#### Someone is Watching and Wondering



Recently I have been thinking quite a bit about our church's teachings on social justice, including the U.S Catholic bishops pastoral letter of 1986, *Economic Justice for* 

All. In this letter the bishops stress that all economic life should be shaped by moral principles; economic choices and institutions must be judged by how they protect or undermine the life and dignity of the human person, support the family, and serve the common good; and that the moral measure of economic systems should be rooted in how the poor and vulnerable are fairing. As Christians, we must ask how our society, culture, and economic systems 1. protect the poor and vulnerable, 2. call for each of us to participate in families and communities, 3. respect the life and dignity of every human person, 4. protect the rights and responsibilities of all, 5. value the dignity of work and the rights of workers, and 6. stand in solidarity with one another. I feel I fall short of these teachings each time I fail to recognize that every human is created/willed into being, in the image and likeness of God, equally endowed with rational souls, graced with original holiness, and exists as God's beloved child. Catechism #1931 states: "Respect for the human person proceeds by way of respect for the principle that 'everyone should look upon his neighbor (without any exception) as {another self,} above all bearing in mind his life and the means necessary for living it with dignity'." In other words, we must stand in solidarity to protect the dignity, respect, and basic human rights of every human. No one person or group of people are outside God's love and grace, therefore, as an individual I must work towards the common good and a system of social justice that never belittles, condemns, deprives, excludes, objectifies, or denies another person's dignity as one of God's children. Human solidarity is demanded for my participation in the life of Christ and goes beyond economics, material goods, and status. Human solidarity also requires "spreading the spiritual goods" of my faith. I must share my gifts, talents, and time, with which I have been graced, with my brothers and sisters, my human family. No individual born into this world is equipped with everything he/she needs. We are all dependent on one another for developing physically, mentally, emotionally, and spiritually. I differ from you in appearance, perhaps age, physical abilities, intellectual or mental aptitudes, benefits derived from social experiences, commerce, and family. Our differences encourage, in fact necessitate, the practice of generosity, kindness, and sharing. Solidarity requires fostering mutual respect of our differences, interdependence, and love for one another, which in turn enriches our culture, social systems, communities, faith and our individual lives. Stand in solidarity with all God's beloved children.

# October is Respect Life Month



The theme of this year's Respect Life Month is "called to serve moms in need".

Our Blessed Mother models a profound witness to love and life in the Gospel account of the Visitation. Luke's Gospel tells us that, when

Mary learns that her cousin Elizabeth is pregnant, she travels to the hill country "in haste" (Lk 1:39). Despite being unexpectedly pregnant herself, Mary responds to this news with urgency.

She embarks on a long and perhaps difficult journey to be with her cousin during her time of need, bearing Christ to her as He lay quietly hidden in Mary's womb. And, although Jesus is veiled from view, when Mary first arrives John the Baptist leaps for joy in Elizabeth's womb, recognizing the presence of Christ (Lk 1:44). Mary, with Jesus, spends the next three months at Elizabeth's side.

The witness of our Blessed Mother invites us to become more aware of the needs of pregnant and parenting moms in our own parishes and communities. A woman with an unexpected pregnancy may have any number of fears and challenges: facing judgment from her friends and family, losing her job or housing, or being abandoned by the father of her child.

Following Mary's example, we can ask ourselves how to better know these mothers, listen to them, seek understanding, and help them obtain the necessities of life for themselves and their children. How can we, like the Blessed Mother, lovingly support mothers in welcoming and caring for God's gift of life?

Throughout the whole of Scripture, Mary's words are few. Yet, in her sacred encounter with Elizabeth, a powerful declaration pours from her lips. Mary proclaims to all generations that the Lord *lifts up the lowly, fills the hungry with good things*, and *remembers his promise of mercy from age to age* (Lk 1:46-56). In both word and deed, Mary speaks a message of *hope* – not only to Elizabeth, but also to every mother in need and to each of us.

Mary's witness is an invitation to step out in love and compassion. It is a summons to *make haste* to help vulnerable women who may be isolated and alone. By doing so, we too can bear Christ within us and help others experience His presence.

Inspired by the Blessed Mother's example and guided by the Holy Spirit, may we offer Christ's presence and love to mothers in their time of need through our faithful service and support.


A concert in her honor will be held on Sunday, Oct. 9, at 3pm at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception.

The month of October each year is dedicated to the Most Holy Rosary, primarily because the Feast of the Holy Rosary is celebrated on October 7.

According to an account by a 15th-century Dominican, the first rosary was given to St. Dominic in 1206 by Mary when she appeared to him after he had been praying and doing severe penances because of his lack of success in combating the Albigensian heresy. Mary praised him for his valiant fight against the heretics and then gave him the Rosary as a mighty weapon, explained its uses and efficacy, and told him to preach it to others.

In 1571, to commemorate the miraculous victory of the Christian forces in the Battle of Lepanto on October 7 of that year, Pope St. Pius V officially approved the Rosary in its present form and declared October 7 an "annual feast," attributing the success of the battle to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

In 1884 Pope Leo XIII dedicated the entire month of October to the Rosary.

John Paul II called the Rosary his favorite prayer, in which we meditate with Mary upon the mysteries which she as a mother meditated on in her heart

Let us all consider praying this beautiful prayer of the Rosary more often (many pray the Rosary daily)

- not just during October but throughout the year.

Praying the Rosary allows us to draw closer to Jesus and Mary by meditating on the great mysteries of our salvation.

Praying the Rosary also helps to fight daily temptation, to slow down and find calm, to live a life

connected to Jesus Christ, to remain connected to the loving care of Our Mother Mary and to pray for others in a strong, dedicated way.



#### Saint Faustina Kowalska Feast Day - October 5



The Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments issued a decree on Monday, May 18, 2020, inscribing the celebration of Saint Maria Faustina Helena) Kowalska, virgin, in the General Roman Calendar.

The decree – issued on behalf of Pope Francis – came on the same day as the Church marks 100 years since the birth of Karol Wojtyla. The future Pope St. John Paul II canonized St. Faustina in the year 2000.

Born in the village of Głogowiec, Poland in 1905, and dying in Krakow in 1938, Saint Faustina spent her short life among the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy, generously conforming herself to the vocation she received from God and developing an intense spiritual life, rich in spiritual gifts and in faithful harmony with them. In the Diary of her soul, the sanctuary of her encounter with the Lord Jesus, she herself recounts what the Lord worked in her for the benefit of all: listening to Him who is Love and Mercy she understood that no human wretchedness could measure itself against the mercy which ceaselessly pours from the heart of Christ. Thus she became the inspiration for a movement dedicated to proclaiming and imploring Divine Mercy throughout the whole world.

Canonized in the year 2000 by Saint John Paul II, the name of Faustina quickly became known around the world, thereby promoting in all the parts of the People of God, Pastors and lay faithful alike, the invocation of Divine Mercy and its credible witness in the conduct of the lives of believers.

Right now, the information we have regarding cost is very limited, but fundraising efforts have already begun and more information will be provided as it is received.


