From the Pastor's Pen

Even though the civil year ends on December 31, the Church calendar ends this Sunday, November 20, on the Feast of Christ the King. Next Sunday, November 27, ushers in the season of Advent and the beginning of a new Church year.

During our lifetimes, we all experience conclusions or "ends": the end of high school or college years; the end of a holiday season; the end of a job (retirement); the end of house payments; the end of a vacation; the end of a sickness (recovery). But the most significant end is death to our human life, our life in this world. In the month of November our Church family urges us to remember the "last things": sickness and death, accountability, judgment, hell (eternal punishment), purgatory (purification) and heaven (eternal glory, joy and peace in the presence of God.

We don't know God's timetable for us. For some, earthly life can be very short. Recently I received news of the tragic death of a 22-year-old young man, Cody, who was a member of my former parish in Iowa. He died instantly as a result of injuries from a car crash. We cannot image the immense grief his death has caused to the family and community. Sometimes God gives a person a hundred years of life, even though the person may wish for death.

We never know why the span of a lifetime is long or short. What we do know is that all of us will one day be called by God through death. The obvious message for all of us who follow the way of Christ is to be prepared, to strive to live each day with the values of our faith. This doesn't mean that we live each day constantly in fear and trembling, filled with worry and anxiety. God knows the weakness of our human nature. God is always merciful, always give us opportunities to seek reconciliation and new beginnings.

On this Feast of Christ the King, we reaffirm our decision to be a part of His Kingdom, asking for the gift of perseverance in faith, living the great law of love.

My prayers are with you each day.

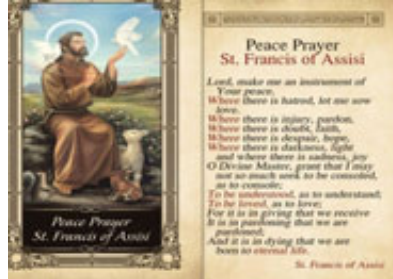
If you are interested in providing first aid to parishioners who are having medical issues before, during, or shortly after Mass on the weekends, this may be a ministry for you.

Someone is Watching and Wondering

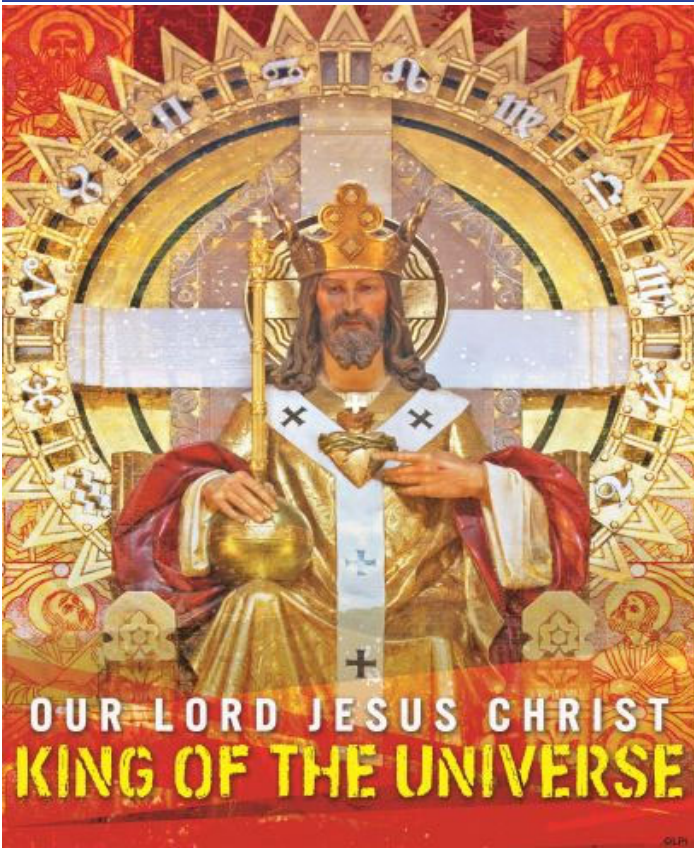


Last week I wrote a reflection on the "Peace Prayer" presenting the idea that this prayer is about surrendering to God; letting go of our ego-centric way of life and following in the foot-

steps of Jesus. This weekend, at the 10:30 Mass, we will celebrate the Rite of Acceptance/Entrance of individuals journeying toward reception of the Sacraments of Initiation. Their journey is one of surrender and love.

When I first meet anyone desiring to give their life more fully to God, I tell them that the journey is all about "falling in love, surrendering to God." Perhaps you wish to remind me: "Sandy, isn't the RCIA/OCIA about education, teaching the catechisms, dogma and doctrine of the Church, learning the sacraments, the Mass, Catholic tradition and prayer?" To this I answer, "All this is possible as one practices the faith, but the first step is falling in love and surrendering our life to God. Conversion is centered in formation, not education." Formation is about embracing God, following in the footsteps of Jesus, leaving self behind, not simply following rules. Formation is Christ-centered, not ego-centered; understanding and accepting that in giving we receive. Formation is recognizing the call God, following Christ with the help and strength that comes through the Holy Spirit. To believe education is the path of formation is a mistake; education simply is not enough. Education presents ideas and concepts, encourages process and developing our mind, but education does not provide an avenue for falling in love, surrendering to another, giving oneself completely without an expectation for payback or self gratification. The path taken by those desiring relationship begins with letting go. Initiation is such a path; discovering the love of our creator, the surrender of Jesus, and the pure gift of the Holy Spirit. God first emptied himself through creation, secondly through the incarnation, thirdly in the passion of Jesus, and finally in the outpouring of the Spirit. The question is, are we ready to empty ourselves to God's love and mercy. Celebration of the Rite of Acceptance/Entrance asks that question of each individual on the journey towards initiation into our Church, but the Rite also asks that question of everyone who professes to believe in the gospel message of Jesus, to everyone seated in Mass, to everyone called to be a witness to the world. Are you ready to surrender?

This Sunday, the last Sunday of the liturgical year, we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. This solemnity, also sometimes referred to as the Feast of Christ the King, was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925. Though it was originally celebrated in October, this feast was moved to the last Sunday of the liturgical year in 1969.

It is more than a coincidence that we close out the year with this particular feast. On this day especially, we celebrate the supreme kingship of Jesus over the entire universe. His is a kingship not like the secular monarchies of the past and present, but one that is pastoral, absolute, and desirous of bring us to himself.

Jesus is not just a King of Hearts. He is more than a Universal Coach, Teacher, or Consoler of mankind. By "King of the Universe" the Church is communicating Jesus' metaphysical scale, that God encompasses all of reality, not just man's reality. We say in the Nicene Creed that God created all things visible and invisible. So Jesus is King over all the planets, stars, black holes, quasars, and exploding suns in the blackest corners of remote space. He is King over the earth and all its waterfalls, rainforests, mountain peaks, desert plains, and dark sea floors.

We await the coming of Christ in his eternal Kingdom, but we recognize that he is already King.

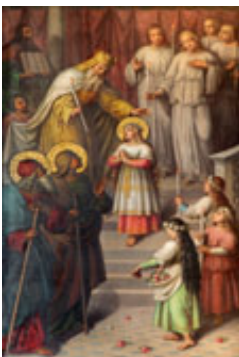

Memorial of The Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary November 21

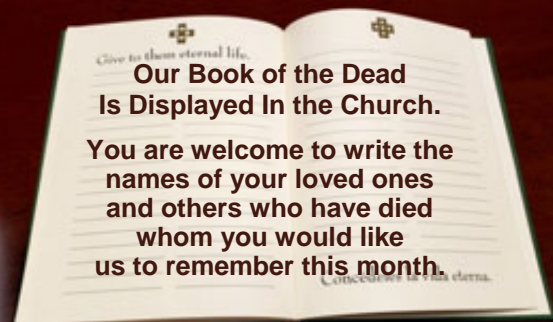


The feast of the presentation of Mary dates back to the 6th century in the East and the 15th century in the West.
