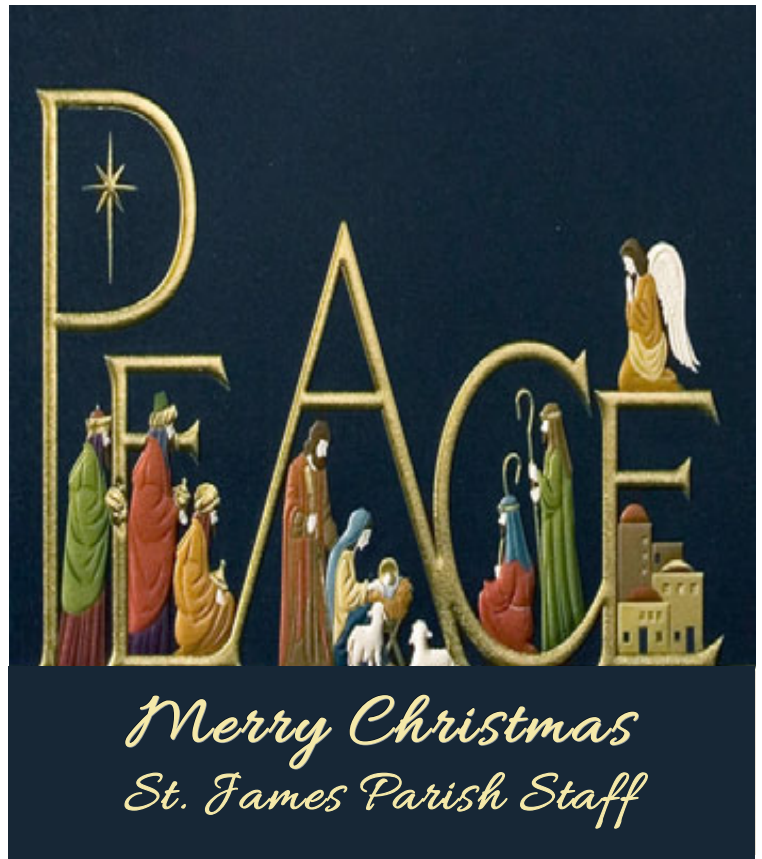

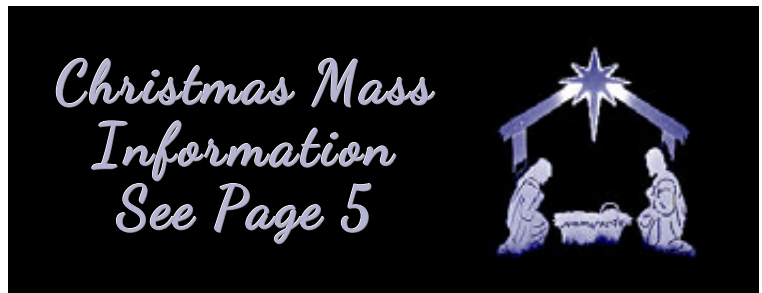
The Fourth Candle of Advent

From the Pastor's Pen

A year ago I was diagnosed with Covid (December 16) and spent 14 days in quarantine. It was a lonely time. I really missed being at St. James for the late Advent and Christmas Masses and activities. I guess in a sense it is a blessing to experience such times of isolation because these times evoke a greater appreciation for opportunities to be with other people, to enjoy conversations, and to share stories.

We might think about the situation with Joseph and Mary as they came to Bethlehem to register for the census. Yes, there were crowds around, but no spirit of welcome, no place to find lodging and comfort. They were alone with the imminent birth of a child weighing on their hearts. Can you imagine what that must have been like? They could only find refuge in a stable or cave or whatever the shelter was. If only a relative or friends could be there to assist with the delivery of the child. Yes, eventually others came: Luke tells of shepherds; Matthew tell the story of Magi. Even Joseph and Mary needed the presence and comfort of others.

We might use the story of the journey of Mary and Joseph and the nativity as a reflection of our own human needs. Sometimes people feel alone and abandoned. No one seems to care. No one is there to listen to them or assist them with their needs. They may live alone and no one (or very few) visit them. They may live in a care facility and feel abandoned. There are people who move into a new community and long for the company of family and friends left behind. There are homeless people who are dependent on charity, food kitchens, and shelters.

The lesson for disciples of Jesus? Keep an eye out for those who are lonely, those who need someone to talk to them, visit with them, listen to them. Watch out for those who, like Joseph and Mary, need a place to stay or who can be directed to sources of help. We can be, like the angels in the nativity story, beacons of hope and joy. Remember the creation story in the book of Genesis. After the creation of Adam, God said: "It is not good for the man to be alone. I will create for him a helpmate." It is not good for anybody to be alone, to feel that no one cares, to long for companionship. Let our desire to be helpmates be our Advent and Christmas spirit.

Have a blessed and joyous Christmas.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



As we journey in this fourth week of advent, with its theme of **LOVE**, I am drawn to sacramentals and devotional aids which draw us into experiences of the presence of God and opens our hearts to receive and

share God's **LOVE**. Our word sacramental is derived from the Latin *sacramentalia* and pertains to material objects or actions use to create a sense of reverence during prayer, praise, and worship. Sacramentals are used by Roman and Eastern Catholics, Orthodox Christians, Lutherans, Anglicans, Methodists, as well as people of other faith traditions. In the Bible, prayer cloths and oils are mentioned as part of the Jewish worship. Sacramentals common in our Roman Catholic tradition include holy water (used to recall our baptism), candles, blessed palms, ashes, blessed salt, holy cards, crosses and crucifixes, the stations of the cross, statues, and other forms of sacred art. Rosaries, religious symbols worn as jewelry such as a cross necklace, prayer cards, scapulars, family bibles, and blessed rings are also commonly used sacramentals/devotional aids. Our Catholic Church defines sacramentals as sacred signs which effect our spiritual nature, recognize the presence of God, enrich our desire to receive the sacraments, and lead us to an understanding of the sacredness of life. Sacramentals do not confer grace, rather sacramentals help us in preparing to receive grace and life in the Spirit. The Catechism lists three types of sacramentals: blessing, consecrations/dedications, and exorcisms, while rosaries, scapulars, medals, religious images, etc are considered devotional articles. Non-liturgical prayers (the rosary, stations of the cross, litanies, and novenas are termed devotions.

Like many of you I have a strong attachment and need for sacramentals. I am a visual learner as opposed to an auditory learner; in other words I think, learn, and understand through pictures. During the season of Advent, one of the most significant sacramentals for me is the crèche. Looking at the expressions of Mary, Joseph, the shepherds and magi, and especially the face of the infant Jesus, radiating **LOVE** helps me embrace that **LOVE** and share it with others. Not only do I feel the **HOPE, PEACE,** and **JOY** of Advent but I am also drawn to being patient, tolerant and more understanding of others. In my home, during the Advent/Christmas season I display eight different images of the Christ child including five with the holy family and other figures (eg. the Little Drummer Boy and children bringing gifts to Jesus). Perhaps you are surprised, but I continue to display at least one of these holy images all year. For me, this is no different than always displaying the crucifix next to my bed. I understand Christ Jesus' presence and great **LOVE** with the aid of various sacramentals and devotional aids; these strengthen my trust in his **LOVE** and desire to receive him each day.

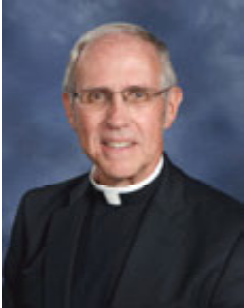

Reflecting On The Manger



The story of the birth of Jesus, as told to us by Luke, is full of joy in the midst of great conflict and sadness - even irony and rejection. It prepares us for the scandal of the cross by helping us see, in such a beautifully told story, that Jesus' mission is revealed to us, in how he came to us - in poverty and humiliation.

There, in the hay, we begin to know. There, in the manger, we begin to understand. Our God is revealed to us by coming in the lowliest of possible places. It is a meditation for our whole lives.

This story is here to bring us light in the midst of any darkness, poverty, rejection, emptiness, sinfulness we experience. By reminding us of where he where he comes, the Good New is also a revelation of who we are. We are the "people who walk in darkness." We are people who experience parts of our lives as dry and unwelcoming as that hay. We are people who, on our own, not only fail to know and understand; we are capable of tremendous infidelity and stubborn independence.

We get our word "manger" from the Latin (and so French, Italian, Spanish) root, which means simply "to eat." Jesus comes, into the greatest place of our poverty, not only to be "with us" but to nourish us. The manger can be the place we go this Christmas to be fed with the acceptance, love, and peace we need. There is no place of darkness in which we need ever feel alone. There is no situation, no loss, no tragedy that need ever leave us empty. There is no sin, no matter how selfish that will ever leave us apart from God's love.


We have prayed, "Come, Lord Jesus. Come and visit your people. We await your coming. Come, O Lord." Now, our eyes are opened to the wondrous joy of his coming to us in that manger 2,000 years ago, so that we will know and understand his coming to us in our hunger today, and ultimately so that we will long for his final coming to bring us to the banquet that has been prepared, to fill all our longing.




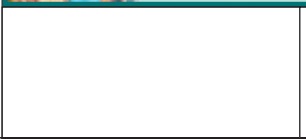
