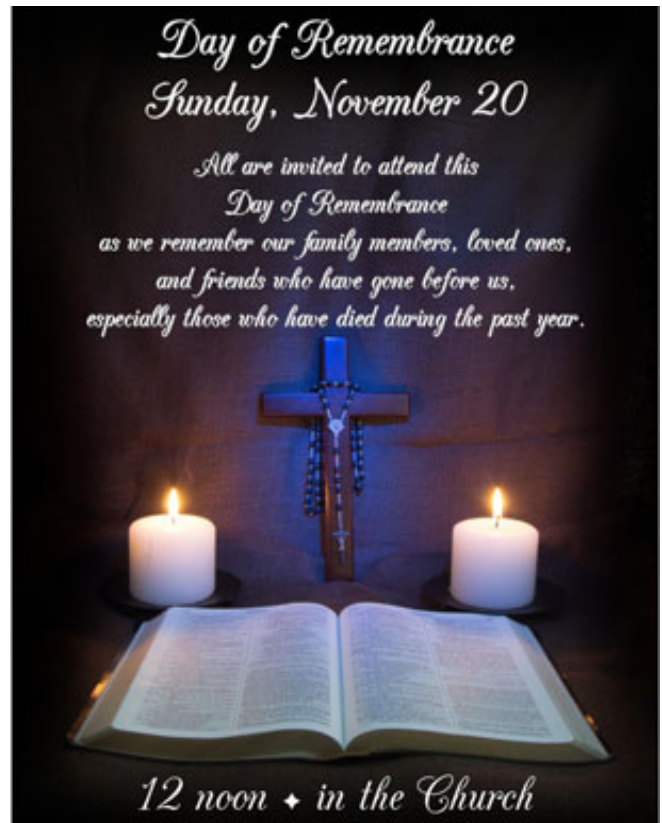

From the Pastor's Pen

We might call our cell phones "smart" because of so many features. One such feature is the ability to see who is calling before responding. We don't like those pesky calls that are scams or sales pitches. But we welcome calls from family and friends with whom we can visit and catch up on the news.

There is another kind of call that we who are people of faith know as a "vocation." The word "vocation" implies a particular state of life: the priesthood or religious life; married life; or the single life. This Sunday we begin what is known as "National Vocations Awareness Week." Many adults have already answered the call and live as priests, married, or single. Younger folks, those in their late teens or twenties, may be considering what their state of life may be. If they profess the Catholic faith, they are encouraged to pray about this decision with the belief that God has a plan for each person. It's not just about an occupation but about a vocation. They might ask: Do I journey through life in the company of a spouse? Do I live my life as a single person? Or do I serve the Lord and the Church as a priest or a member of a religious congregation of men or women? The cell phone doesn't have an app for the answer. Each person must carefully and prayerfully discern God's will.

In designating this week as National Vocations Awareness Week, the bishops recognize that even though the vocations of marriage and the single life are equally important, the stress is on discernment to the priesthood and religious life. The number of priests and religious has drastically decreased in recent years, especially in North America and Europe. Is God not calling? Or are possible candidates not listening? Yes, scandals in the priesthood and religious life have had a negative effect. But there are also many dedicated men and women who have served the Church with conviction and generosity. Young men and women, I ask that you pray with sincerity and openness to hear God's call about your vocation in life. Parents, please be open to fostering an openness to the possible call to religious life of your child or children.

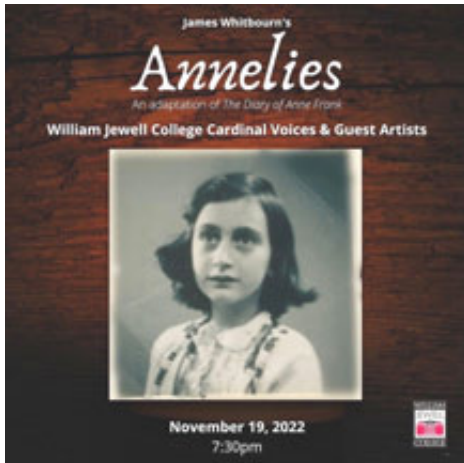

Someone is Watching and Wondering



As many of you know, I am fascinated by science. Even as a child, with Sear's Christmas Catalog in hand, I asked my parents and Santa for a Chemistry set. Mom said NO! No

surprised, therefore, to learn I am fascinated and amazed by the images coming from NASA's James Webb Space Telescope. The above image "has captured a lush, highly detailed landscape – the iconic **Pillars of Creation** – where new stars are forming within dense clouds of gas and dust. The three-dimensional pillars look like majestic rock formations, but are far more permeable. . .made up of cool interstellar gas and dust that appear – at times – semi-transparent in near-infrared light" (NASA update October 24, 2022). The wavy lines at the edges of some pillars are ejections from stars that are still forming within the gas and dust. . .[and] are estimated to be only a few hundred thousand years old; for reference our galaxy, the Milky Way is believed to be 13.61 billion years old. Perhaps you are wondering, "So where is Sandy going with this? I will try to explain the ideas and concepts swirling in my mind.

Last Sunday we read from the Book of Wisdom (11:23 -12:2): "Indeed, before you the whole universe is as a grain from a balance, or a drop of morning dew come down upon the earth...how can a thing remain, unless you willed it; or be preserved, had it not been called forth by you? But you spare all things, because they are yours, O Lord. . .for your imperishable spirit is in all things!" Theologically we are taught that God's time is not the same as our time. Putting this scripture with the idea of God's time, I am convinced that creation continues as an act of divine love, not only in our expanding universe but in each of us. Trying to understand the vastness of the universe, I am convinced that the "whole universe is as a grain from a balance, or a drop of morning dew." In comparison I feel miniscule, almost insignificant. Yet I know I am loved by God even in my failings and sin. "For you love all things that are and loathe nothing that you have made. . .how could a thing remain unless you willed it..you spare all things, because they are yours .. for you imperishable spirit is in all things!" God's love is greater than I can imagine, God's grace is freely given, God wills me into being, God nurtures and forgives, and God's creation continues to grow and evolve, even in me. Yes, science is amazing, but God is even more amazing. I believe God continues to work in my life to bring about change and a desire within me to love and serve.

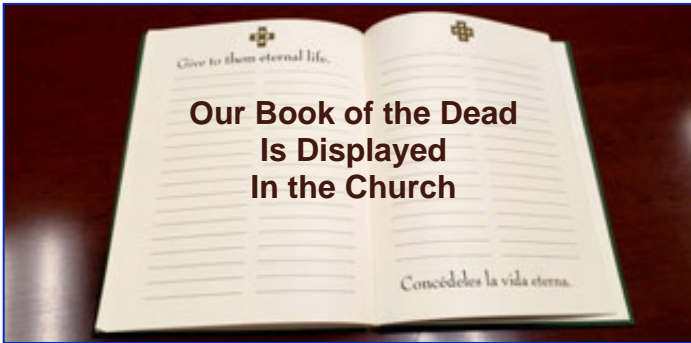

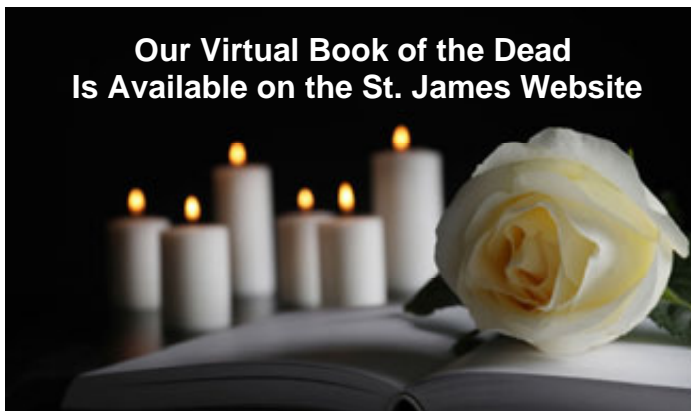

We Remember and Pray for our Beloved Dead**

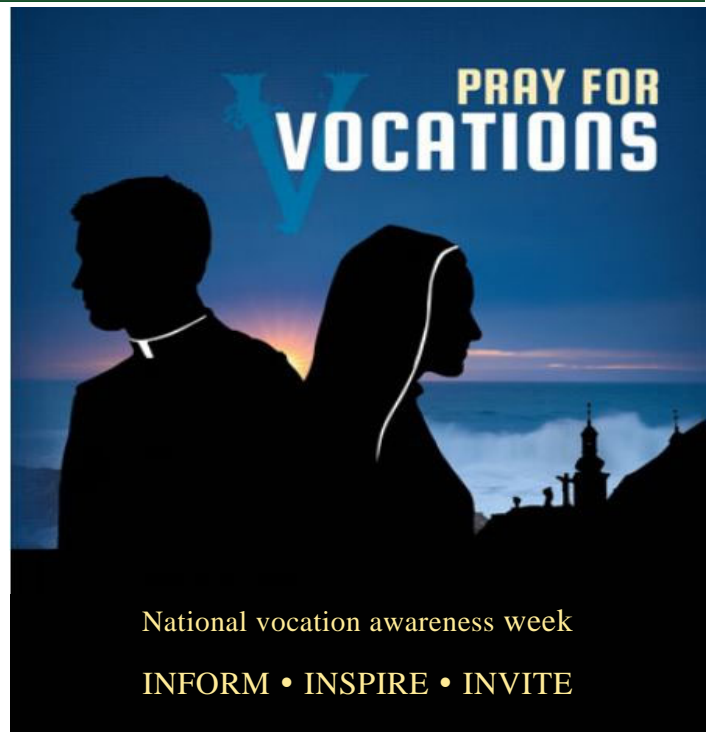

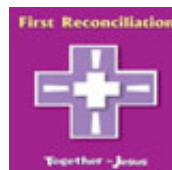
