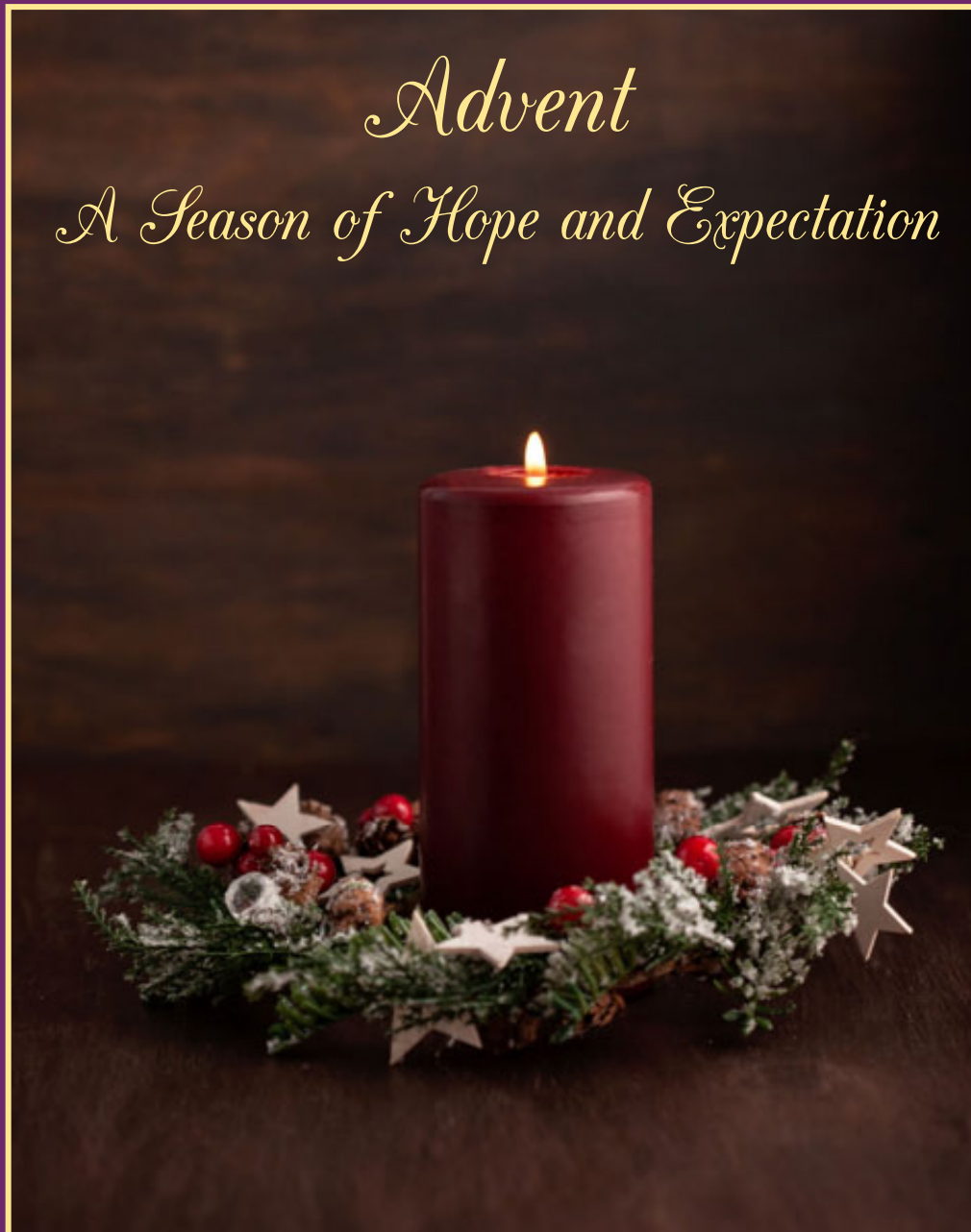

Someone is Watching and Wondering



As we enter a new Liturgical year and the season of Advent, we begin with **HOPE, hope in the Lord**. Continuing my reflection on the *Peace Prayer* I quote: "where there is despair, hope." I have known

despair but continue to hope. The first time I heard the words spoken to my husband 26 years ago: "Your cancer has progressed too far. All we can do at this point is try to minimize your pain." I felt as though my world was crumbling and there was nothing I could do but wait for the end of his life. These words still echo in my mind. While the doctors basically spoke of "no hope," it seemed as though Bob actually grew stronger mentally and spiritually as his physical body grew weaker. He continued to work at St. James school, enjoyed family time with our three children and our grandson Michael, attended Mass, and joined in social activities with friends. I remember the last social event was Amy and Mike Saye's wedding. Bob was so sick, and cold all the time, so at the wedding Mass he sat bundled in a blanket. He attended the reception too, even though he couldn't dance, which he had always enjoyed. The last week of his life he continued to make people laugh, and to instruct our children in ways they were to care for me, their mother. I think Bob's faith and positive outlook was what helped me grow in faith. As family and friends gathered with Bob and I, we still laughed, sometimes prayed, and recalled beautiful memories of times shared. While I was filled with despair and hopelessness, Bob encouraged me to keep moving forward. During our last year together, and especially those last few weeks, I feel that Bob was the face of Christ, offering forgiveness, love, faith, and hope.

As I reflect on this first Sunday of Advent, with the theme of **Hope**, I remember so many times, since Bob's death, when another person has helped me find hope in the love, mercy, and goodness of our heavenly Father and the sacrifice of Jesus: "who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be grasped. Rather he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness and found human in appearance, he humbled himself becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross." May we share our **Hope in God**, throughout this season of Advent and moving into the New Year.

St. Andrew Feast Day November 30



St. Andrew was born in Bethsaida, in Galilee

He was Saint Peter's brother and was called with him. "As [Jesus] was walking by the sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon who is now called Peter, and his brother Andrew, casting a net into the sea; they were fishermen. He said to

them, 'Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men.' At once they left their nets and followed him." (*Matthew 4:18-20*)

John the Evangelist presents Andrew as a disciple of John the Baptist. When Jesus walked by one day, John said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." Andrew and another disciple followed Jesus. "Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, 'What are you looking for?' They said to him, 'Rabbi (which translated means Teacher), where are you staying?' He said to them, 'Come, and you will see.' So they went and saw where he was staying, and they stayed with him that day" (John 1:38-39a).

Little else is said about Andrew in the Gospels. Before the multiplication of the loaves, it was Andrew who spoke up about the boy who had the barley loaves and fishes. When the Gentiles went to see Jesus, they came to Philip, but Philip then had recourse to Andrew.

Legend has it that Andrew preached the Good News in what is now modern Greece and Turkey and was crucified at Patras on an X-shaped cross.

A Reflection

Today we begin the season of Advent, a time of preparation and remembrance and with this we begin the new liturgical year. The word "Advent" stems from the Latin word adventus, which literally means "coming" or "arrival." In context, this commonly refers to the coming of Jesus on Christmas day.

Advent is a time of joyful waiting. We wait hoping and expecting that He will come into our hearts and homes on Christmas day with all the peace and joy that only a loving God and Savior could bring. It is a time when we remember that Jesus came to earth over 2000 years ago to begin the Christian era with the divine gift of salvation which He holds out to all who are willing to commit themselves to His way of living.

Advent is a time of new beginnings. We have an opportunity to grow, or develop, a spirituality of waiting – a time of hope – as we pray constantly for ourselves, our world and our Church in the ancient prayer of Advent – "Maranatha, Come Lord Jesus, Come!"

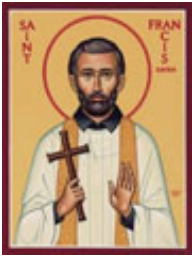

Saint Francis Xavier Feast Day December 3



St. Francis Xavier was born in the Kingdom of Navarre on April 7, 1506.

When he became of age, he studied at the University of Paris where he was heavily influenced by Ignatius of Loyola, who encouraged him to become a priest. He was ordained on June 24, 1537.

Xavier went to Lisbon and then to the East Indies. For the next 10 years he labored to bring the faith to peoples such as the Hindus, the Malayans, and the Japanese.

Wherever he went, Xavier lived with the poorest people, sharing their food and rough accommodations. He spent countless hours ministering to the sick and the poor, particularly to lepers. Very often he had no time to sleep or even to say his breviary but, as is known from his letters, he was filled always with joy.

Xavier went through the islands of Malaysia, then up to Japan. From Japan he had dreams of going to China, but this plan was never realized.

He died in 1552. His remains are enshrined in the Church of Good Jesus in Goa, India.

He was canonized: March 12, 1622.
