As we journey through the Advent season, this weekend we celebrate "Gaudete Sunday" – the 3rd Sunday of Advent – REJOICE, the Lord is coming soon!

This Sunday we have the tradition of the "Glory Be Tea". Many thanks for the women who work so very hard with some great volunteers of men and women in providing a beautiful afternoon of delightful food, socializing and celebrating the Advent season.

This coming Monday, Dec. 12, is the great celebration of Our Lady of Guadalupe. We invite you to come and experience the story of the Virgin Mary's appearance to Juan Diego, the beautiful re-enactment of that powerful story, celebrate Mass with our Hispanic community and enjoy a great feast afterwards. It all begins at 5:30pm with recitation of the Rosary.

Tuesday, Dec.13 at 7:00pm is our annual Advent Penance service. We invite you to come and join us for the sacrament of Reconciliation. We will have several priests with us. It's a great opportunity to experience the sacrament, as well as celebrate the forgiving Love of God, as we prepare for Christmas.

NEW PLEDGE CARDS: Our current Building Fund pledge is running out Dec. 31, 2022. A special thanks to all who have been so very generous in paying down our mortgage. We dedicated this sacred space in October 2019; the total cost of the project was a little over \$12 million. To date, we owe approximately \$1.5 million. What a tremendous accomplishment! Due to the generosity of our community that debt will be paid soon.

We have pledge cards in the Gathering Space. If you would be willing to fill out a pledge card once again for three years that would give us the 'seed' money to move forward on the plans to totally renovate the former sanctuary and update our Social Hall area to make it an exciting Event Space. That process is slowly beginning at this time. We have a crew of volunteers who are beginning to clear the former sanctuary of the very well worn pews and other fixtures and clear the space so that it can hopefully be further renovated in the future and become a valuable space for us in the future.

We hope to kickoff another campaign in the future; no date set yet for that. But just an invitation to continue the 'good work that begun among us', by renewing your pledge.

The other pledge card is for annual appeal fund, our 'weekly giving' that funds the normal, ordinary/everyday expenses of our Parish community.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Below is yet another line from the *Peace Prayer* which seems appropriate for this Third Sunday of Advent: "and where there is sadness, **Joy.**" In sacred scripture there are many examples of sad-

ness as well as moments of joy; the awe and praise of the shepherds at the birth of Jesus followed by the holy family's flight to Egypt; the descent of the holy spirit at Jesus' baptism shadowed by the devil's temptations in the desert; Jesus' teachings of love and forgiveness in the midst of hatred from the religious leaders; Jesus painful crucifixion overcome by his resurrection. To me, sacred scripture mirrors human life.

In life I have also witnessed many contradictions: birth and death, success and failure, love and hate, disappointment and happiness. Reflecting on these contradictions, I feel that sadness is a knee-jerk reaction to unpleasantness and disappointment when my desires go unmet. Sadness can arise from indifference or can lead to despair; may be brief or enduring, yet in my sadness I have learned that I am not alone; God is with me, guiding me through my suffering, if I simply let go of the pain and seek God's will.

In John's gospel we read that Jesus wept at the grave of Lazarus. The crowd's reaction to his sorrow was, "see how much he loved him!" (11:35-36) Rather than Jesus succumbing to prolonged, self-centered sadness and depression, he prayed: "*Father, I thank you for having heard me. I know that you will always hear me*" (vv. 41-42). I think herein lies the secret for finding joy in sadness; looking beyond myself, focusing on God whom I have freely chosen to love, serve, and follow. Approaching God in prayer, with confidence and assurance that God will recognize me, feel my pain and sadness, and care for me. Like the wings of an eagle, God will lovingly lift me above the chaos of my life. "Even though I walk through darkest valley. . .you are with me; your rod and your staff. . .comfort me; you prepare a table before me. . .you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows; Surely goodness and mercy will follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell [with you] my whole life. Holding this knowledge in my heart and soul, brings me **Joy**, even as I experience great sadness. Let us all share God's **Joy** with one another as we journey together in love.

At this meeting, they shared with us their plan to add a new Evangelization Center attached to the current Cathedral. This center will create a new 300-400 seat event space that will replace the aging Donnelly Hall. It will also allow for added space for their Morning Glory Ministry that provides emergency assistance to the needy, and it will house all their administrative offices. It was the event space that really got our attention as the Cathedral hosts a number of events for the whole diocese throughout the year. However, they have never had a proper, accessible space to celebrate following these events.

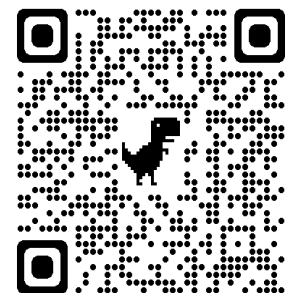
