

From the Pastor's Pen

How do you deal with change? For most people, small changes are just a part of life: a change of clothes; a change in diet; a change in daily activities. But greater changes can be traumatic. A change in location, moving to a new city or state. A change in career or place of work. A change in vocation, like from single life to married life. A change when a child is born into a family. For me, it was the change that came through ordination and the changes that came with a new assignments.

Transfiguration is about change. Did Jesus change? Yes, but briefly. As the gospel account says, the appearance of Jesus became a bright white, dazzling to the eye. The person of Jesus and his mission did not change. Yet the Transfiguration is an important symbol: the change in appearance and sense of joy and peace that it brought to the apostles signify the glory that will come to all disciples who remain faithful in their journey. Yes, there will be hardships, dangers, and difficulties, but in the end there will be glory, a joy and peace that can never be taken from those who persevere. Perhaps Peter, James, and John did not realize the full implications of the Transfiguration, but they reported what had happened and made sure that the event was included in the gospel

We here at St. James are very blessed to have the large image of the Transfiguration on the wall behind the altar. Each time we enter into the church we can remember story of the Transfiguration on Mount Tabor. We can remember that during our time on earth many changes come into our lives. Sometimes these are traumatic and shake our faith. Sometimes the changes are failures in the ways that we live our faith. Yet we can always have the assurance that the healing power of Jesus is always with us, giving us opportunities to make new beginnings. And we can also remember that the greatest change lies before us: the transfiguration from life in this world to the life of glory in heaven. So the image of the Transfiguration in our church offers to all of us great consolation and hope.

Lent can be a time to reaffirm our faith and change any ways that negatively affect our relationship with Christ.

My prayers are with you as you press forward during these Lenten days.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Last week I wrote of spiritual discernment, which is an integral part of the journey toward full initiation in our church and I indicated that I believe spiritual discernment should be an ongoing, life-long process for each of us who professes faith in Christ Jesus and his teachings. As I continue my journey through the penitential season of Lent, particularly at this time in history, I feel confronted by decisions that are not only personally difficult but seem trivial in light of the newest crisis in our world. (I write these words one week after the President Putin ordered an invasion of Ukraine.) I feel I am being asked to take up the cross of Christ and live my faith in support and service to those suffering and in need. Yet, I am forced to realistically ask, "What can I do at this point in my life and will my small acts make a difference?"

Part of my personal spiritual discernment is facing the reality of aging with its ever evolving physical limitations. There are times when I am frustrated that I don't have the strength and stamina I had even ten years ago. I am not complaining as I have been blessed with good health and so far, the ability to care for myself, with few limitations related to activities I enjoy. Given my limitations, however, I believe I still have a good mind and the opportunity to challenge others to understand God's call to live their faith in tangible ways. Perhaps, the pebble I throw into the waters will have a ripple affect and reach further than my words and actions to any single individual. I am challenged by the words of James: "Anyone who is wise or understanding among you should from a good life give evidence of deeds done in gentleness of wisdom. But if at heart you have the bitterness of jealousy, or selfish ambition, do not be boastful or hide the truth with lies; this is not the wisdom that comes from above, but earthly, human and devilish. Wherever there are jealousy and ambition, there are also disharmony and wickedness of every kind; whereas the wisdom that comes down from above is essentially something pure; it is also peaceable, kindly and considerate; it is full of mercy and shows itself by doing good; nor is there any trace of partiality or hypocrisy in it. The peace sown by peacemakers brings a harvest of justice" (James 3:13-18). At this point I do not know where else God will call me, the words God will put in my mouth, or the actions God will place in my heart. I do know I need to trust God and love my fellow creatures.

St. Joseph Feast Day



March 19

The feast of St. Joseph is celebrated annually on March 19th in honor of St. Joseph, the husband of Mary and stepfather of Jesus. This holiday takes place during Lent, a time of fasting, and the holiday is traditionally a meatless feast.

According to legend, during a famine in Sicily, when food was scarce and many people were starving the poor people had only their faith to rely on. St. Joseph was known as the protector of the Holy Family; thus, Italians prayed for St. Joseph to intercede for them, in an effort to ensure successful crops. Their prayers were answered, and the famine came to an end. In gratitude, people promised to make annual offerings of their most precious possession – food – in St. Joseph's honor. Thus, in many places, a St. Joseph Table filled with food is the centerpiece for celebrating this day.

St. Joseph is the patron of the universal church in Roman Catholicism, and his life is recorded in the Gospels, particularly Matthew and Luke. His important mission in God's plan of salvation was "to legally insert Jesus Christ into the line of David from whom, according to the prophets, the Messiah would be born, and to act as his father and guardian." Joseph is last mentioned in the Gospels when he and Mary frantically searched for the lost young Jesus in Jerusalem, where they found him in the Temple. The circumstances of Joseph's death are unknown, except that he probably died before Jesus' public ministry began and was certainly dead before the Crucifixion.

Themes and Sample Questions

Theme 1: Listening

- How is God speaking to us through the voices that are in our midst?
- How is God speaking to us through the voices we sometimes ignore?
- What are some limitations in our ability to listen, especially those with different views than our own?
- What space is there to listen to the voices on the peripheries of the Church, especially cultural groups, women, the disabled, the poor and marginalized?

Theme 2: Authority and Participation

- How are the baptized members of our local Church able to participate in the Mission of the Church to proclaim the Gospel?
- What hinders people from being active in our local Church?
- How is authority or governance exercised in our local Church?
- How are teamwork and co-responsibility put into practice in our local Church?

Theme 3: Dialogue in Church and Society

- To what extent do diverse peoples in our community come together for dialogue?
- How are divergences of vision, or conflicts and difficulties addressed?
- What issues in the Church and society do we need to pay more attention to?
- What experiences of dialogue and collaboration do we have with believers of other religions & with those of no religious affiliation?



To learn more about the international Synod:



A Synod, which is the process by which the Church will begin this important work is not just a convening of Bishops reflecting on a particular topic and advising the Pope. A Synod is a journey of discernment, in which the people of God are called to pray and reflect upon the Holy Spirit's will for the Church. Through our listening and our sharing, we will seek to understand what the Holy Spirit's will is for the topic being discussed – and thus, for the Church.

For the 2023 Ordinary Synod of Bishops, that topic is synodality. Simply put, synodality is discerning how the Spirit is moving through and with the Body of Christ, so that we may continue to fulfill our mission to evangelize in the world.
