than two years; these are just a few of the times when I felt delight, inner gladness, and a joy filled heart. What else could I do but rejoice and give thanks to God. For me it is through these experiences that I have come to understand the depth of God's love with a joy filled heart. Looking back on my life experiences I realize that God always provides what I need even through times of difficulty and darkness. I feel God's grace and mercy through the companionship and fellowship with other people. I sense God working through me when I see the smiles on the faces of candidates and catechumens. I realize that God will give me the words, the strength, and the guidance to lead and teach, to console and comfort, and to share my blessings with those in need. Perhaps these are times when I have experience true JOY and I sense the difference between JOY and happiness. Perhaps these experiences open my heart to hope which brings about peace, and leads to rejoicing in the goodness of our Lord. As we enter into the second half of the season of Advent, my prayer is that all people may come to know true JOY in their hearts and experience a desire to rejoice in all God's blessings.

## Why The 3rd Sunday of Advent is Called Gaudete Sunday

 By week three we have passed the half-way point of Advent. Jesus is near. Christmas is almost here.
The word "Gaudete" is Latin for "Rejoice." In times when the focus of our anticipation is often on the negative and fearful, this celebration is a reminder that God who loves us is still in charge and that we await his coming not with fear, but with tremendous joy.
The Third Sunday has traditionally been a respite from the penitential themes of Advent emphasizing instead the joy of the coming of the Lord. It is a reminder to seek and spread joy in the coming of Christ. Thus, the third Sunday is also known as Gaudete Sunday.
The third candle is pink and symbolizes joy. It is called the "Shepard's Candle," and is pink because rose is a liturgical color for joy. Priests may also wear rose-colored vestments on this Sunday. In his 2014 Gaudete Sunday homily, Pope Francis said that Gaudete Sunday is known as the "Sunday of joy", and that instead of fretting about "all they still haven't" done to prepare for Christmas, people should "think of all the good things life has given you.

# Preparing To Say Farewell to Daryl Her Life at St. James 

During her 30+ years at St. James, Daryl has served 6 pastors and several associate pastors. When she began her career here, St. James was under the auspices of the Society of the Precious Blood and those in this religious order were identified by the abbreviation C.PP.S. This continued until 2011 when the parish became a diocesan parish.
While she has wonderful memories of all of them, here are just a few of them.
Fr. Paul Sattler, her first "boss", warmly welcomed her, referring to her as the "new kid on the staff", always
 encouraging. He and Fr. Tom Conway loved going to K-Mart for lunch, often inviting her and anyone who was going through a rough time to come along with them. He enjoyed dressing up as Santa and had a passion for woodworking. He's pictured with two of Daryl's daughters.
Fr. William Dineen, while not an associate pastor, was a strong presence at St. James. Daryl says that he
 taught her the joy of celebrating any occasion, but especially birthdays. He was known for his excellent computer and investing skills and passed on that knowledge to anyone who would listen. The friendship between Fr. Dineen and Daryl led to many fun times, especially playing with trains with her grandchildren. As an Irishman, his favorite holiday was St. Patrick's Day.
Fr. Ron Will became pastor next. He introduced the parish to Stephen Ministry and insisted that Daryl be
 part of the original leadership team and partaking in the training in St. Louis with the other 4 leaders. This ministry was very rewarding to Daryl. He also taught the meaning of the 12 Days of Christmas to our parish. Daryl and her girls will always remember the surprise gifts for these 12 days.
Fr. Joe Miller arrived at St. James in 2004. A tremendously kind person, he reached out to Daryl and her
 girls and so many others. Always encouraging, his talent had the ability to encourage parishioners to become involved at St. James. He supported the Peru Ministry, traveling with a group of parishioners to visit our sister parish there. His compassionate heart taught us how to care for the less fortunate.
Fr. Tom Albers followed Fr. Joe Miller. Daryl refers to him as a "jolly" priest who was able to always see the potential in others. He was a visionary that served the parish well and his knowledge of scripture was deep

and enlightening. His kind spirit led to a special friendship between Daryl and him. Always a "good sport", at one of the feast day celebrations, he participated in a pie throwing contest and ended up with pie on his face!
Fr. Timothy Armbruster brought a delightful touch to ministry at St. James. Often referred to as the "ener-
 gizer bunny", he involved himself in every aspect of St. James and its ministries, especially the school. He brought a lot of extra projects to the office and somehow it turned into fun and sometimes hysteria as work went on into the night. His fun spirit of cooking, clowning, and computer skills were a few ways he brought excitement to the office.
Fr. Mike Roach arrived in 2011. He believed in all parishioners taking ownership of their church home and
 due to that Daryl loved the opportunity to reach out to others and get them involved. Fr. Mike also saw the need to build a new church and lower level. Daryl enjoyed working closely with our parishioners in the campaigns through spring bazaars, capital campaign fundraisers, trips to Royals games, bake sales and more. He led us through the Covid pandemic through his tremendous faith. He always reminds us that while, during difficult times we may not know what the future holds, but we know who holds the future. The presence of Fr. Michael Volkmer as our Senior Priest in Residence with his heartwarming and gentle spirit is so beneficial to both Fr. Mike and our parish.
Other associate pastors during Daryl's time include Fathers Dan Torson, Tom Ozanne, Dien Truong, Keith Branson, and Matt Link.
Never in her wildest dreams, did Daryl think that she'd spend 30+ years here. She went from being a secretary/ bookkeeper to becoming office manager. Along the way she was bulletin editor, helped to design, implement and is responsible for the HOPE Gift Card program, charged with scheduling meeting and keeping the Master Parish Calendar up to date, getting volunteers for a myriad of project, and was an major player in all of our past capital campaigns. All the while being, as Fr. Mike says "a source of goodness, compassion, dedication, and stability". She is the "face of St. James." It's been quite a ride. To sum it all up - Daryl says the past 30 years have been wonderful, challenging, and fun. She wouldn't have wanted it any other way!

# Our Lady of Guadalupe Feast Day December 12 



December 12 is the Feast Day of Our Lady of Guadalupe. All are invited to celebrate this feast day by attending the Rosary in Honor of Our Lady following the 5:00pm Mass this Sunday.

The feast in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe goes back to the 16th century. A poor Indian was baptized and given the name Juan Diego. On December 9, 1531 he was on his way to a nearby barrio to attend Mass in honor of Our Lady.
He was walking by a hill called Tepeyac when he heard beautiful music like the warbling of birds. A radiant cloud appeared, and within it stood an Indian maiden dressed like an Aztec princess. The lady spoke to him in his own language and sent him to the bishop of Mexico. The bishop was to build a chapel in the place where the lady appeared.
Eventually the bishop told Juan to have the lady give him a sign. About this same time Juan's uncle became seriously ill and Juan tried to avoid the lady. Nevertheless the lady found Juan, assured him that his uncle would recover, and provided roses for Juan to carry to the bishop in his cape or tilma.

On December 12, when Juan Diego opened his tilma in the bishop's presence, the roses fell to the ground, and the bishop sank to his knees. On the tilma where the roses had been appeared an image of Mary exactly as she had appeared at the hill of Tepeyac.
Mary's appearance to Juan Diego as one of his people is a powerful reminder that Mary, and the God who sent her, accept all peoples. In the context of the sometimes rude and cruel treatment of the Indians by the Spaniards, the apparition was a rebuke to the Spaniards and an event of vast significance for the indigenous population. While a number of them had converted before this incident, they now came in droves. According to a contemporary chronicler, nine million Indians became Catholic in a very short time. In these days when we hear so much about God's preferential option for the poor, Our Lady of Guadalupe cries out to us that God's love for and identification with the poor is an age-old truth that stems from the Gospel itself.
