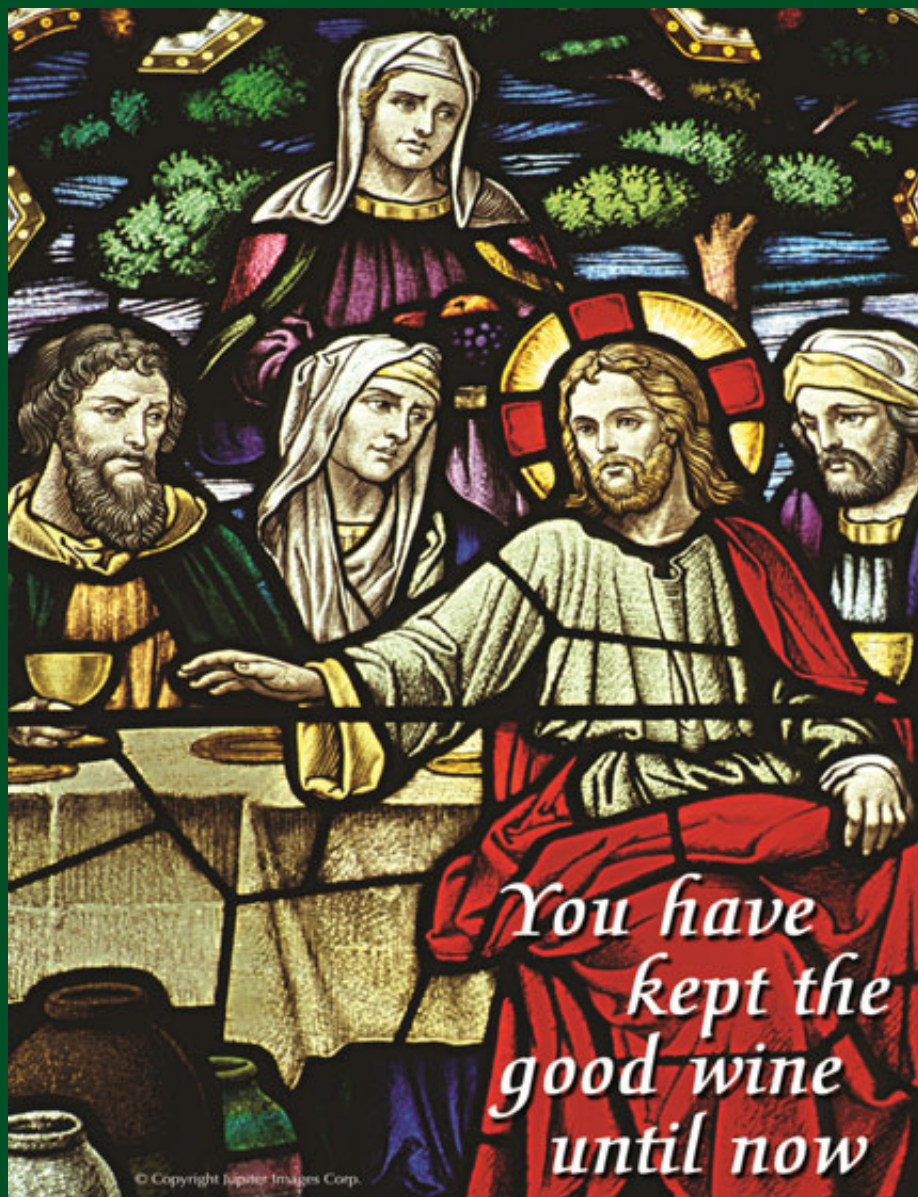

From the Pastor's Pen

One of the very controversial issues in our country in recent times has been the so-called "Heartbeat Act," signed into law in Texas in May and took effect on September 1, 2021. The law forbids abortions after the first six weeks of pregnancy. Opponents brought suit to the Supreme Court. The Court allowed the law to stand. Opponents, such as Planned Parenthood and the American Civil Liberties has joined in the fight to have the bill overturned. Those who oppose abortion see the ruling as a victory on the road to a total ban on abortions.

I bring this up because every year near the 22nd of January rallies are held across the nation in opposition to abortions. The Supreme Court ruling, Roe v Wade, was issued on January 22, 1975 which allowed abortion on demand in our country. Our Catholic Church family stands behind a pro life position, stressing the dignity and value of human life in all of its ages and stages. This coming Saturday once again pro-life people will gather in Washington, DC, as well as around our country, standing in support of human life. We pray for the safety of all who have the courage to witness to pro-life values.

However, we are not a signal-issue Church. The issue of abortion is, of course, central and critical in our pro-life teaching. But we have other cares and concerns as well. At the other end of the cycle of life, the elderly sometimes are victims of neglect and abuse. They can be left alone as though they were only a bother. We stand up for loving treatment and care for these elderly. We also stand up for children. Never should they be victims of abusive parents or elders. Never should they be put into institutions and forgotten. We stand up for the handicapped and insist that they be given opportunities enjoyed by healthy people. We affirm a just treatment of immigrants. We oppose discriminatory behavior toward people of other races and cultures and orientations. In other words, we see each person as a child of God to be treated with dignity and respect. Let's all strive to be pro-life people


Walk-ins will be welcomed if space permits. Please remember to hydrate well and eat a good meal before your appointment to help your donation go smoothly.

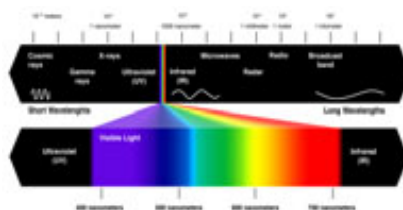

Someone is Watching and Wondering



As many of you know I was trained, did research, and taught for many years in the sciences, specifically biology and chemistry. Part of that training

was to understand the electromagnetic spectrum, pictured above. Humans can only see the visible region which is actually quite small when compared to the entire spectrum. I find it interesting that near the center of the visible region is the color green, which just happens to be the liturgical color for "Ordinary Time." Have you ever wondered why the Church chose green.?

Ordinary time represents the counted Sundays/weeks between the liturgical seasons of Christmas and Easter as well as the preceding weeks of Advent and Lent, respectively. The Liturgical year begins with the First Sunday of Advent, leading to Christmas, followed by winter Ordinary time, then Lent and Easter (that ends with Pentecost Sunday) which takes us to summer and fall Ordinary time, ending with the celebration of Christ the King Sunday plus the six weekdays before Advent. The liturgical color for Christmas and Easter is white, for the penitential seasons of Advent and Lent, purple, Pentecost is red, but why green for Ordinary time?

Again I refer to the visible portion of the electromagnetic spectrum. Green is the color associated with growth, specifically most plants that photosynthesize. As chlorophyll absorbs other colors, the human eye sees green, that wavelength that bounces back. When I think of green I think of green shoots, new life in spring, green plants providing food and nourishment in the summer, and evergreen plants persisting even in the cold, dark days of winter. Green is associated with fertility and life in nature. Green represents refreshment, rest, peace, and security. When prayer shawls have green as the dominate color the hope is the recipient will experience rest and peace from their burdens, which is prayed into each stitch as the shawl is made. For others, green represents the breaking of shackles and freedom. For Christians, green represents bountifulness, hope and victory of life over death. No surprise that green is the standard color for "Ordinary Time." Those stretches of time between Advent/Christmas and Lent/Easter are times of anticipation and hope. For me they are times of discovery and learning what it means to follow Jesus. Ordinary time represents our anticipation of hope, hope in the incarnation (God's entrance into humanity) and hope in the resurrection (God's salvation, overcoming death and offering the grace of eternal life in Christ.) I have never thought that science and religion are in competition, rather they complement one another. While science is rooted in measurable data aiding in understanding life and the natural world, religion is rooted in faith and the mystery which surrounds God's works and love.

RESPECT LIFE

From Conception to Natural Death

On January 21, the annual March for Life, the largest pro-life gathering in the world, takes place in Washington, D.C.

And in Kansas City there will be a Prayer Vigil for Life on Wednesday, January 19, from 1:00pm to 2:00pm at the Federal Courthouse, 400 E. 9th St. Pastors, students, and fellow defenders will gather to peacefully pray for the sanctity and protection of all human life in our country. Hear local pro-life leaders speak on the topics of education, activism, legislation, pregnancy, and healing.

Let us pray for those attending these rallies.

Human life is a precious gift from God. Each person who receives this gift has responsibilities toward God, self, and others, and support the belief that society, through its laws and social institutions, must protect and nurture human life at every stage of its existence.

These beliefs flow from ordinary reason and from our faith's constant witness that "life must be protected with the utmost care from the moment of conception to natural death.

In our present social context, marked by a dramatic struggle between the "culture of life" and the "culture of death", there is need to develop a deep critical sense, capable of discerning true values and authentic needs.

Respecting life is not just about life or death, it also covers a myriad of issues on the culture of human life between conception to natural death. Over the next several months, information on some of these issues conflicting society today will be published in the bulletin.

Here at St. James we have an active Respect Life Ministry that focuses on respecting, loving, and protecting human life. The group meets at 6:30pm on the second Monday of each month in the Conference Room (lower level of the church). Please consider joining our meetings.

“*Salvation*” with Dr. Michael Barber



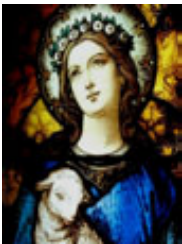
At every Sunday Mass, we as Catholics confess that Jesus came down from heaven "for us men and for our salvation."

St. Agnes ~ Virgin and Martyr Feast Day January 21



St. Agnes of Rome was born in 291 AD and raised in a Christian family. Agnes was very beautiful and belonged to a wealthy family. Her hand in marriage was highly sought after, and she had many high ranking men chasing after her. However, Agnes made a promise to God never to stain her purity. Her

love for the Lord was great and she hated sin even more than death!

Whenever a man wished to marry Agnes, she would always say, "Jesus Christ is my only Spouse."

According to legend, the young men she turned away became so angry and insulted by her devotion to God and purity that they began to submit her name to authorities as a Christian follower.

At each refusal, she continued to say "I am already promised to the Lord of the Universe. He is more splendid than the sun and the stars, and He has said He will never leave me!"

Ultimately because of her refusals, powerful men condemned her to death. She died a virgin-martyr at the age of 12 or 13 on 21 January 304.

St. Agnes is widely known as the patron saint of young girls. She is also the patron saint of chastity, rape survivors and the Children of Mary. She is often represented with a lamb, the symbol of her virgin innocence, and a palm branch, like other martyrs. She is shown as a young girl in robes holding a palm branch with the lamb either at her feet or in her arms.

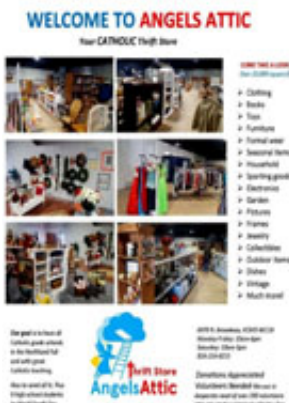

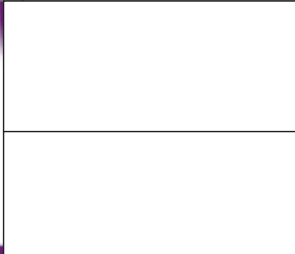
