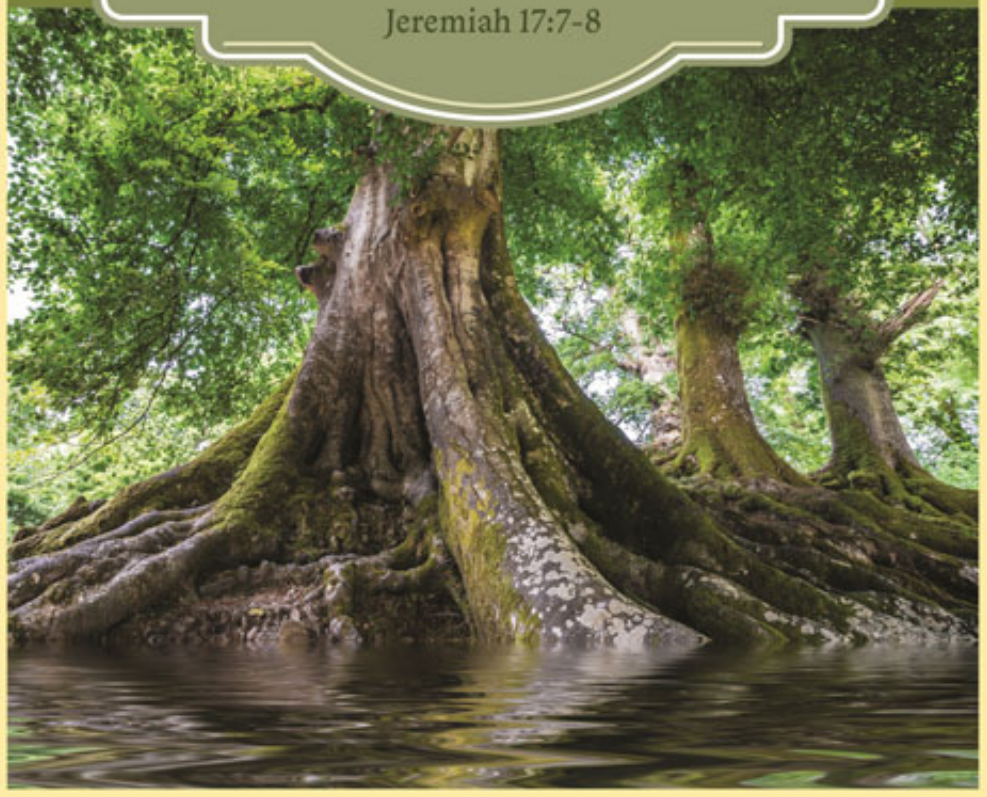

From the Pastor's Pen

The Pontifical Council of Justice and Peace declared that Tuesday, February 8, 2022, would be observed as an International Day of Prayer and Awareness Against Human Trafficking. Perhaps many Catholics did not know about this declaration, but it is vitally important that we are well informed about and involved in this social issue. Human trafficking involves using force, fraud, and coercion to obtain forced labor or unwanted sexual contacts. People of all ages, even children, can be victims, as well as people of any race, gender, or nationality. Traffickers use violence, force, and fear to lure victims into their crimes. It is difficult to determine how many people are victims of this crime. Often they are frightened by threats of harm or simply have no way of getting out of such situations. It is estimated that there may be as many as 25 million victims worldwide. How do they become victims? Often submission may be seen as a way out of grinding poverty. Or a victim is randomly snatched and forced into this way of life. Sometimes parents are so desperate that they sell their children to dealers. But no matter what the lure may be, human trafficking is a terrible crime that needs to be eliminated. Government agencies, church-sponsored advocates, and people of good will strive to make materials available to help the general public to recognize signs of such trafficking and to report any suspicious activities.

Human trafficking is recognized as a crime against humanity. The United Nations has a powerful document called "A Declaration of Human Rights." Article One states that all human beings are born free, equal in dignity and rights." Article Four states that no one shall be held in slavery or servitude. Freedom from trafficking is a basic human right.

Our Christian-Catholic teaching reflects the teaching of Jesus and our faith. Every person is a child of God. Every person is made in the image and likeness of God. "Love on another as I have loved you" is a commandment of Jesus. Scripture gives us the Golden Rule: "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you." We deplore not only human trafficking but also any kind of abuse and any kinds of behavior that demeans human dignity. I urge you to bring this to prayer with that hope that all people will be treated with reverence and respect.

My prayers are with you each day.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Who Am I?

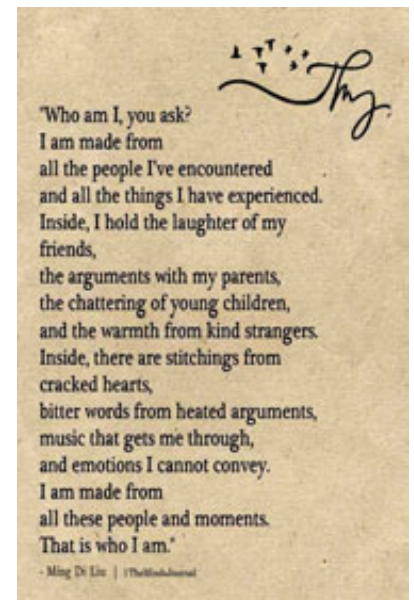
Many years ago when I returned from living in Germany my dad asked me "Who are you?" The implication of his words was I had changed in ways that were

foreign to him: the way I thought, the way I understood the world and other people, and the way I expressed myself, he did not recognize as belonging to the daughter he had embraced and sent on a journey four years earlier. I left my family as a young married woman, full of wonder and excitement and I returned home a mother of two young children, who had experienced new challenges, a very different way of living together in community, and a diversity of people brought together through circumstance. I felt confused and somewhat lost my first few weeks in Germany but I grew to accept and cherish my experiences in the country, with the people, their lifestyle and their ideals. I was confronted with situations that required new insights and concepts. Some I found easy to accept, others I felt the need to set aside as not part of who I was. Which brings me back to the question my dad asked and for which I still seek wisdom today: "Who am I?"

I could answer this question with nouns such as mother, grandmother, etc. or with groups I associate with. I could use terms which describe activities, jobs, or careers. I could simply state I am God's child. Somehow, however, these do not adequately describe my life and how I came to be the person I am today or even who I will become tomorrow, next week, next month or for the remainder of my life. Although each term describes is a part of my life, they do not answer my dad's question?

During my daily meditations I recently found the following quote by Rev. Dr. Jacqui Lewis who finds inspiration from "the African concept of "ubuntu," which means "I am who I am because we are who we are." This concept stresses a vision of relatedness; a relatedness which could provide healing to our broken, divided world. I also found this short poem which seems to express how I became who I am. Perhaps you may also relate to these words and your life journey.

Jesus commands that we love and serve one another and St. Paul reminds us that we are all part of the body of Christ. I feel I am who I am because of this relatedness, one in Christ.

St. Valentine Feast Day February 14



The history of who St. Valentine really was is cloaked in mystery. He is known to be a real person who died around the year 270. But who he really was remains an enigma. In fact, enough confusion surrounds his true identity that the Church discontinued liturgical veneration of him in 1969, though his name remains on its list of officially recognized saints.

One legend says that he was a priest in Rome during the reign of Emperor Claudius II who decided that single men made better soldiers than those with wives and families and outlawed marriage for young men. Valentine, realizing the injustice of this decree, continued to perform marriages for young lovers in secret and thus was condemned to death.

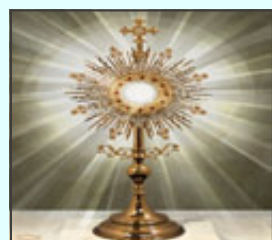


Other stories suggest that he was killed for helping Christians escape persecution. Yet another describes Valentine as the Bishop of Terni, also martyred by Claudius. Whatever the case, he

was beaten with clubs and stoned and ultimately beheaded on February 14.

Another legend says, while waiting to be executed, Valentine restored the sight of his jailer's daughter and, on the eve of his death wrote a farewell note to her, signing it, "From your Valentine." In the year 496, Pope Gelasius I questioned his true identity. However, because the similarities of these accounts led him to think they may refer to the same person, he referred to the martyr and his acts as "being known only to God" and declared February 14 as St. Valentine's Day.

The truth behind the Valentine legends is murky but the stories all emphasize his appeal as a sympathetic, heroic and, most importantly, romantic figure. And, because the heart symbolizes love, it has also become symbolic of Valentine's Day.
