Hearing Assistance Now Available At All Masses



Beginning this weekend, September 24-25, we are pleased to offer Hearing Assistance at Masses.

We currently have 4 devices that can be signed out prior to Mass in the Ushers Room.

The device is very simple to operate, simply turn on the receiver and slip the ear piece over you ear. It acts as your own personal amplifier. You are responsible for adjusting the volume to suit your needs.

When Mass is over, turn them off and return them to the Ushers room, signing them in, so they can be sanitized and ready for the next Mass.

From the Pastor's Pen

This Friday I will be leaving for Washington, DC, to preside at the wedding of my grandniece at St. Aloysius Church. I will be returning next Sunday. I want to highlight four important liturgies that we will be celebrating this week.

On Tuesday we will honor the memory of St. Vincent de Paul. He was born in Pouy, France, in 1581. After he was ordained a priest, he worked among the poor peasants, providing food and clothing. He founded a religious community called The Congregation of the Mission, often called the Vincentians. Together with St. Louise de Marillac he founded an order of Sisters, The Daughters of Charity. He was renowned for his compassion, humility, and generosity.

On Thursday we join the Church in celebrating the feast of the holy archangels, Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael. In the book of Daniel, Michael is depicted as leading the battle against Satan. We call up him to be our defender and protection against evil spirits. Gabriel is shown to be the great messenger, the one who announced the mystery of the incarnation to Blessed Mother Mary. In the book of Tobit, Raphael represents God's healing touch.

Friday is the feast of St. Jerome. Born in Dalmatia in 330, he studied in Rome, proving to be a profound student, especially in the study of Scripture and linguistics. Eventually he moved to the area of the Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem. He is best known for translating the Scripture into Latin, making it much more widely available. He is attributed to the saying: "Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ."

Finally, on Saturday we celebrate the feast of *Thérèse* of Lisieux, a city in northern France. At the age of 15, by way of exception, she entered the Carmelite monastery. Most of her days were spent in manual labor and doing simple acts of charity. She is best known for her "little way" of spirituality. You would find great benefit in reading her autobiography, "The Story of a Soul."

We venerate the saints, not that we could live up to their standards of holiness, but because they show us a way of Christian living and they intercede for us. Honor them!

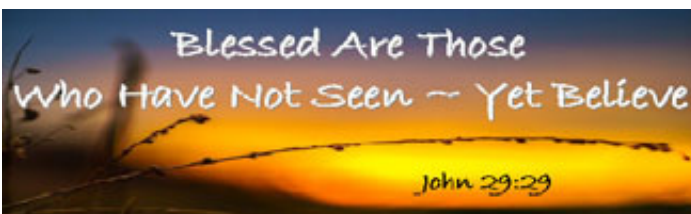

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Last week I wrote some thoughts on Humility. Today my focus is forgiveness. We are all familiar with the words found in the Lord's prayer,

"Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us," but perhaps less familiar with the words that follow in Matthew's gospel: "If you forgive others their transgressions, your heavenly Father will forgive you. But if you do not forgive others, neither will your Father forgive your transgressions" (Matthew 6:14-15). Every time I pray this prayer or read these words, I feel challenged to try to live what I pray.

Jesus taught that we are called to love and serve God and one another. I think the essence of love and service is tightly linked to understanding and forgiveness. How is it possible to love and serve if I cannot have difficult conversations, which can lead to understanding of other's beliefs, points of view, culture, and lived experiences. I have come to believe that my thoughts, my beliefs, my way of living are not absolutes, not without room for change. I depend on others to lead me closer to God. I accept the fact that I have been formed by many people with different ideas, experiences, and possibilities for our futures together as God's children. Conversion requires understanding which in turn requires loving, unconditional forgiveness; admitting my shortcomings, mistakes, and sin toward God and other human beings. To say "I was wrong, please forgive me," can be difficult and humbling. To ask or seek forgiveness from another person, requires putting my ego and fear of rejection aside. I must seek and offer forgiveness without waiting for acceptance by the other. Trusting that God forgives and loves should be the basis for my offering and seeking forgiveness. Praying the "Our Father" with a sincere heart and love of God, seeking forgiveness, leaves no doubt as to the requirement for me to also forgive unconditionally. Fr. Richard Rohr has stated: "People who know how to forgive have known how good it feels to be forgiven, not when they deserve it, but precisely when they didn't deserve it."

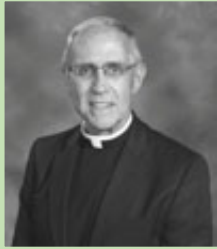
In Chapter 3 of the letter to the Colossians, we read: "Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience, bearing with one another and forgiving one another" (verses 12-13). For me seeking forgiveness and offering forgiveness are part of the same movement. Seeking God's mercy requires sharing God's love, forgiveness, and mercy with one another. One flows from the other. We depend on God, who asks us to share our gifts for the good of all creation; to be kind, and caring, to love and to forgive, to be humble before God and one another.

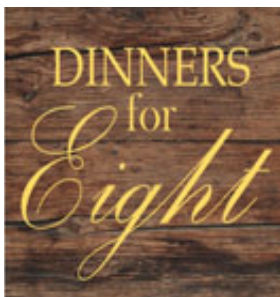
