## From the Pastor's Pen

The gospels speak of the twelve apostles. Why these men? What qualified them? We might also ask: Why not women apostles? Of course there were women disciples, for example Mary of Magdala. It seems that Jesus made a choice, looked into the hearts of the apostles and called them. We will never know why these particular men were chosen. It really does no good to speculate about this issue. What matters is that there was a call and response.

This Sunday has been declared as a "World Day of Prayer for Vocations." The word "vocations" has a wide meaning because all disciples of Jesus have a vocation: to be witnesses to the presence of Christ among us. But the intent of this day of prayer is to pray specifically for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. It is apparent that the number of priests and religious has been shrinking, especially in the northern hemisphere. In our own diocese, only one man will be ordained to the priesthood for the next two years. There are a few dioceses doing better, but in general the number of ordinations and professions has plummeted. Does this mean that God is no longer calling? Or does it mean that far fewer are answering the call to serve the Church as ordained or professed?

Some believe that Church law regarding vocations needs to change. Celibacy is, after all, an ecclesiastical law, not a doctrinal law. Some theologians suggest that maybe God is calling the Church to a change in the law: that priests be allowed to marry and that women be candidates for the priesthood. Pope John Paul II declared that celibacy is a closed issue, but some theologians think otherwise. There are already married priests in the Roman Rite by way of exception, such as pastors of other denominations converting to the Catholic faith, being ordained, and though they are married still serving as priests. Eastern Rite Catholic clergy have always been allowed to marry.

I don't think that the issue will be resolved any time soon, but the directive remains clear and important: that we pray earnestly for vocations to the priesthood and religious life, and that we continue to promote lay people to works of ministry

## BLOOD DRIVE COMING SOON MAY 17



Did you know that in the Liberty/Greater Kansas City area, 1 in 3 people will need blood at some point in their life, and 1 in 7 hospital admissions requires a blood transfusion? This means almost 600 donations are needed daily to keep up with hospital demand.

Did you know blood has a shelf life? Red blood cells have to be used within 42 days, and platelets within 5 days.

Donations have declined in recent years leaving many patients vulnerable to blood supply issues. With a congregation as big as we are blessed with at St. James, we have the resources to help with those shortages and make a huge impact in the lives of those in need.

## Someone is Watching and Wondering



Last Sunday I attended my youngest granddaughter's confirmation, and although it was not in the Catholic Church it was very moving. Before their confirmation each of the young people were asked to write an essay on their faith formation and what confirmation meant to them. They were also asked to select a passage from scripture which held special meaning to them. I was unusually surprised to read Elizabeth's scripture selection: "Jesus wept" (John 11:35). I was certainly confused regarding her choice until I read her personal, thought provoking essay.

Elizabeth began her essay by explaining how it was difficult for her, a teen age girl of fourteen, living in Parkville, MO, to find commonality with Jesus: the son of God, who lived 2 thousand years ago, was raised a devout Jew, "was perfect", i.e. never sinned, and whom she never met as one meets a new friend, teacher, or coach. She then thanked the many people who had been involved in her faith formation, each providing love, acceptance, and guidance, and how important they remain in her life. I was still waiting for why she chose that particular scripture.

We all know the context of this passage; Jesus standing at the tomb of his friend Lazarus. As Elizabeth wrote, when she read this story she realized there were times in Jesus' life when the expression of his emotions were similar to her own emotions: sadness, sorrow, anger, happiness, and even confusion. Yes, Jesus, the son of God felt pain and suffering, in moments of sadness and anguish he expressed his feelings, "Jesus wept."

Elizabeth is a very beautiful young woman, generally happy, active, and hard working. Only on rare occasions have I witnessed her weeping. Reading her essay, I also realized that my relationship with Jesus has grown as a result of understanding how closely linked his emotions are to my own. How many times have I wept at the loss of a close friend, or family member? How many times have I felt lost and alone with my feelings? How many times have I felt discouraged or misunderstood? How many times have I felt angry or frustrated when others react unkindly to my beliefs, my faith, and my efforts to reach out? Yet as I read scripture and immerse myself in the life of Christ Jesus, I discover how Jesus' humanity was so like my own, in all things but sin. Jesus trusted God, his father, and freely gave himself to the Father's will. Broken and frightened, pleading with God to "let this cup pass," Jesus gave himself fully to the father. Elizabeth's essay helped me to realize that Jesus' humanness only draws me closer to him. We do have much in common, yet I still must learn to trust and surrender, more completely to God's love.



### St. Damien of Molokai Feast Day May 10

  
St. Damien of Molokai, also called Father Damien, was a Belgian priest who devoted his life to missionary work among the Hawaiian lepers. Born in Belgium in 1840, he joined the Society of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary in 1858 and went as a missionary to the Sandwich (Hawaiian) Islands in 1863. He reached Honolulu in 1864 and was ordained a priest the same year.

Moved by the miserable condition of the lepers whom the Hawaiian government had deported to Kalaupapa on the island of Molokai, he volunteered to take charge of the settlement. He served as both pastor and physician to the colony and undertook many projects to better the conditions there. He improved water and food supplies and housing and founded two orphanages, receiving help from other priests for only 6 of his 16 years on Molokai.

In 1884 he contracted leprosy, refused to leave for treatment and died in 1889. He was beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1995 and canonized by Pope Benedict XVI in 2009.

### Our Lady of Fatima May 13

*105th Anniversary of  
Blessed Mother's  
1st Apparition at Fatima*

**We can manifest our love and devotion to the  
Blessed Virgin Mary in her month of May  
by saying the Rosary daily.**

On May 13, 1917 in the small village of Fatima in Portugal, Our Lady appeared to three shepherd children – Lucia, Jacinta and Francisco. She appeared six times between May 13, 1917 and October 13, 1917. In each and every apparition Our Lady insisted upon the praying of the most Holy Rosary.

On July 13, she said “Pray the Rosary every day in honor of Our Lady of the Rosary to obtain peace in the world . . . for she alone can save it.”

By virtue of its meditative character, with the tranquil succession of Hail Marys, the Rosary has a peaceful effect on those who pray it. The Rosary is also a prayer for peace because of the fruits of charity which it produces. When prayed well in a truly meditative way, the Rosary leads to an encounter with Christ in his mysteries and so cannot fail to draw attention to the face of Christ in others, especially in the most afflicted

In a word, by focusing our eyes on Christ, the Rosary also makes us peacemakers in the world. By its nature as an insistent choral petition in harmony with Christ’s invitation to “pray ceaselessly” (Lk 18:1), the Rosary allows us to hope that, even today, the difficult “battle” for peace can be won. Far from offering an escape from the problems of the world, the Rosary obliges us to see them with responsible and generous eyes, and obtains for us the strength to face them with the certainty of God’s help and the firm intention of bearing witness in every situation to “love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony” (Col 3:14).

During her apparition on June 13, 1917, she said, “When you pray the Rosary, say this prayer after each mystery. We refer to this as the Fatima Prayer.

**O Jesus, forgive us our sins,  
save us from the fires of hell,  
lead all souls to Heaven,  
especially those  
who have most need of your mercy.**


