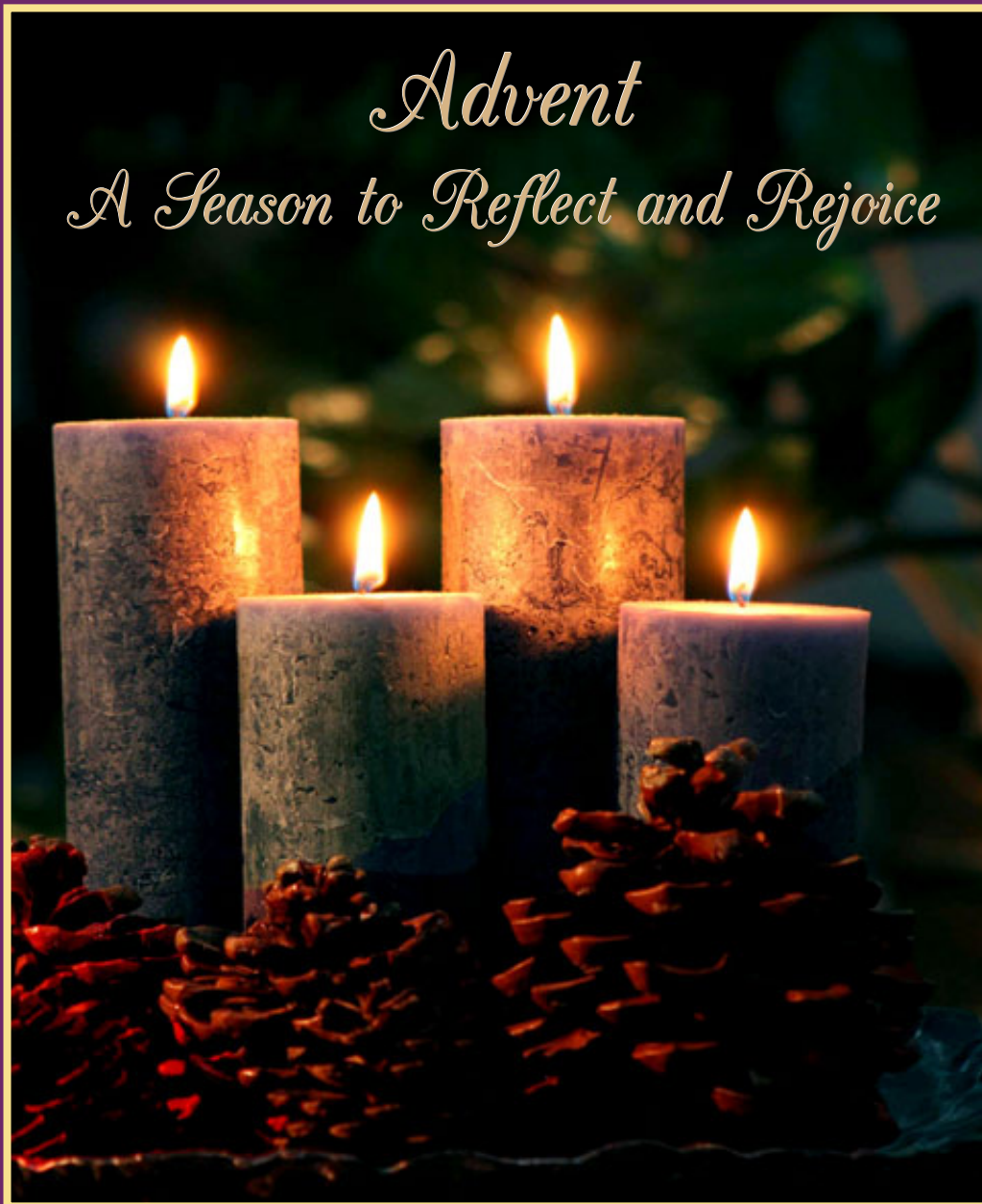

From the Pastor's Pen

When someone is critically ill and is close to death, that person almost always wants a loved one to be near. That loved one often holds the hands of the dying one and speaks words of comfort: "I am here. I will stay with you." If that dying one is conscious, it is a great consolation and comfort. "I'm not alone."

In the gospel today we hear the story of Joseph, the spouse of Mary, as God comes to him in a dream. "Do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife. She will bear a son who will be a savior. These words fulfill prophesy of Isaiah: "They shall name him "Emmanuel," a name which means "God is with us."

So it is our faith that Jesus, Emmanuel, is with us. There are times in the lives of all of us when we feel very much alone. Maybe we think: "Doesn't anyone care? Doesn't anyone understand what I am going through?" In such times we call upon the name and presence of Jesus, Emmanuel, God is with us. Jesus is never absent, never abandons us. He is at our side to give us comfort and courage.

As we come to these final days before celebrating the birth of Jesus, we hold that belief deep in our heart. Jesus was, at his birth, a baby in the distant land of Israel. But that is history. He is here now, present to each of us. What we need to remember is that Jesus uses each of us to make visible his presence to others. Just as a dying person is comforted when someone is there to hold his or her hand, so people who are struggling, who are alone, who are afraid, who are troubled, need someone to be present to him or her, to be the presence of Jesus. So the great Christmas gift we can give to others is the gift of presence, more than presents. People need to know that they are cared for, that they are loved, especially in times of need.

As you gather with loved ones at Christmas time, please don't forget the reason for your gathering: yes, to be with each other, but also to remember that Jesus is in your midst. He has come among you as Emmanuel.

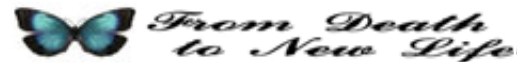

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Today we light the fourth candle on the Advent Wreath as symbolic of **LOVE**. Staying focused on the *Peace* Prayer I note that the second line of this prayer reads: "*Where there is hatred,*

let me sow love," and moving to the second stanza I pray: "to be loved as to love."

Part of our human nature is the need to be accepted and loved. Perhaps you experienced love from nurturing parents, a special teacher/mentor, a friend, a special person. I have been blessed to have many experiences of love during my life, yet I question, were these simply emotional attachments that made me feel good, or were they experiences of the love we see in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus or of the love Paul writes to the Corinthians? How do I love? Do I put the other first, or am I filling an emotional need, a longing to be part of another's life, or is love an escape from loneliness and my sense of being an outsider?

Jesus instructs us: "A new command I give; love one another as I have loved you. . .by this all will know that you are my disciples" (John 13:34-35). St. Paul writes: "Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. . .not rude. . .not self-seeking. . .does not delight in evil but rejoices in truth. . .it always protects. . .trusts. . .hopes. . .perseveres. . .love never fails. . .three remain, faith, hope and love, but the greatest of these is love" (1 Corinthians 13). Although I have heard and read these words many times, I still am saddened by my efforts to love my fellow humans in this manner. Is love the virtue that anoints, differentiates, and motivates me as a "little Christ?" How can I break free of my ego, forget "me" and focus on "thee?" If we can love as Jesus loved, hatred can be rooted out, prejudice will vanish, and reconciliation is possible. The **Hope**, **Peace**, and **Joy** we envisioned the previous three Sundays of Advent are all ultimately rooted in **Love**. In reality, everything we profess as Christians is rooted in **Love**, all our thoughts, words, and actions must be built and supported by this foundation. How can I claim to be a disciple of Jesus, a "little Christ" if I am self-serving rather than self-sacrificing. As Christmas nears may we nurture the roots of **Love**.

However, they have never had a proper, accessible space to celebrate following these events.
