

Someone is Watching and Wondering



I have been asked many times to explain my vision of catechesis, i.e. "teaching faith." My vision of catechesis is a journey with another individual who feels the stirrings of desire for something greater than

themselves; someone who gives meaning and purpose to their life. In truth I cannot teach faith. I can nurture and encourage the beginnings of faith which I believe are the workings of the Holy Spirit within each of God's daughters and sons

The English word faith, derived from Latin *fides* and Old French feid, means to have confidence or trust in a person, thing, or concept. In the context of religion, one can define faith as belief in God or in the doctrines or teachings of religion. I do not believe it is possible to teach trust, confidence, or belief. What is possible, however, is to introduce the person and teachings of Jesus which are found in sacred scripture, and helping seekers to recognize God in the wonders of creation, Jesus in the kindness and works of those they encounter in daily living, and the Holy Spirit as the source of their hope for meaning and purpose.

According to the General Directory for Catechesis, the baptismal catechumenate is divided into four stages - each associated with a different level of faith development. The **precatechumenate** is an opportunity to explore the beginnings or stirring of faith (belief in God) within the individual. The catechumenate is a time for nurturing this beginning of faith, as well as helping the individual to understand and accept the truth of conversion (giving one's life to Christ Jesus). The third stage described as the time of purification and enlightenment, which is generally associated with the Lenten season, is a time of intense reflection, centered on continual conversion and the final preparations for receiving the Sacraments of Initiation. The final stage mystogogy is the time to experience full participation in the Christian Community, which I believe does not end with the Easter season but rather is a life-long process of conversion, catechesis, that leads to a richer, more fulfilling life of faith. According to the USCCB, all evangelization / faith formation should follow this paradigm. With confidence, therefore, I restate, I cannot teach faith, but I will be happy to be a companion on your faith journey.


The bishop has assigned Juan to serve at Sacred Heart-Guadalupe Parish in

Saints Peter and Paul Feast Day June 29



These two saints are the founders of the See of Rome, through their preaching, ministry and martyrdom there.

Peter, who was named Simon, was a fisherman of Galilee. Jesus gave him the name Cephas (Petrus in Latin),

which means 'Rock', because he was to become the rock upon which Christ would build His Church.

St. Paul was the Apostle of the Gentiles. His letters are included in the writings of the New Testament, and through them we learn much about his life and the faith of the early Church.

In the year 395, St. Augustine of Hippo said of Saints Peter and Paul: "Both apostles share the same feast day, for these two were one; and even though they suffered on different days, they were as one. Peter went first, and Paul followed. And so we celebrate this day made holy for us by the apostles' blood.



Feast of the Most Precious Blood July 1



July 1st is the Feast of the Precious Blood and the month of July is dedicated to the Precious Blood.

The feast of the Precious Blood of our Lord was instituted in

1849 by Pius IX, but the devotion is as old as Christianity.

The early Fathers say that the Church was born from the pierced side of Christ, and that the sacraments were brought forth through His Blood.

After Vatican II the feast was removed from the calendar, but a votive Mass in honor of the Precious Blood was established and can be celebrated in the month of July (as well as most other months of the year).

A Supreme Court Ruling That Would Affect Roe v. Wade

The U.S, Supreme Court is expected to issue its decision in Dobbs v. Jackson by the end of June. The decision could overturn Roe v. Wade, a 1973 Supreme Court decision that essentially meant that the preborn were outside the protection of the law.

In the event that Roe v. Wade is overturned, decisions about protection of life for the unborn would revert to the individual states.

In God's eyes, all human life is sacred. God has a plan for every person – every mother, and every pre-born child.

The Church in the United States has a long history of service to those who are most vulnerable and consistently bears witness in word and deed to the beauty and dignity of every human life - including both mother and child. It has developed many ministries to serve expectant mothers who face difficult pregnancies and those who find it difficult to care for their children after they are born. For example,

- Over 150,000 low-income women deliver their babies at Catholic hospitals each year.
- Church ministries like Catholic Charities serve women and their children long after they are born, offering comprehensive social services to those in need.

- The Sisters of Life, a growing religious community of women who, by their way of life, bear witness to the beauty and dignity of every human life. The Sisters welcome pregnant women into their homes and provide life-changing material and spiritual resources to women in crisis.
- Another rapidly growing initiative is "Walking with Moms in Need," sponsored by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. This parish-based process helps parishioners connect with local mothers facing difficult or challenging pregnancies, identifying local resources and filling the gaps so that pregnant and parenting women receive the material, spiritual, and emotional support they need.

Let us pray that the final Supreme Court decision will be peacefully accepted and respected by all.

Our focus must continue to be providing support and resources to families in need and connecting with expectant mothers who need reassurance they are not alone.

Let us pray for the conversion of hearts and minds to embrace each child as a gift from God.



Why Is Ordinary Time Called Ordinary?

Ordinary Time is called "ordinary" not because it is common but simply because the weeks of Ordinary Time are numbered. The Latin word ordinalis, which refers to numbers in a series, stems from the Latin word ordo, from which we get the English word order. Thus, the numbered weeks of Ordinary Time, in fact, represent the ordered life of the Church – the period in which we live our lives neither in feasting (as in the Christmas and Easter seasons) or in more severe penance (as in Advent and Lent), but in watchfulness and expectation of the Second Coming of Christ.

It's appropriate, therefore, that the Gospel for the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time (which is actually the first Sunday celebrated in Ordinary Time) always features either John the Baptist's acknowledgment of Christ as the Lamb of God or Christ's first miracle – the transformation of water into wine at the wedding at Cana.

Thus for Catholics, Ordinary Time is the part of the year in which Christ, the Lamb of God, walks among us and transforms our lives. There's nothing "ordinary" about that!
