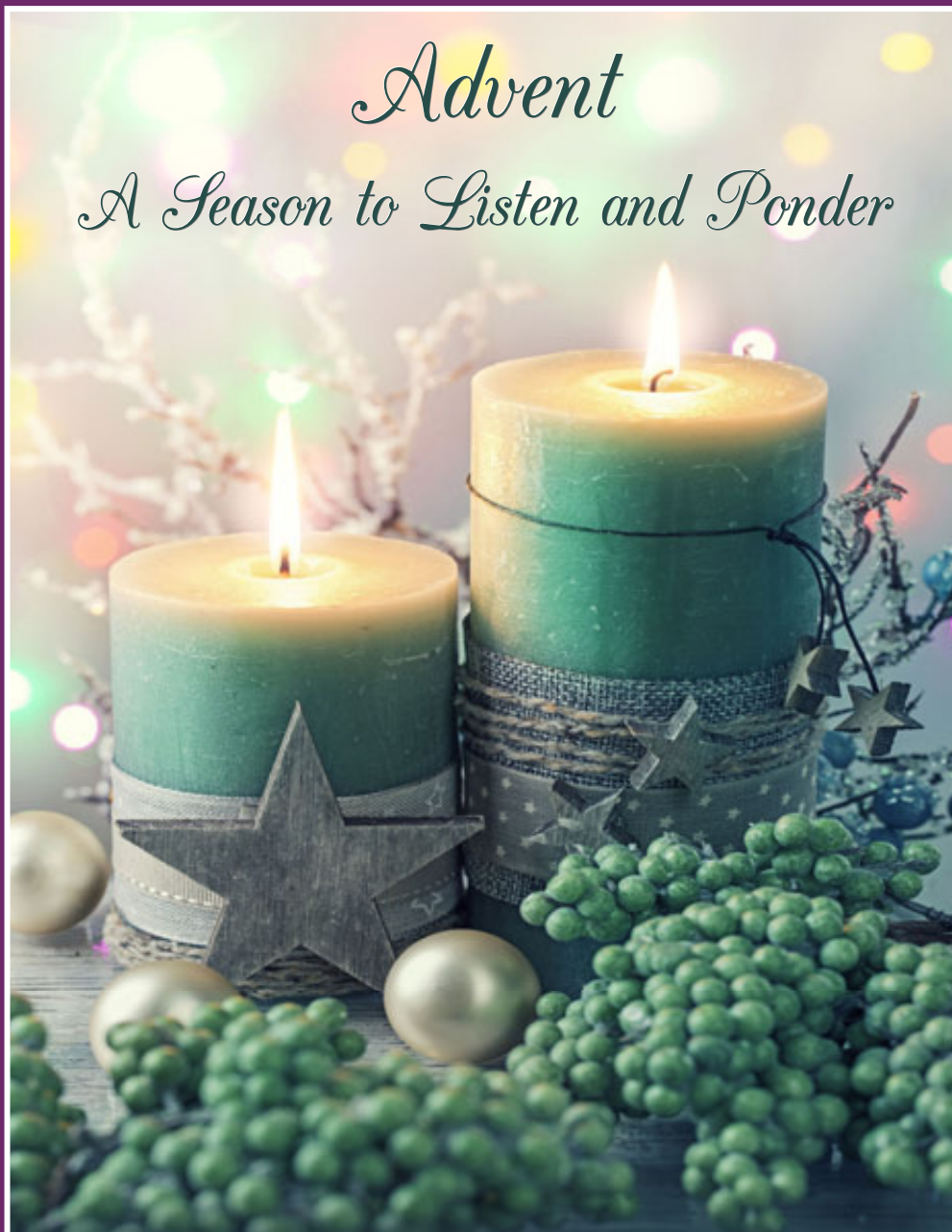

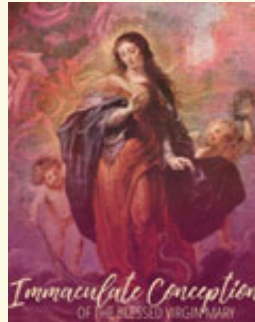

From the Pastor's Pen

In the gospel reading this weekend, the Advent call comes through loud and clear: "Make ready the way of the Lord." In the early days of the Church, Christianity was sometimes called "The Way." In this sense, the way of Jesus is like a path with a destination: the fullness of the Kingdom of God. "The way" begins in the waters of baptism but it doesn't end there. "The way" is a life-long journey. John the Baptist proclaimed to his listeners "prepare the way." John gives us the same message. Advent is a time of preparation. What are we preparing for? Obviously, the celebration of the birth of Jesus. But even more, preparation for the end of our journey, being in the presence of God.

John was kind of a weird teacher, especially in his appearance, dressed in camel's hair, and his food, locusts. Yet his words are profound. The way to prepare the way of the Lord is "metanoia," a Greek word for repentance or change of heart. The challenge includes recognition of unloving ways, true sorrow, a heartfelt change in lifestyle, embracing the values of a disciple, a sincere and genuine embrace of the "way of the Lord." Given human weakness, metanoia is a life-long task. Advent is the time to begin or re-affirm the task.

For the average Christian disciple, these days before Christmas are probably filled with more worldly concerns: travel plans, decorations, shopping, entertainments. These are not bad activities, but for the disciple of Jesus time for spiritual renewal should also have a place in "making ready the way of the Lord." How might I deepen my faith? Where do I waste time? Is my life of prayer where I want it to be? What work needs to be done in my relationship with my spouse, my children, my friends, my neighbors, my fellow parishioners? Do I need to mend a torn relationship?

The Advent Candle is a wonderful symbol of the passage of time and the days of our life. Each week when another candle is lighted it reminds us of passing "to make ready the way of the Lord." Let's use these days well so that greater peace of heart accompanies our celebration.

My prayers are with you each day.

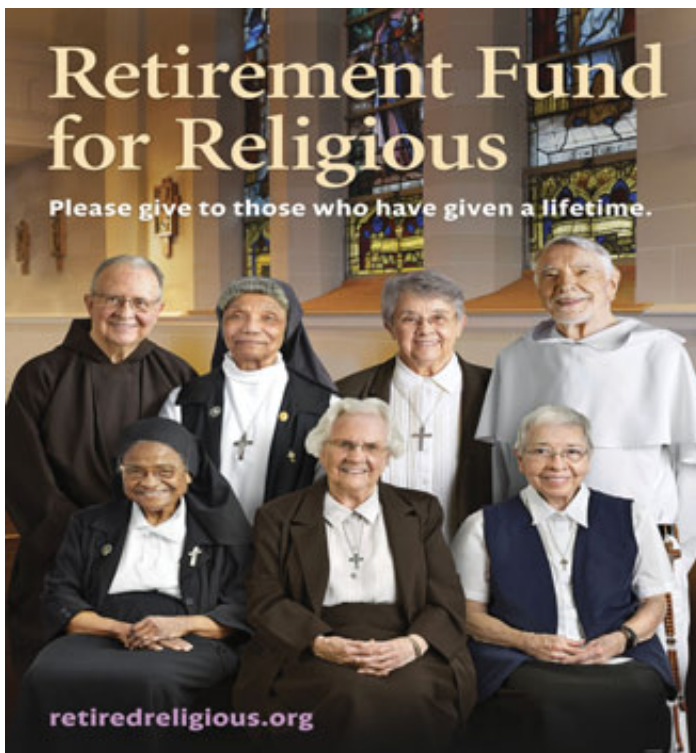

Someone is Watching and Wondering



"Lord make me an instrument of your peace."

What a perfect petition for today, the Second Sunday of Advent, with its theme of **Peace**. Although I pray for peace in our world, an end to all bigotry, hatred and violence, I am convinced

that I cannot work for peace if I do not feel peace within. For me the beginning of feeling peaceful and working for peace is letting go of past hurts, misunderstandings, and psychological pain. I find myself constantly seeking God's forgiveness, and I try to forgive others, yet I know there are things I hold on to, stew over, and dwell on in a negative way. I don't believe forgiveness results in forgetting, but remembering can either lead to resentment or can present an opportunity for personal growth and inner peace. Consider a family with two children, born within 18 months of one another. Sarah was the first born and always thought it her responsibility to care for brother James. James, however, thought his sister was bossy, and never allowed him to make decisions. Over time, the siblings argued over even the smallest thing, with their disagreements becoming more heated into adulthood. Eventually they could not tolerate the others presence. With a family of his own, however, James soon wearied of the dispute and attempted reconciliation. Conversely, Sarah resisted his overtures. In his heart James forgave his sister, and remembered the schism with sadness. Sarah's memories, however drove her need for vengeance and continued to fester. Over time, James found peace in his heart in spite of the sadness and loss of the relationship with his sister. He was able to form new relationships based in love and forgiveness. His sister's relationships however, seemed superficial and fleeting. Sarah continued to lack the inner peace found when love overcomes pain, letting go leads to forgiveness and reconciliation, humility replaces egocentric pride, and embracing God's grace and mercy releases the binding of one's heart which demands and fosters a get-even mentality.

When my heart is hardened by past pain, I feel sadness and am filled with anxiety. When I let go of past hurts, humbly offer forgiveness, and place myself into God's loving embrace, however, I feel the peace of Advent, an inner peace which leads me to work for peace with a sincere heart. May your heart, like James' find true **Peace**.

Dec. 4: From 6:00 - 7:30pm in the Parish Hall (lower level of church building). Dismissal: top level of the church.

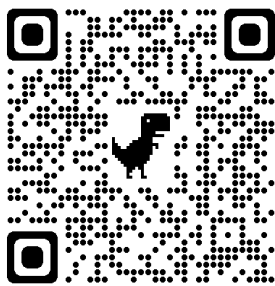
