



Someone is Watching and Wondering



I only speak for myself when I state there are many times when I am reading scripture that I think how wonderful if God would appear to me, or if I could walk with Jesus, sit by him and ask questions, or simply touch his hand. I

read how various people in the Hebrew scriptures, such as Moses had these theophanies. The followers of Jesus knew him in real time, they could follow him, ask questions, heed his guidance, and feel his love through a look, word or touch. St. Paul heard the voice of Jesus speak directly to him. I suppose you might think I am envious of these encounters with God, however, my true, inner most desire is simply to be closer to, to fall more deeply in love with, and to follow where Jesus/God leads. In spite of so many sites and sounds around me each day, there are those precious moments when I recognize God's gentle voice and feel his touch.

You may well ask, "How does she know, recognize God's voice?" My answer is simple. When what I hear, feel, experience, feels right deep within my being even as my rational mind tells me "You are crazy!" I know I'm not crazy or hallucinating because at those moments I feel peaceful, filled with hope. My theophanies are not frightening or stressful. Rather they come unexpectedly through music, art, literature, nature, and in both the needs and help of others. I feel quite certain that I am following God's will when I am wholly present to another person, listening to their fears, pain, doubts, or confusion. I also feel God's presence when I accept another person's kind word, complement, or offer to help, to listen to me. I experience God as a witness to new life and in my grief at the loss of life. You may find this odd, but I also know God's presence in the simple things: cleaning and decorating my house or our worship space, folding clean clothes, preparing meals and eating a meal with another person. I feel God's presence sitting quietly in my favorite chair on my patio, watching the birds and clouds, feeling the wind, smelling the scents of the seasons, watching a sunrise or sunset. These things are truly God's work in ordinary, everyday experiences which we can all share. There is no cost, no ownership, nothing unique, except the way we allow God's love, mercy, and healing to flow through our bodies, minds, and hearts; to lead us through ordinary experiences, to continue the ministry of Jesus; to walk with him, and to offer His kindness, gentleness, and care to others. I had a very wise woman tell me "You are the Church and You must do God's work." Excellent advice that I try to follow. I find sacred space to be with God; sacred space that God allows me to share.

May you experience sacred space to experience theophany; Naaman did, and he took soil home with him to always be reminded of God's eternal presence.



Pope St. John Paul II wrote that the Gospel of life is at the heart of Jesus' saving message to the world. In taking on human flesh, dwelling among us, and sacrificing his very life for our redemption, Christ reveals the profound dignity of every human person. This God-given dignity does not change with our stage of life, abilities, level of independence, or any other varying circumstance.

Rather, it is rooted in the permanent fact that each of us is made in the image and likeness of God, created to share in the very life of God himself. The human person is a "manifestation of God in the world, a sign of his presence, a trace of his glory". And we must reflect this truth in how we act and how we treat one another.

The truth of the Gospel of life is at the foundation of who we are as followers of Christ. In his earthly life, Jesus provided the perfect model for how we are to love our neighbor and live out the Gospel call: "Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me". Jesus calls each of us to "care for the other as a person for whom God has made us responsible".

In his encyclical on the Gospel of life, Pope St. John Paul II recognizes the full range of threats against human life, from poverty and malnutrition to murder and war. He places particular emphasis, however, on threats to life at its beginning and end – precisely when it is most in need of protection. In modern times, children in their mothers' wombs and those approaching the end of their lives are certainly among the "least of these" in our world's estimation. Practices such as abortion and assisted suicide tragically reject the truth that human life is always to be cherished and defended with loving concern.

Let us reflect on how we personally live out the Gospel:

Do I talk about and act towards others as I would talk about and treat Jesus himself?

Do I inform myself of the Church's teachings and engage in the civic arena as first a follower of Christ?

Do I support and advocate for laws and policies that protect and defend human life?

Do I help pregnant and parenting mothers in need?

Am I ready to support a loved one nearing death?


Military Outreach Ministry

St. Luke Feast Day October 18



Luke, the writer of the Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles, has been identified with St. Paul's "Luke, the beloved physician". We know few other facts about Luke's life from Scripture and from early Church historians.

It is believed that Luke was born a Greek and a Gentile. According to the early Church historian Eusebius Luke was born at Antioch in Syria.

The Acts of the Apostles follows the trail of Luke's Christian ministry. We know nothing about his conversion but looking at the language of Acts we can see where he joined Saint Paul.

Luke is the loyal comrade who stays with Paul when he is imprisoned in Rome about the year 61: After everyone else deserts Paul in his final imprisonment and sufferings, it is Luke who remains with Paul to the end: "Only Luke is with me"

Luke's inspiration and information for his Gospel and Acts came from his close association with Paul and his companions. His unique perspective on Jesus can be seen in the six miracles and eighteen parables not found in the other gospels. Throughout Luke's gospel, Jesus takes the side of the sinner who wants to return to God's mercy.

Reading Luke's gospel gives a good idea of his character as one who loved the poor, who wanted the door to God's kingdom opened to all, who respected women, and who saw hope in God's mercy for everyone.

The reports of Luke's life after Paul's death are conflicting. Some early writers claim he was martyred, others say he lived a long life. Some say that he preached in Greece, others in Gaul. The earliest tradition we have says that he died at 84 Boeotia after settling in Greece to write his Gospel.


