


The Parish Office Will Be Closed On Labor Day, Monday, Sept. 5

From the Pastor's Pen



This Thursday, September 1, we are invited to observe the "World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation." I suspect that few people will know about, care about, or observe this special day. Yet, people of our world family need only open their eyes to see what we are facing with the degradation of our planet: the earth, the air, and the water. If we have enough water, we don't think about the scarcity of water, the pollution, the drought in many parts of our world family. If we have a good quality of air to breathe, we don't think about places of extreme smog and air pollution. If we see fields of crops around us with a bountiful harvest, we don't think about food scarcity and drought in parts of our world family. Yet, as we believe from the teachings of our Christian faith, we are all brothers and sisters, we are a human family, we all have a stake in the well-being of planet earth.

In May of 2015, Pope Francis issued a powerful encyclical letter called "Laudato Si," in English meaning "Praise Be to You," written in the spirit of Francis of Assisi's "Canticle of the Creatures." In his poem, Francis of Assisi lifted up all creation in praise of God, celebrating the goodness of the earth and every created thing. Pope Francis echoes this praise. The subtitle of his encyclical is "Care for our Common Home." In six chapters our Holy Father points out current problems related to the environment, causes of this ecological crisis, and suggestions for responding to this crisis, an approach in action. He asks that all Catholics, and in fact all people of good will, to recognize the problems and to take steps to address the crisis. This includes a drastic reduction of carbon emissions and other greenhouse gases, development of renewable energy sources, and transition to energy-efficient methods.

Some people scoff at the idea of climate change and believe such changes have come in cycles in the history of the earth. I think they are blind to reality. Some environmentalists believe that it is already too late. Still, I am inviting all parishioners to think carefully about your own practices and join in efforts to save the earth and examining your own use of the earth, the air, and the water. Join with your prayer this Thursday, "World Day of Prayer for Creation."

My prayers are also with all of you each day.

OCIA
A Journey in Faith

Last weekend St. James held a Ministry Fair in which everyone was invited to explore ministry groups currently active in our parish. For the first time I introduced the new acronym for formation of adults, exploring our Catholic faith tradition (specifically anyone desiring to receive the sacraments of initiation in the Roman Catholic Church). The *Order of Christian Initiation of Adults* (OCIA) is a journey of conversion for catechumens (the unbaptized), candidates (those baptized in another faith tradition), accompanied by all practicing Catholics. As such this journey is a call to conversion (on-going faith formation and growth) of the entire faith family. If all members of our parish fully embraces and walks this journey of discovery and growth in faith with those seeking the sacraments of initiation, our community becomes more focused on Jesus, centering our ordinary daily lives around his teachings, mission, and call to love and serve God and one another.

Initiation is about identity; it defines who we are and what we hold dear. Initiation is a journey that requires redefining our life. This may be risky and challenging. Redefining who we are means shifting the focus of our lives from what we think and desire to what God is calling us to become. A true journey of conversion requires a reexamination of social norms and values, family experiences and traditions, spheres of influence, groups in which we participate, our use of media, even investments, professional activities, and how we spend leisure time. There are many difficult questions to consider: "Do I objectify an individual or group of people; Am I aware of or do I participate in social systems which perpetuate divisiveness; How do I share God's grace; and Where are my energy, my talents focused?" These are questions not just for catechumens and candidates on the journey toward initiation, rather these are questions each of us should and must ask as we continue our journey of faith, a continuous *Mystagogy*, filled with challenging experiences of renewal and conversion.


Welcoming neophytes is a public, liturgical journey not some private affair. The *Order of Christian Initiation of Adults* turns the church outward, not inward, inviting the baptized faithful to embrace the teachings of the Second Vatican Council; "We are the church." We are called to become what we receive; we are ingressed, called to love and serve indiscriminately. We are called to be witnesses of God's love, God's mission, God's service. We are called to give freely without expectation of reward.

Yes, *Someone is Watching and Wondering*: watching the baptized faithful and wondering, what is being a Catholic all about; what does it mean, how will my life change? Enjoy the journey.
