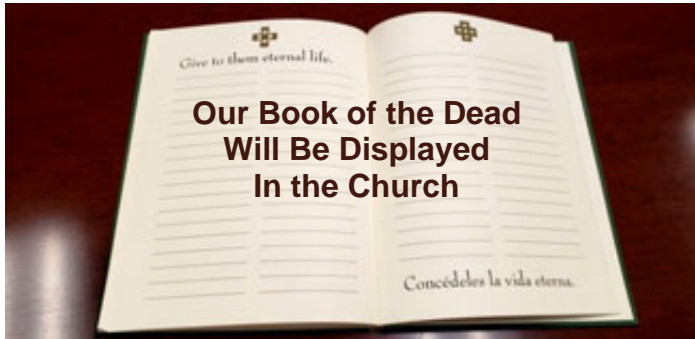

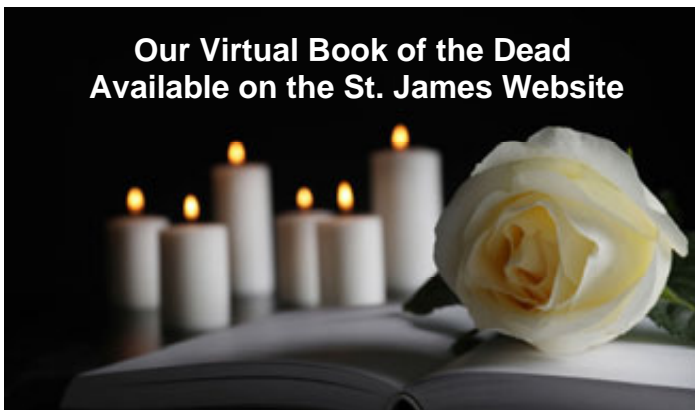

Someone is Watching and Wondering



If you tried to carve a pumpkin today, while looking in the mirror, what would your Jack-O-Lantern look like? Would there be a smiling face, which when lit with a candle becomes a welcoming site for others, reflecting

the "Light of Christ"? Would your Jack-O-Lantern be sad, or angry looking? Perhaps your Jack-O-Lantern would wear a mask, hiding who you are, disguising your feelings toward yourself or others. Maybe your Jack-O-Lantern would be whimsical and fun. There is no single answer; it's up to you what you see reflected in the mirror and how you choose to reveal yourself to others.

Last Sunday Pope Francis wrote: "Let us imagine that the Lord came today on earth. Unfortunately he would see many wars, much poverty, and many inequalities. At the same time he would see tremendous technical conquests, modern means, and people who are always running, who never stop. But would he find someone who dedicates time and affection to him, someone who would put him in first place? Above all let us ask ourselves "What would he find in me. . .in my life, in my heart? What priorities would he see in my life?"

When I put Pope Francis' questions to what I see when I look at my mirrored reflection, I realize I still have a long way to go before I can answer "YES" to putting Jesus first in my life. I find myself running, always running to tackle yet another task, to complete another project, to get from point A to point B. Although I try to begin each day spending time with God, I find there are times when even these moments are rushed as my mind circles round and round like a tornado, focusing on what I need to accomplish next. There are times when I feel as though I am drowning in "to do lists," when my patience is running thin, and my uncertainties are ballooning out of control. Yet that is also when I find myself seeking God's help and guidance; when I am forced to stop, focus, and reprioritize my attention toward God's call to be open to where love and service leads me.

Ironic, but if I were to carve a Jack-O-Lantern to represent myself, I would need not one but many. I see myself with many faces, and hopefully some of them reflect God's love.

November is Military Family Appreciation Month



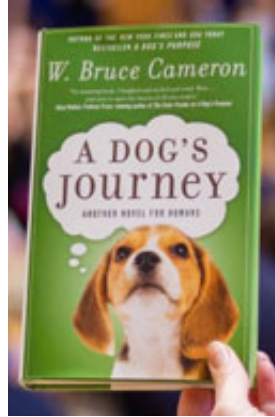
Military Family Appreciation Month was established in 1996 by the Armed Services YMCA, with the U.S. Government recognizing the occasion every year since.
