From the Pastor's Pen

During these days of Lent, we strive to recognize and eliminate bad habits (vices) and we work on deepening our good habits (virtues). Today I would like to focus on one particular habit that can be both positive and negative: criticism. To be a critic is to be a judge. Some people have the gift of making judgments about works of art, movies, or books. Their work as critics is to point out what is praiseworthy or what is lacking. But all of us can be critics, both in a good sense and in a bad sense.

We call criticism that is positive "constructive criticism." Sometimes a supervisor will be called on to meet with an employee for a performance review. Here is an opportunity for constructive criticism. The employer can point out good qualities of the worker, but can also suggest ways of improvement. The words are meant to encourage, to be helpful, to be constructive. But the employer could also be very negative, speaking of faults so that the employee is hurt and devastated. All of us have opportunities to express constructive criticism. We act out of a motive of love and care. Maybe someone is unaware of his or her words or behavior that is unbecoming or lacking in virtue. Our motive is to be caring to the other person, always in the positive sense of helping another to be better.

Part of our Lenten efforts is to evaluate our own words and actions in dealing with others, whether to a spouse, a child, a parent, a friend, a fellow parishioner, or anyone else. Words can be very hurtful. Words can express disapproval on the basis of perceived faults or mistakes. Sometimes these words are spoken directly to another or they can be spoken "behind the back," in the manner of disparaging the character of another. Gossip can be a source of negative criticism. So a good Lenten meditation would be a careful examination of how we speak to or about others. If we hurt the reputation of others by badmouthing them, now is the opportunity to repent and change behavior.

The same could be said about negative criticism of the Church and its leaders. We are all very much aware of scandals in the Church. We may disagree with the words and actions of certain bishops, priests, or church leaders. Bad behavior is very easy to criticize and we've all heard examples of such words. Violators should rightly be judged and in some way punished for hurts to others. But for all of us, we strive for constructive criticism and always seek to be loving in our words. Please prayer for the Church in a special way this Lent.

It never fails. On the fourth Sunday of Lent someone always asks “why are the vestments pink, not purple today?”

The answer is that the Fourth Sunday of Lent is known as “Laetare Sunday.” The day’s theme comes from the entrance antiphon reflecting on Isaiah 66:10-11: “Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exalt and be satisfied at her consoling breast.”

Laetare is the first word – meaning “rejoice” – in the Latin text. On Laetare Sunday (as similarly with the Third Sunday of Advent’s Gaudete Sunday) the Church expresses hope and joy in the midst of our Lenten fasts and penances. Call it pink – or, more fittingly, rose – this change in color indicates a glimpse of the joy that awaits us at Easter, just before we enter into the somber days of Passiontide.

Laetare Sunday is the Church’s way of giving us a “shot in the arm” as we approach the darkness and horror of the days through Good Friday and Holy Saturday. It’s an opportunity to savor and keep in the back of our minds what awaits us on Easter Sunday – the reality that Jesus Christ is risen from the dead, and that our hearts will always be filled with joy!

Being aware of traditions and customs assists us in celebrating the beauty of our faith. As you can see, there is much associated with even a nondescript day like the Fourth Sunday of Lent – not to mention the rest of the season, or the 50 days of Easter and beyond. Take advantage of the richness of our Catholic traditions.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



As part of the Introductory Rite of every Mass we are asked to confess our sins during the penitential rite.

Throughout the year, especially in the Lenten season, we pray the *Confiteor*, which means to confess. In this prayer we confess to God and to our brothers and sisters that we have sinned through our thoughts, words, actions, and when we have failed to act, as we plead for forgiveness through the intercessions of Mary, the Angels and Saints and our brothers and sisters. For me acknowledging what I have failed to do is the most difficult piece, as I am forced to face my blindness and complicity in systemic problems within our culture and society. True reconciliation, with God and with one another, begins with self awareness and inner honesty.

This week those individuals preparing to receive the sacraments of initiation of the Catholic Church are asked to find themselves in the story of “*The Man Born Blind*” found in Chapter 9 of the Gospel of John. You will remember that as Jesus passed this man his disciples asked: “Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?” Jesus answered: “Neither he nor his parents sinned; it is so that the works of God might be made visible through him,” and followed with “I am the light of the world.” I believe Jesus is asking me to acknowledge my blindness: When do I fail to see the suffering of my brothers and sisters; When do I refuse simple acts of kindness; When do I fail to seek reconciliation; When do I ignore and refuse to share the light of Christ with those who seem so different from myself; When do I point my finger and assign blame on the poor, the uneducated, the voiceless? These questions and so many more I am forced to address if professing the *Confiteor* is to have any meaning in my path toward seeking forgiveness and reconciliation with God and my brothers and sisters.

For me, the centrality of discernment is honesty, acknowledging my relationships with others and within our society and culture, what I do and what I fail to do. St. Paul in the second letter to the Corinthians writes: “So whoever is in Christ is a new creation; the old things have passed away; behold new things have come”. And all this is from God, who has reconciled us to himself through Christ and given us the ministry of reconciliation, namely, God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting their trespasses against them and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation. So we are ambassadors for Christ (2 Cor 5:15-20a). In our very troubled and tense world how can I be an ambassador of Christ; How do I witness to God’s love unless I recognize and confront my blindness. For me, the answer lies in loving and trusting the Lord to lead me from inaction to action towards reconciliation and peace. Please pray for one another.

April is Child Abuse Prevention Month

Volunteers and Employees,

The five-year renewal of our safe environment compliance requirements has been implemented. This is a long-awaited feature, and we are very excited to see this added. Below I have explained each update.

Background Check - The five-year background check renewal will be an automated process. VIRTUS will notify you to log in and complete the background check update. If you need assistance with the Background Check update, please contact ESR Help Desk at 1-888-999-4474

Protecting God's Children 4.0 - We launched protecting God's Children 4.0 this year and it sends the message of hope and healing as well as the important five steps in the protection of children and vulnerable adults. The five-year renewal will also require you to complete the online module of PGC 4.0. This would be similar to past module updates over the years. Please use a Laptop or Desktop Computer and Chrome as your browser. Tablets and Smartphones will not process the videos.

Ethics and Integrity in Ministry (EIM) - The Ethics and Integrity in Ministry will also require a renewal every five years. When you click on the link, you will have a digital EIM. Scroll down to the acknowledgment, check the box, and enter your name and the date completing this.

The above updates are just one step we are using to build a strong safe environment.

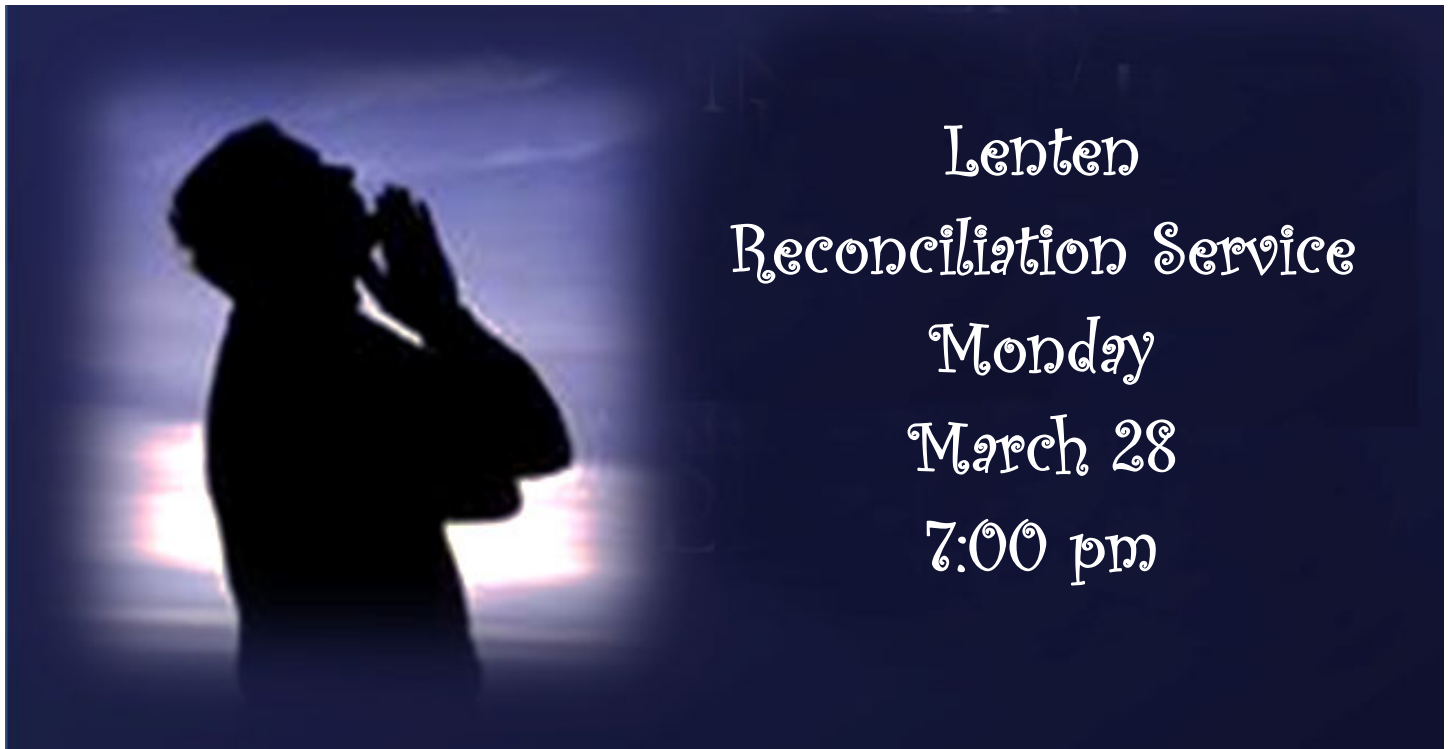
