Someone is Watching and Wondering



Today, I find myself anxious and confused by the hate and violence which seems to be ever present in our communities and throughout the world. I cannot fathom when being kind, understanding, and working together became passé and was replaced by

drawing lines which separate and divide, name-calling, the inability to find common ground through compromise, and using violence to perpetuate lies, hatred, and confirm over inflated egos and the desire to have one's way regardless of the impact on anyone who disagrees. As I search my own heart and life for my lack of kindness and understanding, my mind takes me to the beautiful words of the *Peace Prayer* associated with St. Francis of Assisi. I am struck by the words "O Divine Master, grant." For me, placing those words at the beginning of this prayer, instead of the second stanza, immediately changes the dynamics of the prayer; the emphasis is on God, God's will, and God's graces granted to each of us to do his will. This prayer is anything but egocentric, about getting my own way, or forcing my ideas, concepts, and beliefs on another individual. This prayer is about letting go, surrendering to God, and learning to be kind, merciful, and loving. The words are a plea to God to work through me for dispelling hatred, injury, doubt, despair, darkness, and sadness. The words, "Lord make me an instrument of your peace," to offer consolation, understanding, love and pardon are a challenge and a plea to be lead by God.

I am also captivated by the words in the First Letter of Peter: "For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, so that you should follow in his steps" (2:21). To follow in the footsteps of Christ, I must empty myself, embarking on a journey away from self-interest, and willing follow a journey of words and deeds that chip away at my ego and pride. As a professor once wisely told me: "You must learn humility!" Now I realize that is where I can find my true self as a child of God. The *Peace Prayer* seems to point me toward a Christ-centered life and most assuredly away from an egocentric life. This is where I will find true peace and where I am being lead, once again, as I prepare for Advent.

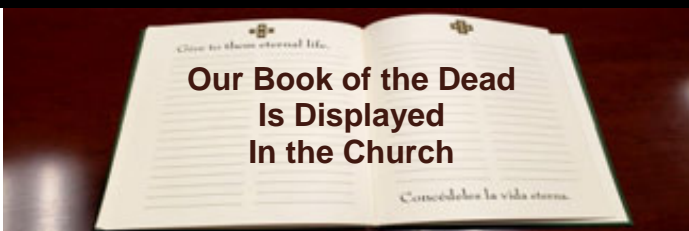

This week we are highlighting three more organizations AGT supports:

Liberty Women's Clinic (LWC). For almost 20 years, LWC has been serving the needs of young women and families in our community by providing free pregnancy resources in a safe, accepting environment. LWC's objective is to help women make informed, life-affirming choices. LWC does not refer nor provide abortions. Last year, through AGT, your donations helped 10 mothers buy big-ticket baby items (e.g. car seats, strollers, Pack'n Plays). This year, donations will continue to support LWC in its efforts to help needy mothers during their pregnancies.

Journey to New Life (JNL) has a mission to maximize quality of life for men and women returning to the community from prison. JNL helps these individuals reintegrate into the community, providing a welcoming place that offers respect while assisting with basic necessities, housing, and job assistance. Each year JNL serves approximately 2,000 people, including those with substance abuse and mental health conditions. Your AGT donations help provide funding for these valuable services.

Kansas City Indian Center (KCIC) operates as the metro area's only social service agency for American Indians. KCIC's mission is to encourage social, educational, and economic advancement of the American Indian community by promoting traditional and cultural values. 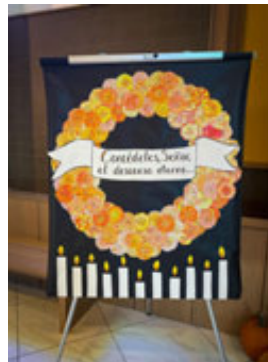
